

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

Today we observe World Mission Sunday and proclaim in the words of Pope Francis, "Everyone has a right to receive the Gospel." In his annual message, the Holy Father reminds us that as baptized Christians, we are duty bound to announce the Gospel without excluding anyone. Through this worldwide Eucharistic celebration, all of us participate in the missionary movement of the Church with our prayers and activities, material offerings, our sufferings and our personal witness.

Reflecting on the theme for this year, "Hearts on fire, feet on the move," Pope Francis invites us to kindle the fire of Christ's love in our hearts and to actively share our joy. Inspired by the Holy Spirit, we go forth and bring this Good News to all corners of the globe.

The World Mission Sunday collection, organized by the Pontifical Society for the Propagation of the Faith, contributes to the building up of the Church in over 1100 dioceses and territories that are too young and many too poor to sustain themselves. Who can receive the sacrament? All who are experiencing illness, old age or anticipating a surgery may receive this sacrament as well as those who are dying. The anointing of the forehead and hands of the sick person is accompanied by prayer, laying on of hands and Scripture reading. The communal celebration of the sacrament is appropriately celebrated during the Mass. The sick person is united to the passion of Christ, receives strength, peace and courage to endure the sufferings of illness or old age, the forgiveness of sins, and preparation for passing over to eternal life for those who may be dying.

Catholic Conference of Illinois

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

We, the Catholic bishops of Illinois, write with a sense of urgency. Unless the General Assembly acts to renew the Invest in Kids scholarship program, more than 9,000 children currently relying on this program to attend a non-public school may have their educational path disrupted. Without an extension of the program in Illinois law now, no scholarships will be awarded for the school year that will begin in September 2024. Most of these children will have to leave the school their families determined was their best chance to receive a high-quality education in a safe and wholesome learning environment. This is an injustice that should and can be avoided, but only if the General Assembly acts when it reconvenes on October 24, 2023.

Invest in Kids has proven to be a beacon of hope for thousands of Illinois students and their families. Children receiving Invest in Kids scholarships come from lower-income families who could not otherwise afford tuition at the Catholic or another non-public school that is the best fit for their child. Childhood is a limited time in the life of a human being and primary and secondary education is not something that can be put off to some future date when it is convenient for adults. This is our one chance to offer these Illinois children a good start. Please help keep education options available and a brighter future possible by contacting your state senator and state representative and telling them to continue the Invest in Kids Program.

Since its inception six years ago, Invest in Kids has generated overwhelmingly positive results. Nearly 40,000 scholarships have been awarded to students attending non-public schools across Illinois. Demand for scholarships is very high - for every scholarship granted, three students are turned down due to lack of funds. Contrary to what you may have heard, this is not a voucher program, nor does it take state funds away from the public schools. These scholarships are funded through contributions from donors who receive a tax credit for their donation on their Illinois state income tax.

What can you do to help? Please contact your state senator and state representative to let them know of your support for extending the Invest in Kids tax credit scholarship program in Illinois. We also encourage you to urge your fellow parishioners to do the same. Our collective voice is vital to the continued help for Illinois families. 



Financial Report Fiscal Year 2022-2023

The Fiscal Year 2022-23 was a year of coming back. As a parish, we strove to bring back events and ministries- all in person. In July, Fr. Shemek Tomczyk joined us as an Associate Pastor. And, after a year of searching, we hired Mark Schmitz as our new Director of Music in October.

Enrollment in our Religious Education and Youth Ministry programs is steady, but not as high as pre-pandemic enrollment. We held several social activities throughout the year, including new events such as Night in Bethlehem, BBQ and Bourbon Tasting, and the Living Last Supper. All were very successful events bringing our parish community together.

Our Sunday Mass count continues to improve with a weekend average of 850, but we are short of our pre-pandemic numbers. Yet, the parishioners of St Mary of Vernon have continued to rally behind their parish with amazing generosity. Your continuous financial support enabled us to end the fiscal year nearly covering all our expenses.

Thankfully, online giving continues to provide a significant part of our Sunday income. Give Central electronic donations provided 44% of our annual income. Our annual Sunday income was \$914,487.

On the expense side, our total expenses were consistent with last year; however, we are facing some large maintenance costs including a new church sound system, new church lighting, new roof on the parish center, garage, and church. In the fall of 2022, we met and hired Walsh Consultants to conduct a 3-year "For Our Future" Capital Campaign for the parish. \$1.5 million was the goal, with \$2 million being our reach goal. The people of St. Mary of Vernon continue to bless the parish with their generosity, and we are currently only \$155,000 short of the \$2 million reach goal.

In November 2022, the rectory furnaces were replaced thanks to a donor who specifically gave to the For Our Future Campaign for the rectory furnaces. In March 2023, we began work on the new church sound system. Money was borrowed from the parish savings account to fund the project because we hadn't yet collected enough campaign funds.

In Other Income and Expenses, we continue to support St. Angela's, our Sharing School and other Archdiocesan collections. Our rebate from the Annual Catholic Appeal was higher than last year, from \$58,320 to \$89,384 even with the Capital Campaign kick-off.

We are truly grateful for the continued generosity of our parish family! We are looking forward to new and exciting opportunities at St. Mary of Vernon.

For Our Future Update

As of Monday, October 16, we have \$1,845,496 pledged and \$610,457 has been collected from 383 donors. All pledge acknowledgements and payment schedules have been sent to all our donors.
