

Prayer Pebble Challenge

- Paint a prayer pebble as a message to the parish community to remember children around the world and to pray for them. You will paint one for a Mission Together **child overseas**, like Malaya or Tala →
- Before you start painting, think of pictures that represent hope.
- You might add hopeful words, or a line from a Bible reading.
- For your overseas pebble, include the Mission Rosary colour for that continent. E.g. If your prayer pebble is for a child in the Philippines, remember to add the colour yellow for Asia.
- Don't worry about painting a perfect pebble, what matters is that you made the time to pray and to share God's love with others.



Malaya and Tala live in the Philippines. They belong to a community - called the Badjao people - who are often bullied and treated unfairly because the way they live is different from most people.

Thankfully, the Badjao are being helped by a group of Religious Sisters. With help from Mission Together, the Sisters are making sure the children receive health care and a good education.

The Sisters are helping the Badjao know that God the Father loves all his children equally, and wants us all to care for each other as brothers and sisters.
