

#### Dear Family of SMV,

Holy Saturday Night is the holiest night in the life of the Church.

On Holy Saturday night, the congregation enters a dark church to celebrate the Easter Vigil. Here at St. Mary of Vernon, we begin the service with the Deacon, servers, and Priest processing from the back of the church through the middle aisle to the front of the

church. They walk across the sanctuary. Through the door in the front Sacristy, they move outside while the congregation remains in the church. The Priest lights a huge fire which is visible to the congregation through the large window behind the sanctuary. The Priest blesses the new fire. After that, the Deacon, servers, and Priest process to the back of the church with the new fire to bless and inscribe our Easter Paschal Candle.

The Priest carves a cross into the Paschal Candle. As he carves the vertical line he says, "Christ yesterday and today;" as he carves the horizontal line he says, "the Beginning and the End." He carves the letter Alpha above the vertical line as he says, "the Alpha"; and the letter Omega below the same line as he says, "and the Omega."

Beginning on the upper left corner of the cross he had carved on the candle, the Priest carves the first numeral of the current year as he says, "All time belongs to Him." Then the second numeral of the current year on the upper right corner saying, "and all the ages." The third numeral on the lower left corner as he says, "To Him be glory and power;" while he carves the fourth numeral of the current year in the lower right corner of the cross, he says, "through every age and forever." And the congregation responds, "Amen."

Taking five grains of incense, the Priest inserts them into the Paschal Candle in the form of a cross as he says, "By His holy and glorious wounds, may Christ the Lord guard us and protect us. Amen."

Then the Priest lights the Paschal Candle from the new fire while praying, "May the Light of Christ rising in glory dispel the darkness of our hearts and minds."

The Deacon leads the servers and Priest in a procession into a dark church carrying the Paschal Candle. He raises the Paschal Candle and proclaims, "Christ our light!" The congregation responds, "Thanks be to God." The congregation lights the candle they had received when they entered the church from the Paschal Candle. When the Deacon gets to the center of the church aisle, he raises the Paschal Candle again, and again proclaims, "Christ our light;" and the congregation responds, "Thanks be to God." When he reaches the front of the church, before ascending the steps of the sanctuary, he faces the congregation, once more raising the Paschal Candle he proclaims, "Christ our light." And once more the congregation responds, "Thanks be to God."

By the time the Deacon and the Priest ascend into the sanctuary, the whole church is lit up in the light of Christ. You should see it from the presider's chair. What beauty! What magnificence!

That is what our paschal celebration is all about. That Christ is our light. That Christ comforts, binds, and heals our wounds. That Christ protects and guards us. That we acknowledge Christ as the beginning and the end. That "All time belongs to Him, and all the ages, to Him be glory and power through every age and forever. Amen." In the words of the Priest as he blesses the new fire, "By these paschal celebrations, may [we] be so inflamed with heavenly desires, that with minds made pure we may attain festivities of unending splendor." Amen!

Deferred Gifts\* support our efforts through gifts that are arranged for now but may not be received until later. These gifts include gifts of new or fully paid-up life insurance policies, certain types of trust arrangements or gifts though a person's will by bequest.

Every 4<sup>th</sup> Saturday of the month (this month it is April 22), the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick will be offered at the 8:30 a.m. Mass.






