

### **Christmas 2023**

Seven hundred years before the birth of Jesus, the Prophet Isaiah wrote, "For a child is born to us, a son is given us; upon his shoulder dominion rests. They name him Wonder-Counselor, God-Hero, Father-Forever, Prince of Peace" (9:5). After the birth of Jesus, multitude of angels

sang, "Glory to God in the highest and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests" (Lk. 2:14). Yet, two thousand years after the birth of the Prince of Peace, the world still does not know peace.

The author of The Letter of James (4:1-3) has an opinion on why peace continues to evade the world. He asks, "Where do the wars and where do the conflicts among you come from?" To answer that question, he states, "Is it not from your passions that make war within your members? You covet but do not possess. You kill and envy but you cannot obtain; you fight and wage war. You ask but do not receive, because you ask wrongly, to spend it on your passions."

Where did wrong passion come from? It came from the fall of Adam and Eve. Their actions brought the first conflict in nature. For example, when God created the world, God set limits for the sea and land. Because of Adam and Eve's actions, there were now earthquakes, tsunamis, diseases, etc. Secondly, their actions brought conflicts among animals. The Wolf no longer was a guest of the lamb, the Leopard no longer laid down with the kid, the Calf and the young Lion no longer browsed together with a little child to guide them (Is. 11: 6). Thirdly their actions brought conflict among persons, groups, and nations. Fourth, it brought conflict within the individual, and last of all, their actions brought conflict between human beings and God.

One can categorically state that conflict in the world began with conflict with God. To resolve this issue, man needed to make peace with God. Since humans did not have what it took to make this reconciliation, God took it upon Himself to come into the world to reconcile the world to Himself. God did this in the suffering, death, and resurrection of Jesus. According to the Apostle Paul, "It pleased God to make absolute fullness reside in him and, by means of him, to reconcile everything in his person, both on earth and in the heavens, making peace through the blood of his cross" (Col. 1:19).

Before Jesus did battle with Satan on Calvary, he said to his apostles, "Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. Not as the world gives do I give it to you. Do not let your hearts be troubled or afraid" (Jn. 14:27). After he defeated Satan the father of lies and chaos and emerged triumphantly from the grave, Jesus's first words to his disciples were, "peace be with you" (Jn. 20:19).

Peace in the world begins with peace with God. It all began with the birth of a child, the Prince of Peace, some two thousand years ago. "For onto us a child is born, a son is given, upon his shoulder dominion rests. They call him Wonder-Counselor, God-Hero, Father-Forever, Prince of Peace."

May the Prince of Peace, who is born into our world today, bring each of us his everlasting peace. Peace be with you! Merry Christmas everyone! Fr. Ignatius



We do all this **and more**, as a band of brothers, men sharing a common bond forged in Christian fellowship and comradery.




What CLOW is not: It is not a child-care program. Nor is it an arts and craft session intended to keep the children busy as the adults attend Mass.


Parents are always encouraged and welcome to attend CLOW. Younger children may also attend but will need the supervision of an older sibling or a parent.

### To all of our wonderful St. Mary of Vernon sponsors and supporters

COVE Alliance originated as one man's dream, and has become a growing network of caring, generous people reaching out to orphaned and disadvantaged children in Uganda. Hilary Muheezangango began studying for the priesthood at the University of Saint Mary of the Lake Seminary in 2003. During his internship here at SMV, he shared his dream of building a school and health clinic in his home town of Kapeeka, Uganda. His dream touched a group of SMV parishioners and in 2005 COVE Alliance was formed. Fr. Hilary shared personal stories of growing up in Uganda, an area that had seen multiple civil wars since his birth in 1972. His



childhood experiences included roaming and sleeping in the jungles while seeking safety during times of war. At one time he and his family were in a relocation camp in Kapeeka, on the very site where the COVE buildings now stand.

As 2024 approaches, COVE is preparing for the start of a new school year that begins in January, in Uganda. We have a new group of approximately 15 students who will begin their journey with COVE Alliance. Usually we have a wait list of sponsors ready to embark on this exciting journey; however this year, we are in dire need of sponsors for these young children. We need your help to spread the word. ### **RECYCLING HELPS ALL OF US**




Some years ago COVE Alliance collected your empty toner and ink cartridges. We no longer have a way of recycling the toner cartridges BUT WE ARE STILL ABLE TO RECYCLE INK CARTRIDGES. At this time we would like to bring back the col-

lection program. You can help by bringing your used cartridges to church and putting them in the COVE Alliance box that is located in the handicapped Narthex entrance.

As a parish we try to focus on the environment and find ways to personally commit to helping the environment. Here is an easy way to do that. Did you know that over 500 million ink cartridges are sold in the US each year? Nearly 375 million end up in landfills.

### PARTICIPATE IN THE WEEKEND LITURGY

Bringing the Gifts to the Altar. You are most welcome and encouraged to present the gifts at Sunday Mass. Sign up at the Welcome Desk in the Narthex. A minimum of 4 and maximum of 8 people are needed to present the gifts; but single persons as well as families can sign up to join in the procession. Just arrive 10 minutes early on that day, check your name off in the book, and let one of the ushers know you are present. They will guide you as to the procedure.

Mass Intentions read during the Prayers of the Faithful. Mass intentions can be reserved at the Narthex desk, or by visiting or calling the Parish Office. At weekday Masses and at the 5pm and 7:45am Masses, only one intention is allowed (although names of related family members can count as one intention). At the 9:30am and 11:15am Masses, we can reserve more than one intention. We request a \$10 stipend.

<u>Votive Candles</u> (on the east side of the sanctuary) may be reserved at the Narthex desk or at the parish office during the week. Candles last for six days, and are changed on Saturday mornings. Donation is \$5.



### MONTHLY ANOINTING OF THE SICK

Every 4<sup>th</sup> Saturday of the month the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick is offered at the 8:30am Mass.

Who can receive the sacrament? All who are experiencing illness, old age or anticipating a surgery may receive this sacrament as well as those who are dying.

**How is it celebrated?** The anointing of the forehead and hands of the sick person is accompanied by prayer, laying on of hands and Scripture reading. The communal celebration of the sacrament is appropriately celebrated during the Mass.

What are the sacrament's effects? The sick person is united to the passion of Christ, receives strength, peace and courage to endure the sufferings of illness or old age, the forgiveness of sins, and preparation for passing to eternal life for those who may be dying.

# You are Cordially Invited!

Family Mass is celebrated on the 3rd Sunday of each month at 11:15 a.m.

The homily is geared towards children, and teens will fulfill ministerial roles in the liturgy.

On the third Sunday of the month, Children's Liturgy of the Word will not take place at 11:15 a.m. Mass.
