


#### Women of the Mantle

**Special Religious Educational Development** 



As the parish celebrate the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of my ordination to the priesthood, I have been reflecting on my life as a priest. Let me share with you some scripture passages which came to mind the last few weeks. The first is from the gospel of John 15:16. Jesus says to his apostles, "It was not you who chose me, but I who chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit that will remain..."

When I was in the seminary, seminarians heard a lot about God choosing us to be priests. We talked a lot about God calling us to the priesthood. At the same time, we also emphasized the worth of preparing for the priesthood. While we talked about God calling us to the priesthood, deep within we believed we were the ones choosing to be priests.

Contrary to that assumption, twenty-five years as a priest has taught me that it was indeed God who chose me to be his priest. When I began theological studies at Mundelein Seminary, I wanted to leave the seminary. For some reason I decided to stay till the end of the quarter. Four years later I was ordained a priest. As I look back at my life as a priest, I have done some good. I have also realized my imperfections. This awareness of my inadequacies convinces me more and more each day that it was indeed God who called me to his priesthood. It is also God's grace that is keeping me in the priesthood.

After ordination twenty-five years ago, I went to Nigeria to celebrate Mass with family, relatives, and friends. At the end of that celebration, I distributed a prayer card with my picture and a scripture passage printed underneath the picture. The scripture passage was from the Book of Exodus 23:20-21. It says, "See, I am sending an angel before you, to guard you on the way and bring you to the place I have prepared. Be attentive to him and heed his voice." After the LORD had given the children of Israel the ten commandments, together with rules and regulations they must follow, the Lord said to the Israelites, "See, I am sending an angel before you."

When I chose this scripture passage twenty-five years ago, my prayer and hope then was that the Lord would send his angel before me to guard me in his priesthood. Today I can say with every fiber of my being, that God has truly been guarding me in his priesthood. I know I have not always been attentive to the angel. I have not always heeded his voice. It is solely by the grace of God that I am still a priest.


"How shall I make a return to the Lord for all the good he has done for me? I shall take the cup of salvation and call upon the name of the Lord" (Ps. 116:12-13). In twenty-five years of priesthood, I have grown in my belief in the real presence of Jesus in the Eucharist. Whenever I am excited, I come to Jesus truly present in the Eucharist to thank him. Whenever I have experienced sorrow and heartaches, I have found consolation in Jesus Christ present in the tabernacle.

I thank you for celebrating with me. I am eternally grateful to God for the gift of the priesthood. Please pray for me as I continue to pray for you and your loved ones.




