

We had a wonderful Holy Week and Easter celebration. I have many parishioners to thank for such spiritually fulfilling Triduum services. Thank you to our Altar Servers, Deacons, Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist, Choir, Camera-men, who helped us to livestream our services; those who prepared RCIA candidates Rebecca Joubert and Peyton Habenicht for the sacraments of initiation. I thank our volunteers, greeters, ushers and cleaners. I am very grateful to our Liturgy Committee, especially Teri Feurer and Mary Gail Kwiecinski. These two women worked tirelessly for many hours to ensure we had such grace-filled services. Finally, I want to thank you, the parishioners of St. Mary of Vernon, for worshipping with us. Allow me to share with you three short points I learned from 2021 Triduum services. Holy Thursday I learned that in the Eucharist Jesus re-presents his sacrifice on Calvary through the ministry of the priest. Jesus then asks us to stay with him—“Do this in memory of me.” Good Friday teaches me that the Crucifix reminds me of God the Father and God the Son’s infinite love for me. To paraphrase the words in the *Easter Proclamation* from The Sacramentary, “Oh Father, how wonderful your care for us! How boundless your merciful love! How gracious you have been to us! To ransom a slave you gave away your Son.” Easter undoubtedly tells me that light will always overcome darkness. Death will always give way to Life. In the suffering, death and resurrection of Jesus Christ, Jesus destroyed all that would keep us from living the fullness of life. The last enemy of life to be destroyed was death.

Happy Easter to each of you and your loved ones. May the Risen Christ, the source of our eternal hope, fill each of us with his perpetual life. Amen!

DO YOU MISS THE 9:30AM SUNDAY MASS??

We have heard from several people that they miss the 9:30am Mass; and now that many people have been or soon will be vaccinated we can think about adjusting our Mass schedule. VOLUNTEER WEDDING COORDINATORS NEEDED

Do you enjoy weddings as much as we do?

We are delighted to be celebrating 19 weddings at St. Mary of Vernon in 2021! If you would enjoy the opportunity to get dressed up and help guide our brides and grooms down the aisle, all the while performing an important ministry for our parish, this role is for you!

Teams of two volunteers are needed to attend weddings and their corresponding rehearsals. Weddings are typically on Saturday afternoons (sometimes Friday evenings or other days), with the rehearsal the evening prior to the wedding. Coordinators are asked to be available for both days in order to form a relationship with the couple. This role is still in development, and may include the following:

- A) At the rehearsal (about 60 minutes volunteer time): greeting, check-in, hand sanitizing, seating/ushering, giving instructions to the ushers/groomsmen in proper COVID procedures for seating and communion, disinfecting the pews
- B) At the wedding (about 2 hours volunteer time): assisting the priest or deacon with setup, greeting, COVID screening, check-in, hand sanitizing, assisting the bridesmaids with the procession, ushering guests out of the church in keeping with social distancing guidelines, disinfecting the pews
- C) Possible follow-up with the couple, TBD

We hope to get a team of about 10-12 volunteers to serve in this ministry. Training will be provided. Please contact Maureen Evers at 847-362-1005 or mevers@maryofvernon.org to learn more. *(This Ministry will continue even after COVID has passed.)*



PADS UPDATE

After 20+ years of feeding and housing 50-60 homeless people on Thursday nights, St. Mary of Vernon was forced to shut down our site for the 2020-2021 season. Many of our 175 volunteers have asked how the homeless were being cared for and have expressed concern about the future of our ministry. So here is the scoop.

Currently PADS, Lake County is providing motel accommodations for about 235 people around the county (about 130 rooms). This undertaking has been funded by federal, state and private grants. The regular sites, SMV included, have stepped up and are providing hot meals once per day to the motels where the homeless are staying. We cook every Saturday for the 30+ people in the Super 8 in Mundelein. So, the good news is that, in our efforts to remain safe during the pandemic, we have not abandoned our needy brothers, sisters and families.

The following is speculation—an educated guess based on discussions with PADS headquarters. On the horizon, it is likely that the grants will dry up as the pandemic winds down. In the Fall, the likelihood is that the individual sites will reopen, and the homeless will be cared for in some hybrid mixture of church sites and continued motel use. The goal would be to house the families with children in motels and send the adults to the rotating shelters, including SMV, only in considerably smaller numbers. The guests will likely be required to be vaccinated in order to have access to the shelters. Of course, none of this is certain as we wait anxiously for herd immunity.

We will not be querying our volunteers until late August as to availability to serve beginning in October. Our best guess is that most would want to see the pandemic numbers prior to committing. Rest assured that if you have been a PADS volunteer prior to the pandemic, we will email you when the time comes to re-invite your participation.

VOLUNTEER FOR SAINT MARY OF VERNON'S ADOPT A GARDEN PROGRAM



Several weeks ago, Deacon Jim Wogan wrote an article stating his appreciation of the beautiful grounds we have here at St Mary of Vernon. He also gave his thanks to all the people who have helped make these grounds the beautiful gardens we see. St Mary of Vernon has been blessed with 17 acres of woodlands, wetlands, prairies, and gardens. This beautiful environment is a welcoming and peaceful way to begin our worship experience but it takes some effort to maintain and more help is needed.

Recently we have become part of the *Laudato Si* garden project. The goal of the project is to increase green space for spiritual contemplation and give people access to it, while benefiting our environment as well. Interestingly, St. Mary of Vernon has been doing this for almost 20 years, which puts us ahead of what other parishes and organizations are just now trying to accomplish. We've been able to achieve this because of the financial support of the parish and from parishioner help with the landscaping maintenance. However, many hands make light work, and we need many *more* hands to help with the flower and native plant gardens on the grounds.

We have a program called *Adopt A Garden* and are seeking individuals, families, or groups to adopt a garden and care for it. This care involves weeding, pruning, deadheading spent flowers, etc. The time spent on your garden is determined by you. Gardening experience is welcomed, but not necessary as we can show you how to maintain the bed you adopt. We are all called to be stewards of the earth. Sanibona! Greetings to my American friends from Fr. Sabelo in South Africa,

Several of my friends asked me to update you on how I am doing now that I have returned to my diocese in Eshowe, South Africa.

I returned to my diocese in early November while COVID was still in full effect, so my Bishop recommended I just stay at home with my family for a time. It was great to spend time with them since I had been away for most of five years. Summer was just beginning so I was able to put my time to good use making needed repairs to our house and spending a lot of time with my brother's and sisters' children – all 7 of them.

In January I was finally sent to **Encounter Christ House of Formation** in Pietermaritzburg for the seminarians from my diocese. In my new position I wear many hats, not only Administrator, but also the Dean of Students and Formator. There are 5 seminarians and two priests in residence.

I have had to adapt to many, many new things in my new job, my priesthood and just getting used to the South African way of things. Life at the seminary has presented me with many challenges. My diocese is extremely poor and with the severe lockdowns because of COVID, this is not something that will change soon. We mostly rely on the support from the lay people and other donors, but because of many challenges, including very high unemployment, the diocese is struggling to get income.

Being an Administrator is not something I was trained to do, but luckily, I have received on the job training from colleagues and friends. The Seminary budget is extremely tight and there is very little money for even necessary repairs.

On my arrival I was greeted by a leaking toilet in my room that required mopping several times a day. So, one of my first tasks was finding a reliable plumber who could come to make the repairs at a price the seminary could afford. Only after he left did I learn that the laundry room and even the roof were also leaking!!

During a recent bad rainstorm, a very big tree split in half and fell across the fence into the road, thus requiring immediate attention. Our budget could not afford a professional tree cutter so I purchased a saw and with the help of the seminarians, cut the tree into pieces and hauled it away. We learn to make do with what we have.

The Formation part has been very rewarding. The seminarians range in age from 21 to 47. They take their academic classes at St. Joseph Theological Institute but at the moment they do most of their courses online and then live together at the House of Formation. We celebrate Mass together, pray together and have our meals and social time together. As part of their formation, they each have assigned duties at the house to teach them responsibility. I am enjoying getting to know the men and learning about their vocation journeys.

So, even in this short time I have learned that God never gives us something we cannot handle. Just as I dealt with the leaking toilet, the broken tree and limited resources, I have learned to accept the will of God and trust that God himself is doing the work. With him at my side I cannot fail.

I miss all of you and want to thank you for all I learned from you while I was in the US.

DOUBT

The desire to be able to prove the existence of a divinity has troubled humanity since human consciousness first became aware of the divine. To this very day we are fond of saying that any number of things—from sunsets to hot fudge sundaes—are “proof that there is a God.” We get so caught up in the story of “doubting Thomas” that we fail to notice that today’s Gospel gives us John’s account of Pentecost, the bestowing of the Holy Spirit upon the disciples following the Resurrection. Thomas, evidently, missed out not only on seeing the Risen Christ, but receiving the Holy Spirit as well. This is not to be taken lightly and, perhaps, makes Thomas’ disbelief a bit easier to comprehend. It also makes his professing that Jesus is his Lord and God—the only time the New Testament explicitly refers to Jesus Christ as “God”—more remarkable.

LAKE COUNTY FEDERAL EMERGENCY RENTAL ASSISTANCE

Lake County renters who face financial hardship related to COVID-19 may apply for the new Lake County Federal Emergency Rental Assistance (FERA) Program, which provides help for individuals paying rent and/or utility bills. Eligible households may receive up to 12 months of past due rent and up to three months of assistance with future rent, but no more than 12 months of assistance total. Payments will be made directly to landlords and/or utility companies.

To qualify for help, residents must:

- Pay rent in Lake County
- Have a COVID-related financial hardship
- Be at risk of homelessness or housing instability
- Meet income guidelines based on household size
- Provide appropriate documentation
