For Our Future Update

As of Tuesday, June 6, 2023, we have \$1,717,512 pledged and \$323,761 cash in the bank from 345 donors. We are very excited to announce that our first project will be the sound system in church; installation will begin on Monday, June 19th. The project is expected to take two weeks to complete. The current sound system is over 20 years old. Parts of the current system are outdated and can no longer be repaired. We currently have temporary bandaids on the system, but any day the entire system could go out.

After obtaining several references and quotes, and meeting with multiple vendors, we signed a contract with **Sound Planning** out of Wheaton. \$106,461.00 has been set aside for the project. All contracts have been reviewed and approved by the Archdiocese of Chicago.

Scope of Work

Sound Planning will enhance the sanctuary audio system with a partial new output stage and new rack equipment with the goals of a better audio experience for parishioners and a more streamlined and easier to use audio flow for operators.

As a value engineering measure, **Sound Planning** will partially redesign the output stage (speakers and amplifiers) to provide a better auditory experience. One new center speaker will handle the center seating area. The speaker selected will eliminate the need for the existing center delay (which upon site visit seems to be operating intermittently). The new speaker will be suspended from the existing ceiling structure.

Because the customer notes the existing input and outputs (I/O) in the musician area is sufficient for their needs, the number of inputs and outputs will be maintained. All wiring will be inspected and replaced as necessary for noise free performance. The pockets will be maintained but replated to remove where corrosion has developed.

Audio system control will be streamlined. The rear of church control area will be discontinued. All liturgical inputs will be controlled by a touch screen at the rack location. It is likely very infrequent adjustment of liturgical inputs will be necessary. The musician area will be provided a new 16-channel digital mixer for control of musician and singers' equipment. The mixer will be remote controllable by iPAD control.

The existing assisted listening equipment will be maintained.

Because the control area is being redesigned, a new power management plan is included to provide both single button on/off as well as component protection.

Sound panels will be installed on the back walls to help reduce echoing.

Lake County United News

It is time for SMV's Peace and Justice Lake County United Ministry to get together. We meet in the church Narthex at 10:45 AM the second Sunday of each month.

We know that there is up to a seven year wait for affordable housing in Lake County. Our SMV members have been working on solving this problem. We are meeting to discuss our efforts to support affordable housing in Waukegan, Libertyville, and in Lake County. As well as update our efforts at improving gun safety through the National Gun Safety Consortium. Mark Alexander has been working at getting college students in Lake County interested.

Patricia Bahnick has attended the Libertyville Housing meeting at SMV and represented LCU at United Methodist Church of Libertyville's ministry Sunday, Mary Anne Wender has surveyed area towns to find out their level of support for affordable housing. She has discovered that Mundelein is most supportive. What about Vernon Hills and Libertyville?

I have been meeting with the LCU Libertyville and Waukegan affordable housing committees. Our Waukegan St. Therese property housing development is at a stalemate. In Libertyville we are working to engage local businesses as large as Advocate Condell Medical Center, interviewing their essential workers to learn their housing stories and more.

In addition we have met with Lake County Sheriff Idleburg to get his support for gun safety by joining the National Gun Safety Consortium. Currently, Park Ridge, Evanston, Kane County, and Milwaukee are members.

An outgrowth of the *Do Not Stand Idly By* campaign, the National Gun Safety Consortium is organizing public sector leaders to combine their purchasing power, research and expertise to promote gun safety and tackle the problem of unsecured guns in America.


