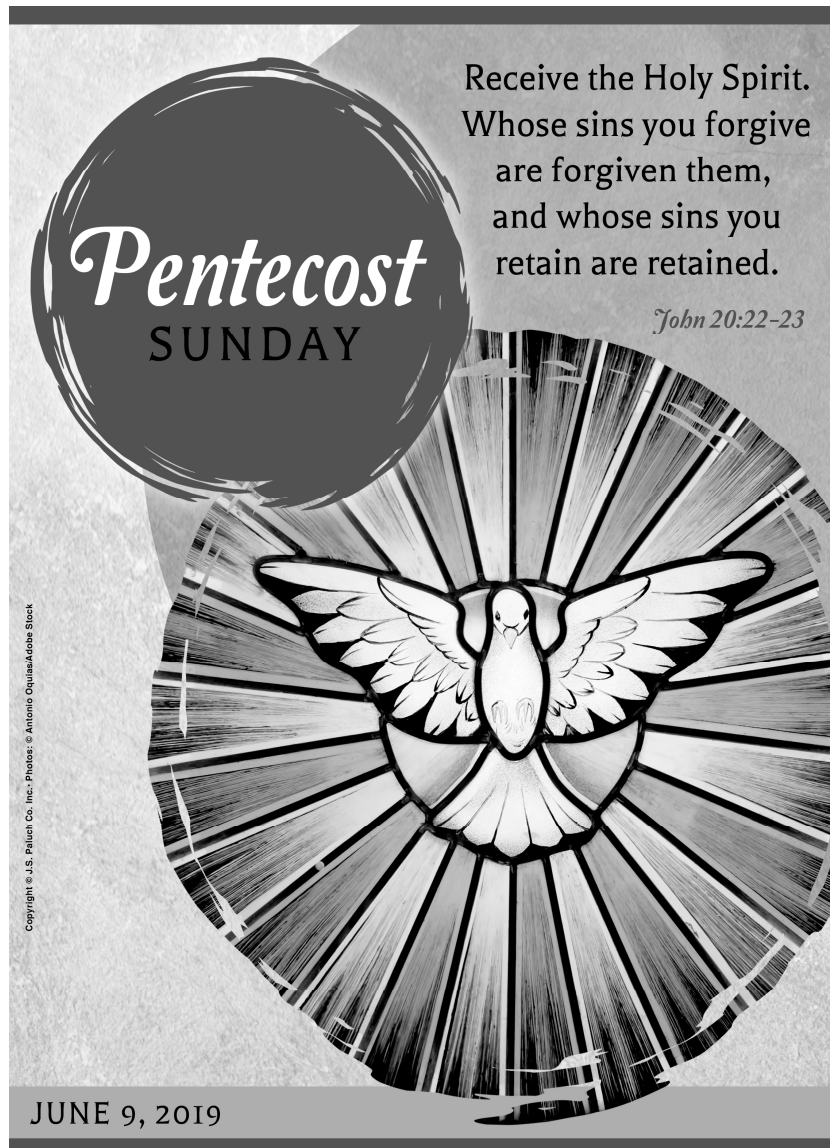

Several years ago a submarine was being tested and had to remain submerged for many hours. When it returned to the harbor, the captain was asked, "How did the terrible storm last night affect you?" The officer looked at him in surprise and exclaimed, "Storm? We didn't even know there was one!" The sub had been so far beneath the surface that it had reached the area known to sailors as "the cushion of the sea." Although the ocean may be whipped into huge waves by high winds, the waters below are never stirred. This, I believe, is a perfect picture of the peace that comes from Christ's Spirit. The waves of worry, of fear, of heartbreak, cannot touch those resting in Christ. Sheltered by His grace and encouraged by His Spirit, the believer is given the perfect tranquility that only Christ can provide.

This Sunday is Pentecost. Today we celebrate the birth of the Church. We gather to tell the story of the great mystery of God's Spirit, poured out on all who believe that Jesus is the Lord.

It is not a story easily explained. The first disciples could only say later that it felt like new wind in their sails, new breath in their bodies, new fire in their passion, new language in their mouth. Wind, fire, breath, language, all invisible, powerful images of the acting presence of God's Spirit within us. But these images are full of power, change and life. That is the way to describe the life of a Christian. We are changed people, full of God's life, agents for change in the name and power of God.

Before Jesus left his disciples, he gave them, and us, one very special gift. Jesus breathed on them. We may ask: why not leave them with a manual on miracles or arms to defend themselves? The Holy Spirit is often symbolized in scriptures as wind or breath or air. This action of breathing upon the disciples reminds us of the creation story, when God created humankind by breathing into them the breath of life. "Then the Lord God formed man from the dust of the ground and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and the man became a living being"(Gen 2,7).

Jesus is giving the Church new life, making her a new creation. This is how the church was born. The church originated with God. Christ founded it, guides it, and still is the head. That makes the church so special. No civic club, no fraternity, no business, no social club, no bank. Take heart and hope, my friends. The church is far from perfection. We have made many mistakes in the past. And we will make more in the future. Cynics will continue to write her obituary. But the church is here to stay, for it is the creation of God. Today, we celebrate what is right with the church. The Church is great and we are fortunate to be part of it.



Duchu Święty Przyjdź!

Obchodzimy dzisiaj Uroczystość Zesłania Ducha Świętego. Jest to pamiątka tego dnia, w którym Duch Święty zstąpił na Najświętszą Maryję Pannę oraz na apostołów. Ten Duch, którego Jezus obiecał zamin powrócił do swojego Ojca w niebie. Obchodząc tę piękną uroczystość, spójrzmy na Ducha Świętego, który jest trzecią Osobą Trójcy Przenajświętszej. Duch Święty jest Bogiem tak samo jak Ojciec i Syn. Trzecia Boża Osoba Najświętszej Trójcy została posłana nam przez Ojca i Syna Jezusa Chrystusa. Duch Święty uświęca Kościół, kontynuuje jego misję i sprawia, że nauczanie Jezusa jest przekazywane w nieziennej formie. Ducha Świętego otrzymujemy podczas sakramentu chrztu świętego, zaś w sakramencie bierzmowania otrzymujemy pełnię Jego darów: mądrości, rozumu, rady, męstwa, umiejętności, pobożności i bojaźni Bożej. Dlatego sakrament bierzmowania nazywamy sakramentem dojrzałości chrześcijańskiej. Ponadto Duch Święty obdarza nas owocami wypływającymi z tych darów: „miłość, radość, pokój, cierpliwość, uprzejmość, dobroć, wierność, łagodność i opanowanie” (Gal 5,22-23). Bez pomocy Ducha Świętego nikt nie jest w stanie uwierzyć w Boga w Trójcy Jedyne, mieć nadzieję życia wiecznego, czy też żałować i nawrócić się ze swoich grzechów. Duch Święty jest Miłością Osobową. Wiemy, że prawdziwa miłość pochodzi od Boga. W jaki sposób możemy się o tym przekonać? Możemy to lepiej zrozumieć spoglądając na trzy charakterystyczne cechy prawdziwej miłości.

Pierwszą cechą jest prawda, że prawdziwa miłość potrafi ponosić ofiary. Jeżeli kogoś naprawdę kochamy, to jesteśmy w stanie dla tej osoby wiele poświęcić. Prawdziwa miłość nigdy nie jest samolubna. Pewien kapłan wyznał, że przed wstąpieniem do seminarium duchownego, przedstawił Bogu na modlitwie siedem propozycji swojej przyszłej drogi życia: lekarz, mąż i ojciec, osoba samotna, człowiek interesu, żołnierz, działacz społeczny oraz, że nie będzie nic w życiu robił. Po gorącej i długiej modlitwie do Ducha Świętego, największy pokój zawitał w jego sercu po podjęciu decyzji zostania kapłanem.

Drugą cechą prawdziwej miłości jest jej wartość oczyszczająca. Miłość, która sprowadza drugą osobę na złą drogę: narkomanii, alkoholizmu, nieczystości i wszelkich innych uzależnień, nie ma nic wspólnego z prawdziwą miłością. Miłość, która czyni drugą osobę gorszą zamiast pomagać jest stawiać się lepszą, jest miłością z góry fałszywą. Jeżeli zaś, kochana osoba staje się dzięki miłości lepszą osobą i lepszym naśladowcą Chrystusa, wtedy taka miłość jest prawdziwa i oczyszczająca.

Wreszcie trzecią cechą autentycznej miłości jest to, że taka miłość troszczy się o osobę ukochaną. Nie domaga się, aby druga osoba nam usługiwała i spełniała nasze zachcianki, a przez to potwierdzała, że nas kocha. Miłość nie mówi co ja chcę, ale pyta co ty chcesz?

Lednica 2000 Association pragnie zaprosić Was na XV Lednickie Spotkanie Młodych. **Zgromadzimy się na placu w parafii Św. Rozalii przy 4401 N. Oak Park w Harwood Heights, IL, 15 czerwca, 2019.**

W tym roku naszą drogę ku Lednicy wyznacza hasło „Wiesz, że Cię kocham”. Te słowa brzmią jak wyznanie świętego Piotra, na których zbudowana jest Lednica. Tym razem chcemy jednak, by pielgrzymi Lednicy usłyszeli te słowa, jako wyznanie miłości, wyśpiewane przez Boga o każdym z nas: “Wiesz, że Cię kocham”.

Inspirowani intuicją pierwszego duszpasterza Lednicy, ojca Jana Góry OP, przygotowując czerwcowe spotkanie czerpiemy z przemówienia św. Jana Pawła II, wygłoszonego do młodych w Krakowie w 1987 roku. Ojciec Święty mówił wtedy o potrzebnej człowiekowi „sile przebicia”, mocy do zmagania z codziennością, z wyzwaniem młodego życia. Papież powiedział wtedy skąd bierze się ta siła: „człowiek jest mocny wtedy, kiedy wie, że jest kochany.”

Przesłanie Jana Pawła II sprawiło, że chcemy by tegoroczna Lednica była zachwytem nad skarbami, które ofiaruje nam Kościół – nad spowiedzią i Eucharystią. Są to dwa sakramenty, w których do każdego z nas Chrystus mówi „Kocham Cię!”. Doświadczamy w nich poprzez wiarę niemal namacalnie Jego miłości - i wiedząc, że jesteśmy przez Boga umiłowani, mamy siły by iść dalej w życie.

Queridos hermanos y hermanas, ¡buenos días!

Hoy celebramos la gran fiesta de Pentecostés, con la que finaliza el tiempo pascual, cincuenta días después de la Resurrección de Cristo. La liturgia nos invita a abrir nuestra mente y nuestro corazón al don del Espíritu Santo, que Jesús prometió en más de una ocasión a sus discípulos, el primer y principal don que Él nos alcanzó con su Resurrección. Este don, Jesús mismo lo pidió al Padre, como lo testifica el Evangelio de hoy, ambientado en la Última Cena. Jesús dice a sus discípulos: «Si me amáis, guardaréis mis mandamientos; y yo pediré al Padre y os dará otro Paráclito, para que esté con vosotros para siempre» (Jn 14, 15-16).

Estas palabras nos recuerdan ante todo que el amor por una persona, y también por el Señor, se demuestra no con las palabras, sino con los hechos; y también «cumplir los mandamientos» se debe entender en sentido existencial, de modo que toda la vida se vea implicada. En efecto, ser cristianos no significa principalmente pertenecer a una cierta cultura o adherir a una cierta doctrina, sino más bien vincular la propia vida, en cada uno de sus aspectos, a la persona de Jesús y, a través de Él, al Padre. Para esto Jesús promete la efusión del Espíritu Santo a sus discípulos. Precisamente gracias al Espíritu Santo, Amor que une al Padre y al Hijo y de ellos procede, todos podemos vivir la vida misma de Jesús.

El Espíritu, en efecto, nos enseña todo, o sea la única cosa indispensable: amar como ama Dios.

Al prometer el Espíritu Santo, Jesús lo define «otro Paráclito» (v. 16), que significa Consolador, Abogado, Intercesor, es decir Quien nos asiste, nos defiende, está a nuestro lado en el camino de la vida y en la lucha por el bien y contra el mal.

Jesús dice «otro Paráclito» porque el primero es Él, Él mismo, que se hizo carne precisamente para asumir en sí mismo nuestra condición humana y liberarla de la esclavitud del pecado.

Además, el Espíritu Santo ejerce una función de enseñanza y de memoria. Enseñanza y memoria. Nos lo dijo Jesús: «El Paráclito, el Espíritu Santo, que el Padre enviará en mi nombre, os lo enseñará todo y os recordará todo lo que yo os he dicho» (v. 26). El Espíritu Santo no trae una enseñanza distinta, sino que hace viva, hace operante la enseñanza de Jesús, para que el tiempo que pasa no la borre o no la debilite. El Espíritu Santo injerta esta enseñanza dentro de nuestro corazón, nos ayuda a interiorizarlo, haciendo que se convierte en parte de nosotros, carne de nuestra carne. Al mismo tiempo, prepara nuestro corazón para que sea verdaderamente capaz de recibir las palabras y los ejemplos del Señor. Todas las veces que se acoge con alegría la palabra de Jesús en nuestro corazón, esto es obra del Espíritu Santo. Recemos ahora juntos el *Regina caeli* —por última vez este año—, invocando la maternal intercesión de la Virgen María. Que ella nos obtenga la gracia de ser fuertemente animados por el Espíritu Santo, para testimoniar a Cristo con franqueza evangélica y abrirnos cada vez más a la plenitud de su amor.

June is the Month of the Sacred Heart



As May was the month of Mary, our Blessed Mother, and June is the Month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus, does it not follow that as May leads into June, Mary leads us to her the love of her Son, symbolized by His Heart?

History of the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus

Devotion to the Sacred Heart is a form of devotion to the person Jesus, and especially to His Love.

The *Catholic Encyclopedia* details a history of this devotion. It observed that from the time of Saint John and Saint Paul there has always been in the Church something like devotion to the love of God, Who so loved the world as to give it His only-begotten Son, and to the love of Jesus, Who has so loved us as to deliver Himself up for us. But, accurately speaking, this is not the devotion to the Sacred Heart, as it pays no homage to the Heart of Jesus as the symbol of His love for us. From the earliest centuries, Christ's open side and the mystery of blood and water were meditated upon, and the Church was beheld issuing from the side of Jesus, as Eve came forth from the side of Adam. But there is nothing to indicate that, during the first ten centuries, any worship was rendered the wounded Heart.

It is in the eleventh and twelfth centuries that we find the first unmistakable indications of devotion to the Sacred Heart. Through the wound in the side the wounded Heart was gradually reached, and the wound in the Heart symbolized the wound of Divine Love. In the Benedictine and Cistercian monasteries devotion arose, although it is impossible to say what where the first texts. Saint Gertrude (d.

1302) had a vision on the feast of John the Evangelist. She was resting her head near the wound in the Savior's side and hearing the beating of the Divine Heart. She asked Saint John if on the night of the Last Supper, he had felt these delightful pulsations, why he had never spoken of the fact. Saint John replied that this revelation had been reserved for subsequent ages when the world, having grown cold, would have need of it to rekindle its love.

From the thirteenth to the sixteenth century, the devotion was practiced as a private, individual devotion of the mystical order. In the sixteenth century, the devotion took an onward step and passed from the domain of mysticism into that of Christian asceticism. It was constituted an objective devotion with prayers already formulated and special exercises of which the value was extolled and practice commended.

The devotion to the Sacred Heart developed further during the seventeenth century. Ascetic writers spoke of it, especially those of the Society of Jesus (Jesuits), Alvarez de Paz, Luis de la Puente, Saint-Jure and Nouet and Father Druzicki, small work "*Meta Cordium, Cor Jesu*".

The devotion was greatly increased by the visions Sister Margaret Mary Alacoque (1647-1690), a French Visitandine nun at the convent of Paray-le-Monial. She had a vision of Christ's Heart on the feast of Saint John that was similar to that of Saint Gertrude. Jesus permitted her to rest her head upon His Heart, and then disclosed to her the wonders of His love, telling her that He desired to make this known to mankind and to diffuse the treasures of His goodness, and that He had chosen her for this work, (probably 1673, Dec. 27). In June or July of 1674, Sister Margaret Mary said, Jesus asked to be honored under the figure of His Heart of Flesh and asked for a devotion of expiatory love — frequent Communion, Communion on the first Friday of

each month and the observance of Holy Hours.

In another vision, on the feast of Corpus Christi 1675, Sister Margaret Mary reported that Jesus told her, "Behold the Heart that has so loved men...instead of gratitude I receive from the greater part (of mankind) only ingratitude..." Jesus then asked for a feast of reparation on the Friday after the octave of *Corpus Christi* bidding her to consult Father de la Colombière, then superior of the small Jesuit house at Paray. He recognized the action of the Spirit of God and consecrated himself to the Sacred Heart and directed Sister Margaret Mary to write down her account and to circulate it throughout France and England. Sister Margaret Mary Alacoque was canonized in the 20th century.

O Sacred Heart of Jesus, for whom it is impossible not to have compassion on the afflicted, have pity on us miserable sinners and grant us the grace which we ask of you, through the Sorrowful and Immaculate Heart of Mary, your tender Mother and ours.

Say the Hail, Holy Queen and add: St. Joseph, foster father of Jesus, pray for us.

RECONCILED DIVERSITY

A few years ago, during Rome's quiet summer, Pope Francis took a day off to visit privately with some old friends, whose identity took Catholic Italy by surprise: Evangelical Protestants. They welcomed Francis to their Pentecostal Church of Reconciliation, where Francis asked pardon for Catholic persecutions and celebrated the Holy Spirit's "pentecostal work." Unlike Satan, declared Francis, who creates division among God's children, the Holy Spirit creates a diversity rich and beautiful. And unity; not uniformity, Francis specified, but unity in diversity. Francis named the Spirit's gift "reconciled diversity." Pentecost's rich treasury of scriptural readings, for Saturday's vigil and Sunday's morning liturgy, traces the Holy Spirit's work from creation's beginning, through Jesus' resurrection, into the church's earliest days, now into our days. Kindled in our hearts, the Spirit's gentle fire is ours to share generously, even with those most strikingly different from us. All hearts are Spirit-warmed by reconciled diversity.

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TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

Today we are at the fiftieth day of the Easter celebration: seven weeks of seven days, a week of weeks, now culminating in a festival fiftieth day. While the liturgical color of the Easter season is gold, on this last day we have red. For the first thousand years of the church, there were no firm rules for using colors. Only wealthy churches could afford a full array of colors, and most places used the best vestments, no matter the color, for the greatest feasts. The Church spelled out an exact plan for color, including red for Pentecost, only in 1570, but local differences held on until the 1800s.

Color experts tell us that red is a hot color, best used for fast-paced, upbeat, active experiences. It is hard to be neutral before red, as any matador will tell you. It invites commitment, draws you in. It is a stimulating color, engaging the eye, stirring hunger. It is the most fitting color for this day when we celebrate the descent of the Holy Spirit into our lives, a dynamic presence overturning neutrality in favor of passion and commitment.

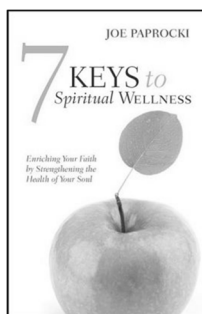

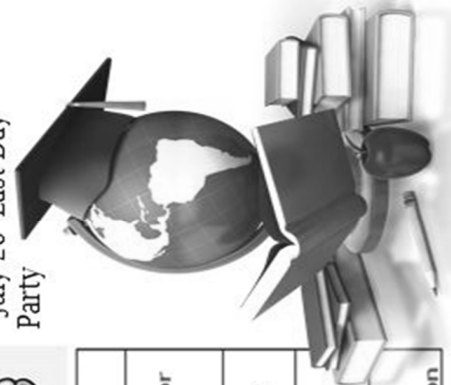
