

RCIA – QUESTIONS YOU – OR SOMEONE YOU KNOW – MIGHT BE ASKING...

Here are some thoughts to share with a friend or family member who is looking for a place to call their faith home:

1. Do you want to be baptized?
2. Are you a non-Catholic wishing to know more about the Catholic faith?
3. Are you a Catholic who has not received Eucharist and/or celebrated the Sacrament of Confirmation?
4. Do you know anyone who fits these descriptions?

If you answered yes to any of these questions...we invite you to seek full initiation in the Catholic Church or invite the person you know to consider joining the Catholic Church.

The RCIA is the process by which adults interested in full initiation into the Catholic Church have the opportunity to inquire into its teachings and to reflect on their readiness for entry into the Catholic faith community. This program is for anyone who has not been baptized, those who have been baptized in other faith traditions and for baptized Catholics who never completed the other sacraments of initiation (Eucharist and/or Confirmation).

The RCIA journey begins with Inquiry- an opportunity to delve into your experiences of God and aspects of our Catholic faith and traditions. After the Inquiry period, candidates join sponsors in deeper exploration of the Catholic faith through reflection on the Sunday readings. In addition, there are bi-weekly meetings and retreats throughout the year. The process culminates in the celebration of the Sacraments of Initiation (Baptism, Confirmation, & Eucharist) at the Easter Vigil, where the candidates are welcomed into full membership in the Catholic Church. We accept people into the RCIA process whenever they feel called.

If you've been away from the Church, you are invited to come home! What are you waiting for? God is calling you to be a part of His universal family. We are Catholic. Welcome home.

The RCIA team invites all our parishioners and guests to continue praying for our candidate – Hannah – and our seeker – Jessica – and our sponsors, teams of catechists, our neighbors who are being called back to the Church, and all those who are seeking to better understand their relationship with God.

From the desk of Father Ignatius . . .

Dear Family of Faith of SMV,

I moved into the rectory two weeks ago. As I write this article, I am still in the guest room, and my things are still in boxes. We are cleaning up the pastor's suite. After that, I can then move in and unpack.

It is indeed a great pleasure to be in your midst. I met many of you last week after Mass. You have been very hospitable and welcoming. Thanks to Fr. John and Fr. Joe, SMV is a very welcoming parish.

I learned a lot about Fr. John at his wake. What parishioners remembered most about Fr. John was his ability to remember someone's name. A parishioner told me that about forty years ago, when her family moved into the area, they visited different parishes looking for a parish to call a home. One Sunday they visited St. Mary. As they were leaving after Mass, Fr. John said to them, "You must be new to the parish. I haven't seen you before. What is your name?" They told him their names. The following Sunday they attended Mass at St. Mary. After Mass Fr. John greeted each of them by their first name. They told me from that day on, they never left St. Mary.

Fr. John had an amazing gift of remembering names. A parishioner said, "It was like he had a computer up there." How I wish I had that gift! As Fr. Joe said at Fr. John's funeral, those of us who do not have that gift of remembering names can take courage knowing that we have "St. John the Memorable" to pray for us. Fr. John will remain in our hearts and prayers forever.

Fr. Joe moved out last week. I can only imagine how difficult it must have been for him to move from St. Mary after twenty-one years of selfless service. I was at my former parish for eleven years and it was difficult for me to move. Twenty-one years is almost twice that number of years.

In the twenty-one years that he was here, Fr. Joe welcomed new members into the mystical body of Christ, and he nourished us with his sermons and the Eucharist. He saw our young men and women become adults in the Catholic faith at Confirmation; he encouraged young men in the seminary supporting them all the way to ordination. Fr. Joe prepared many couples for matrimony, witnessing as they professed their love to and for each other. He visited the sick, bringing them the healing of Jesus Christ. He buried the dead, commending them into the hands of the Lord while holding up the hope of the resurrection to their bereaved families. Fr. Joe has indeed been a pastor, a priest and a friend to many of you.

As he begins a new ministry in the Church of Chicago, our prayer for him today and always is that God grant him "in accord with the riches of [God's] glory to be strengthened with power through [God's] spirit in the inner self, and that Christ may dwell in [his] heart through faith; that rooted and grounded in love, he may have strength to comprehend with all the saints what is the breadth and length and height and depth, and to know the love of Christ that surpasses knowledge, so that [he] may be filled with all the fullness of God" (Ephesians 3:16-19).

I expressed my gratitude to Fr. Joe several times before he left. As he mentioned at his farewell Mass, our center and focus is the Eucharist: Jesus Christ truly present in our midst under the appearance of bread and wine.

I am excited to be here. I look forward to serving you and to our worshipping and serving God together.



MENTAL ILLNESS



MENTAL HEALTH MINISTRY

All are invited to the next Mental Health Monday meeting, on July 15 from 7:00 to 8:30 PM at St. Mary of the Annunciation Church. Our topic “God is bigger than our weaknesses” concerns overcoming the stigma that is often imposed on mental illness.

According to the National Institute of Health, in any given year, 1 in 4 people will have a diagnosable mental illness, such as depression, anxiety, bipolar disease, schizophrenia, post-traumatic stress. For one in every 24 people it will be severe and persistent. Mental illness affects the biological, psychological, social and spiritual dimensions of individuals. The illness also impacts the lives of the person’s family and friends.

Without knowledge and understanding, we withdraw and isolate those who are suffering mental illness and their families. As members of Christ’s Church, we are called to support individuals and their families when the illness first occurs and in their ongoing managing of their illness and their recovery. Spiritual supports and companionship are critical to the recovery process.

Our understanding and support can alleviate suffering and enable people to manage the challenges faced by sufferers and those who love them.

MISSION APPEAL NEXT WEEKEND

Next weekend we will welcome Fr. Joy Mathew, who will speak to us about the needs of the Diocese of Calicut in southern India. The mission appeal funds will be primarily utilized for the missionary activities of the Diocese. At present they are concentrating on uplifting the tribal people and recent converts, their faith formation and overall development. They form a community which is not part of the mainstream of the society, as they are educationally and economically marginalized. Since the area is thickly populated by tribal people and people of different faith and beliefs, the pastoral centre plays a key role in organizing different events for catechesis. By and large the centre also caters to the social needs of the common folk in order to reach out and proclaim the Gospel. The centre does not receive any kind of aid from the State Government nor from any NGOs.

Find “Warm” Prospects

If you post articles on LinkedIn Publisher, you can see those who have reacted, commented on or shared your article. These are people who have some idea of who you are and have had a positive interaction with the content you create. Some could be ideal prospects you have not yet connected with.

Everyone who has commented on your article can be found at the bottom of the article. There you can reply to each person as appropriate. You can also access the list of people who reacted to your post (like, celebrate, love, insightful, curious) at the bottom of the article. Simply click the reaction number beside the reaction icons.

You can easily see who you are not connected to (your 2nd and 3rd-degree connections). Click on each person you are interested in, to go to their profile, and see if they are someone you want to connect with. If you are already connected, and they are an ideal prospect, do a little research about them first, before sending them a message. Thank them for their like, comment or share and perhaps ask them a question related to the topic or recommend another article that they may be interested in. If you are not already connected, and you think they might be a beneficial connection, go to their profile and send them a personalized connection request, thanking them.

The purpose of our Wellspring Employment Resource Community (WERC) ministry is to provide a safe and effective forum for sharing work search tools and techniques which can enable unemployed, underemployed, and job-searching parishioners in their efforts to find meaningful and rewarding work.
