From the desk of Marion Hornung, Director of Religious Education . . .

This week's Gospel reading is part of what is known as "The Last Supper Discourse." Jesus understands and knows this is his last opportunity to prepare the apostles for what is to come. Jesus knows their hearts and he understands they will be fearful and confused. He wants to reassure them of the promise that no matter what they endure on earth, they will be joyfully reunited with him in heaven.

"Do not let your hearts be troubled." I am profoundly struck by the sheer nature of the words of Jesus in light of what the world has experienced these past several weeks. The Covid 19 pandemic has dramatically changed the way we are living our lives. It is easy to understand that like the apostles, people can be fearful and confused.

We encounter Philip, one of the twelve apostles. He witnessed miracles, broke bread with, and was taught at the feet of Jesus. Even after everything he saw, Philip asked Jesus to "...show us the Father and that will be enough." At this very moment Philip showed a lack of faith. His question to Jesus demonstrates the problem of embracing faith.

Like Philip, we know who Jesus is and what he teaches, but do we have faith? Jesus wants us to have faith in Him. Therein lies the challenge for each of us. We can have an intellectual understanding and knowledge of Christ but faith is something much deeper as it is manifested in the heart.

The events of the past several weeks have caused fear and uncertainty in our lives. We can find ourselves being doubtful or unable to relinquish the illusion of complete control due to our own reasoning. We try to fit God into our paradigm rather than fitting ourselves into His.

But God wastes nothing! I have been connecting with all of the PREP families during this time, and I am moved by the impact the stay-at-home-order has had on their lives. Yes, parents are facing challenges. For example, they are working at home to provide for their families and are now e-learning with their children. However, parents have also shared they are so grateful for the family time, they had no idea how busy they were, sitting at the dinner table has become the new norm and many have discovered the joy of playing board games with their children. They are creating memories.

We are reminded that we can take people and events for granted. We are now "social distancing" and hugging our family and friends has its challenges to say the least. We now attend Mass online and are unable to receive the Eucharist. I miss celebrating Mass at the parish and I am looking forward to the day when I can walk through the doors of our church. Celebrations such as Easter, Mother's Day and birthdays look very different. I am looking forward to seeing and hugging my children, grandchildren and friends. I miss them all.

As Christians we live in hope and not in fear. I encourage you to be fearless during this time and to be faithful. We are called to have faith. I love the quote of St. Augustine of Hippo, "Faith is to believe what you do not see. The reward of faith is to see what you believe." Our faith is especially important during times such as these. It is our faith and relationship with Jesus Christ that will see us through.

SHARING HANDS IS HERE TO HELP

We hope our parish family knows about the great work of our **Sharing Hands Ministry**. Through the generosity of our parishioners, we have a fully stocked food pantry that is available to anyone in our parish community who is in need.

We know many local companies and businesses are closing for an undetermined period of time and many workers will be out of work without pay. We are here to help. If your family or a neighbor needs food due to this pandemic our pantry is available to you. Sharing Hands is open Tuesday evenings from 6:30 to 8:00pm and Saturday mornings from 9am to 11am. Distribution of food has been modified to put space between each guest and maintain best practices for social distancing. **If you would like to donate food to Sharing Hands, please come during their regular hours and volunteers will accept it from you.**

Financial Update

Thanks to the generosity of our parishioners the parish is doing well in light of the COVID 19 pandemic.

We did lose one weekend at the end of March when the lockdown started so the month of March was \$13,070 below budget.

Thankfully, people really responded to Father's Easter letter. The donations for the month of April have been right on target. Many people made their entire monthly donation in one check, several made extra donations to help out. Easter was slightly below budget but adding Sunday and Easter together got us to the budget number that we needed to pay all our April bills.

You may not be aware that the parish has continued to pay the salaries for all the employees since the beginning of the pandemic. The parish office remains closed and we have locked down the parish center and church to all but limited use to save on utility bills.

So that is why the best news is that last week we were approved for the Payroll Protection Program loan for \$132,500. This represents 2.5 times our monthly salary and will enable us to continue to pay our employees and utility bills for the next 8 weeks. These funds are part of the CARES Act and will be a forgivable loan at the end of 8 weeks if we follow the requirements.

These funds will enable us to stretch our savings so we will have enough money on hand to cover any shortfall in income over the summer and fall. So even while we wait to worship together, the parish is here waiting for your return. Remember there are several ways to support the parish from home: through regular mail using the envelopes we sent you, directly from your own bank, or electronic giving on live through www.givecentral.org or text-to-give by texting DONATE to 1-132-313-6152.

UPDATES FROM LAKE COUNTY UNITED

First, the Lake County CoVid19 webpage now has a listing of all food pantries in Lake County. Not all of them require registration or even identification.

In addition, a new program called "CATCH" - Community Action to Counter Hunger - is working with the Northern Illinois Food Bank to ensure food is delivered to those unable to get out of the house or unable to have groceries delivered. This is especially useful going forward as there are long wait times (days-week) to have food delivered or even ready for pick up at the grocery stores. Add to this the fact that we may experience more serious food shortages in the coming month, and this new resource becomes especially valuable. This program is just getting underway and we will have more information next week; in the meantime, those interested in this program should contact the 211 center for more details and registration.

The second item of note is that the county is now looking to develop a database of Hispanic- and African-Americans citizens in order to reach out to the communities directly. Our parish may have already heard from J. Ashworth regarding this project. For further information, our parish staff can contact jashworth@lakecountyil.gov. We will continue to keep all updated on this.

Finally, the county has its first testing facility. The testing facility is located at the State Vehicle Emissions Testing Site, on Western Avenue, in Waukegan. It will only have access to the molecular test (nasal swab) results will be available in 5-7 days, and there will only be 500 tests given per day. The best part is that people will not need a doctor's order for the test. If someone has the symptoms, they will be allowed to test. Also, high-risk groups such as medical professionals, first responders, and essential workers, are permitted to be tested without symptoms. The Illinois National Guard will be administering these tests. Tips for Reducing Anxiety During the COVID-19 Outbreak

From Arlington Heights parishes, and recommended by Deacon Tom Lambert, head of our Archdiocese's mental health commission, and by our own Deacon Jerry Nora.

Ground yourself in science. Science-based facts will ground you in a reality where truth, hope, and interventions exist. Resist sensational news or social media, where facts are often blurred or exaggerated. The [Centers for Disease Control and Prevention](#) (CDC) provides information and frequent updates.

Limit your consumption of the news. A near-constant stream of news reports can cause anyone to feel anxious or distressed. Instead, seek CDC updates and practical guidelines at specific times during the day.

Isolate but stay connected to others. Protect yourself and others with social distance and homebound activities. But make sure to keep your attachments to friends, family, and loved ones by calling, texting, using FaceTime or Skype.

Get your emotional support system in place. Maintain familiar routines in daily life as much as possible; Routines and schedules reduce stress and anxiety in our lives. Keep your list of support people or tools at your fingertips so you can draw on them easily if needed.

Think locally, not globally. Focus on what is happening in your local community and what you can do to keep yourself and neighbors healthy and safe. A sense of community is vital for moving through traumatic situations and builds resiliency in children and adults.

Practice self-care and make sure others do too. Be mindful about eating well, keeping a healthy sleep cycle, exercising, and other soothing self-care behaviors. Make sure to avoid using alcohol or drugs to cope with stress. And limit caffeine as it heightens anxiety and irritability.

Fight helplessness by finding purpose. The uncertainty that COVID-19 brings can leave many of us feeling unspeakably helpless. Finding purpose can alleviate restlessness and anxiety. Choose things you can control, be it shifting negative thoughts into positive ones, deciding what to cook for lunch, reading a good book, picking what movie you and the kids will watch, or other activities you have power over.

Let your faith be a beacon of hope. In addition to prayer and watching online daily Mass, scripture "mantras" can be helpful to ease moments of anxiety.

Since in-person contact is limited and remote work is the predominant new norm, make every effort to use videoconferencing to maintain and nurture your relationships—personal and professional. Need a coffee break? Make it virtual. Launch a video meeting and have a conversation with a fellow teammate, catch up with a colleague you haven't spoken to in a while, or introduce yourself to someone new. Virtual face-to-face interaction during times of isolation can boost your mood, promote camaraderie, and make a lasting impression on recruiters if done effectively.
