

## RCIA – Looking Into The Hebrew Scriptures

This coming Wednesday in the RCIA program, we will take a closer look at the Old Testament. Our seekers and their sponsors will learn about the origins, traditions, authors, and the process which brought the Hebrew Scriptures into being. We'll investigate how the various styles of writing included in the Old Testament reflect the growth and evolution of the Jewish people, their faith practices, and the covenant with God which led to the promise of a Messiah. Did you know?

- A majority of biblical scholars believe that the Book of Isaiah was written by multiple authors. The disputed authorship of Isaiah is one of the most popular textual biblical issues; the challenge of identifying the specific authors of various parts of the book is known as the "Isaiah problem."
- The Psalms of the Old Testament are so named from the Greek word "psalmoi," which is translated as "instrumental music." Because of this connection, the Psalms are believed to be words meant to accompany music.
- The Ten Commandments actually appear twice in Scripture: in Exodus and in Deuteronomy!

The RCIA team continues to invite all our parishioners and guests to continue praying for Jessica, Hannah, Peyton, and Bryan – our Catechumen, Candidate, and Inquirers; we also encourage prayers for our neighbors who are being called back to the Church, and all those who are seeking to better understand their relationship with God.

*From the Desk of Sister Mary Barbara Hassler, Directory of Ministry of Care and Bereavement . . .*

Dear Friends in Christ,

Wishing you peace and all good! It has been well over a month since we, as a nation, have been asked to shelter in place due to the corona virus, COVID-19. I am sure I can speak for all of us in saying that this is not how we thought our Lent and Easter were going to go! This is a journey none of us has ever taken before, at least not in my experience. Our gospel for this Third Sunday of Easter also speaks about a journey, the journey to Emmaus. We read about two disciples of Jesus who are walking along the road away from Jerusalem, discouraged by the horrible events of Jesus' death. Along the way, they encounter the Risen Lord Jesus but are unaware that it is him. Only after Jesus opens the Scriptures for them and breaks bread with them, do they recognize the Risen Lord in their midst.

During this time of sheltering in place, I cannot help but wonder and ask myself how I have met the Risen Christ and how have my eyes been opened during this crisis? One of the ways I have met the Risen Christ is through the Scripture readings. Being deprived of receiving the Eucharist, the Body and Blood of our Lord, has been difficult for me but I remember that Jesus is encountered in both Word and Sacrament. My eyes have been especially opened to God's Word in the Scriptures during this time of sheltering in place. This is what feeds me until I can once again be fed on the Eucharist. May the Word of God feed you as well on this journey of faith.

Another way I have met the Risen Christ is through all of you, the parishioners of St. Mary of Vernon. I have been privileged to call many of you to check in with you and hear how you are faring during these challenging times. Overall, your responses have been very positive and encouraging. Many of you expressed how much you miss attending Sunday Mass at St. Mary of Vernon and meeting your fellow parishioners. Some of you have expressed that you are being challenged by working from home and yet at the same time taking care of your children who are now being schooled from home. Many of you are grateful that you are still able to work and some have expressed their sadness at not being able to work during this time.

One of the things I have noticed since so many places have been closed to us is that many of us are making use of the time to enjoy nature. Easter is about experiencing New Life in Christ and spring is about experiencing new life in nature. The earth is coming alive as temperatures warm and sunlight kisses the earth. Trees and bushes are beginning to bud, the grass is greening and the spring flowers are blooming. It warms my heart to know that people are re-connecting with nature in a way they may never have before. As I walk the trails of the forest preserves and parks, I encounter families and individuals with smiles on their faces even as we are aware that we must continue to keep physically distant from one another. When I meet these people on the path, I see the Risen Christ in their faces, in their greetings and in their love for their families. It is my hope that one of the things we learn is the value of relationship and making connections even when we must keep physically distant from one another.

Many of us have been keeping up with the regular updates from the President and our Governor regarding COVID-19. I was struck by how often we are told to have trust in what our nation is doing to alleviate this crisis. No one is more grateful than I for all those who are working so diligently to end this crisis: our health care workers, our first responders and all the untold heroes who are on the forefront of all of this. Our prayers should be with them each and every day for the sacrifices they are making. I do trust that all of us are doing our part in confronting this crisis but let us also remember that our ultimate trust is in our Savior, Jesus Christ, who died for us and rose for us. As in the Emmaus story of this Sunday, I hope all of us have in some way experienced an encounter with the Risen Christ. He is in our midst even in and despite this crisis. As with the disciples in the Gospel, have we urged Jesus to stay with us during these challenging times? Have our hearts been burning within us with the Good News of Jesus Christ? The disciples recognized Jesus in the breaking of bread. Have we recognized Jesus in one another? In nature? In the Word of God?

Let us continue to pray for one another, the family of St. Mary of Vernon, for all those who have lost jobs and businesses, for those who have lost loved ones, for those who continue to make sacrifices to keep us safe. The Lord has truly been raised and he has appeared to all of us. Let us remain hope-filled and faith-filled as we continue this journey together in Christ. Until we meet again...

## IMPORTANT INFORMATION FROM LAKE COUNTY UNITED

LCU, of which SMV is a member, participates in a twice-weekly conference call with the Lake County Department of Health. Below is pertinent information from their April 16 call.

As of April 16, 1721 individuals in Lake County had tested positive for COVID19, with 65 deaths.

- The Lake County Health Department has portals and links to available financial support from the federal, state and local governments, [lakecountyil.gov/coronavirus](http://lakecountyil.gov/coronavirus)
- Tide Cleaners is offering discounts to all first responders and their immediate families on dry cleaning and laundry services.
- KN95 masks were distributed by the county to medical personnel but there is a default with the shipment and these masks are being recalled and/or pulled out of circulation. If any medical personnel has a KN95 mask distributed in the last week, it should not be used. - United Way is looking for volunteers to help with food shopping, delivery, preparation, etc. Community organizations need people to sew masks if you are interested. Call 211 or [211lakecounty.org](http://211lakecounty.org)
- If anyone in the community needs assistance finding food, shelter, rent or utility payments, or other essential services, CALL 211 or TEXT your zip code to 898211 to speak with someone who can help. 211 is available 24/7.
- Blood Donors are desperately needed! Vitalant (formerly LifeSource) has locations in Lake Bluff and Gurnee; please call 877-258-4825, or visit [vitalant.org](http://vitalant.org) to make an appointment. There are blood drives ongoing throughout the area; however, the appointments fill quickly and reaching out to Vitalant is the most efficient way to arrange to donate blood.

### SAINT CATHERINE OF SIENA (1347-1380)

April 29

Imagine the pope receiving a young woman still in her twenties who addresses him as “my sweet Christ on earth,” then orders: “Get back to Rome where you belong!” Amazingly, Gregory XI complied! Yet this was but one astonishing incident in the extraordinary life of Catherine of Siena, a truly unique medieval woman. Youngest of twenty-five children, Catherine refused marriage and became a Dominican Tertiary at sixteen, cloistering herself at home in contemplative prayer, austere penances, and mystical experiences, culminating in “spiritual espousal” to Christ. Then, incarnating the Dominican ideal of “passing on to others the fruits of contemplation,” Catherine left her solitude to care for the poor, nurse the sick, comfort the dying, and bury the dead. Increasingly renowned for converting souls and healing bodies, she was sought after to broker peace during civil wars and Church schisms. All this, and like Jesus, whom she called “my Divine Spouse,” she died at thirty-three! Four hundred letters and her spiritual classic *The Dialogue* inspired Paul VI to name her, together with Teresa of Ávila, the first women Doctors of the Church.

### GOD’S PLAN

Saint Peter speaks to us twice today. In the first reading, we hear an excerpt from his sermon on Pentecost; in the second, part of his first letter. Once a frightened, uneducated fisherman who often said just the wrong thing, now Peter is speaking what he knows to be true. Everything Jesus had said now makes sense. His death and rising were all part of God’s plan, and our faith and hope can be centered on God.

Today’s Gospel tells the story of Jesus’ walk to Emmaus with two of the disciples. Frightened, sad, and confused, the two of them don’t recognize Jesus, who tells them what we heard Peter say above: All this had to happen as part of God’s plan. In the end, these disciples recognize Jesus as we are to recognize him—in the breaking of the bread.


