



Pastor's Message



In the world in which Jesus lived, meals, eating together, sharing food with others, these were primary ways communication took place. In those days, the people who sat with you around your table were given legitimacy in their role and status in society. And it was only people of similar status or social rank that would grace your table. In the an-

cient times, the custom was to share a meal with people who were your peers, never eating with those who belong to a lower social rank. So, the leading Pharisee who invited Jesus to dine with him as we heard in today's Gospel paid him a compliment and an honor. He must have seen Jesus as his equal, as someone who shared his social rank. But we also heard, they "observed Him closely". Jesus' reputation had already begun to spread throughout the land. He had become more known for upsetting the social order of His day. After all, He was known to associate with tax collectors, prostitutes and the other dregs of society. They observed Him closely to see what would He do this time! How would He stir up the social norms and customs on which the Israelite society was built? Jesus, in all likelihood knowing that this was happening, did not disappoint them. Typical of Jesus, He relies on a parable to make His point. He tells His host and the rest of the guests the parable of the places of honor. And He concludes His parable with that oft-quoted portion of Sacred Scripture: "For everyone who exalts himself will be humbled, but the one who humbles himself will be exalted."

What is He telling them? Jesus is reminding them of the ancient Jewish belief that honor is given by God. It matters not what human beings may say or believe about a person. What matters is that God's opinion and judgement is the most important one. Just because others say that someone is honorable, trustworthy and blessed, does not make it so. Only if God makes a similar assessment will it be true. Jesus continues to upset the social norm that what others' say has less value and merit than what God says about a person...How do you judge another? How do you judge yourself? Is it God's "measuring stick" that you use or not? Where have you honored someone by sharing a meal with them? Finally, how have you been humbled in your life?

Welcome back Fr. Philip

We welcome back Fr. Philip, our missionary priest from India. Fr. Philip is the Assistant Superior General of Heralds of Good News – a relatively young Religious Congregation (founded in 1984) consisting of 478 priests - approximately half ministering in India and half around the world – primarily in Papua New Guinea (known as jungle priests), parts of Africa, Italy, Germany, Canada, Australia, the Netherlands and the United States.

Fr. Philip was instrumental in our Archdiocese welcoming four Herald's priests to serve here – they are in charge of Resurrection of the Lord Catholic Church on West Military Drive, and St. Thomas More parish San Antonio.

Did you ever wish to have a priest in your family who would pray for you daily and include you in his Masses and spiritual works? That wish is made possible through Herald's seminarian SPONSOSHIP program. The recommended cost is \$300 per year (which helps pay for the seminarian's room and board). You will be assigned a specific seminarian, receive his photo and biographical sketch and two personal letters from him yearly. Then upon his ordination you will have a priest in your family. STAFF MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

The following are highlights from the Staff Meeting held August 7, 2019.

- <u>Debbie:</u> We have completed another event filled summer with our Holy Trinity Youth...Our Youth attended the Steubenville Lone Star Conference, The Life Teen Leadership Conference, Our Teen ACTS Retreat and Summer Camp at Covecrest...This weekend (9-10) we will hold an upperclassman lock-in. A time of prayer and bonding before our seniors leave for their universities and colleges...This Sunday (11) we will have Senior Night at LIFE NIGHT...Sunday August 18 for the End of Summer- Beginning of the School Year we will host John Finch for a night of Praise and Worship...The Core Team is gearing up for a busy fall.
- <u>Desma:</u> Adult Confirmation will begin on September 19, 2019, Thursdays from 7-8:30PM. Registration has begun. Confirmation ceremony is Saturday, December 14, 10AM at Our Lady of Guadalupe in Helotes TX...Children's RCIA will begin on Wednesdays, September 17, 2019. As of now, I only have one child.
- Deacon Ray: We have not done anything major since our last meeting, just doing regular maintenance....Eagle Scout candidates Matthew Watson & Joshua Grundhoefer completed their Eagle Scout Project; they primed and painted the entire playground "train" and swing. They replaced wheels, handles, and sanded the slide. Excellent work...He reported on the following items: We took three bids to power wash all concrete on campus. Work was completed. Now the maintenance team will work to community for anyone who feels called to serve in this manner. A faucet was damaged in one of the Men's RR in the church. Its replacement will be a lower version to see if that will help in the complaints that have come in. Signs were placed in all RR's to help keep them clean...Icemaker in FF was cleaned of all the buildup that occurs be4cause of S.A.'s hard water...We placed 5 parking stops in our parking lot that were damaged....Smoke Alarm was replaced in FF; we also had to take care of some "yellow tags" placed by a fire inspection, as well replacing a chemical fire extinguisher. We are now in full compliance. In addition, keys were placed in our Knox-Boxes in our 4 major entrances—Parish Office; front of Church; front of FF; and BH...We changed landscape companies as of Sept. 1st. We are no longer with MLC and now have Lane Bishop's company HJ Horticulture...We have a work order for 4 lights that are out in the sanctuary and four in our back parking lot...We had two major A/C related leaks on campus, one in the Atrium which was fixed but still in the process of replacing a small part of the wall that was damaged. Another leak occurred which was totally preventable. In the back closet in the BH there are two enormous units for the A/C. There is also a closet that was being used by the Edge ministry. Someone, wanted to store something in the back wall and stepped on a sensitive pipe that caused \$1200 worth of damage due to the leak penetrating the Women's RR downstairs. PLEASE do not store anything in that room except in the closet. Our A/C guy is writing a report so Msgr. can explain how the damage occurred.
- <u>Cristina:</u> This is the report from <u>Edge/luvenes Credentium High School...</u>Edge and middle school Scripture Study registration opened Monday, August 5th. Registration will be ongoing and can be completed online. The link is on the Holy Trinity website. Payment can be completed online, as well... The Edge & Scripture Study parent meeting is scheduled for Monday, September 9th at 7:00pm in the Faith Formation Gathering Area...Our weekly Edge sessions begin on Monday, September 16th at 7pm in the Faith Formation Gathering Area...Our weekly middle school (Grades 6-8) Scripture Study sessions begin on Thursday, September 19th at 6:30pm in St. Bartholomew, St. Simon and St. Peter rooms... Adoration / Praise & Worship will be on the second Thursday of every month beginning on September 12th at 7:00, in the Sanctuary. This monthly event is led by the Faith Formation/Youth Ministry department. Our youth band leads praise and worship every month and is directed by Mike Sutherland...ICHS Adoration/Praise & Worship is every last Thursday of the month. The next one will be on August 29th...ICHS Spanish youth group will begin on Thursday, September 19th at 7:00pm in St. Elizabeth Ann Seton.
- Kristin: Elementary Faith Formation Registration 2019-2020- Elementary Faith Formation registration forms are available online. Parents can download the forms, print them and bring them into the FF Office to complete registration. Our program is limited to the number of children who can register for each class. Parents must come in to confirm their child's class session...Parents registering children for First Communion must complete TWO Registration Forms: there is one form for Elementary Classes AND a different form for Sacrament Workshops. A BAPTISM CERTIFICATE IS REQUIRED IN ORDER TO REGISTER FOR FIRST COMMUNION....We will be offering an online option for Homeschool Faith Formation again this year, through My Catholic Faith Delivered...To date, we have registered approximately 300 children for elementary Faith Formation...Catechists 2019-2020- We have 63 catechists who have committed their time and talent for the upcoming school year. We still need at least 22 more catechists, in order to have 2 catechists in all our classes. We will be making pulpit announcements in August in order to fill in the remaining openings. We DO NOT have enough catechists for the following classes: Monday @ 4:30 for 4th and 5th Grades; Tuesday @ 5:00 Kindergarten and 5th; Wednesday @ 4:30 for 1st, 3rd, 4th and 5th Grades...We will be offering an online certification program for our catechists who would like to become Level I certified. The Archdiocese of San Antonio has collaborated with My Catholic Faith Delivered to design a certification course specifically for the catechists in San Antonio.
- Renee: Confirmation: Registration has begun for year 1 and 2 Confirmation. Registration can be completed on-line, including payment and that is making it very welcoming to our families. Currently there are 46 students registered. Families seem very excited about the new Confirmation program and the options that will take place for year-2 starting next year. The pulpit announcement by the staff for more catechists was well received. For Confirmation we have 25 catechists returning and 11 new signed up but need 24 more to keep the groups small and personal...Mission Team: Mission team met over the summer for a potluck dinner and discussion. This was very well attended and included those who went to Haiti and Mexico. Discussions are happening about where the next mission will take place and when. We are following up with the communities we served in Mexico to see the fruits of our labors. This mission was built from scratch and very successful with door to door ministry and closing with Holy Hours to end up the mission. The team plans to meet again in October and November to continue formation and planning. This will include door to door ministry during Advent to invite people to Christmas mass. We had over 35 students participate led by 4 young adults from the prayer team...Member from our Young Adult leadership team are planning to attend Encounter Texas next weekend August 16-18th in Grapevine TX. This is put on by Adore Ministries and is our 4th time attending this event...We are currently looking into some young adult bible study options to start in September with the rest of Faith Formation.
- Msgr. Mike: Fr. Philip with the Heralds of Good News is making his annual trip to San Antonio, beginning September 6th to the 16th... He also announced that Msgr Fater's 50th anniversary of ordination to the priesthood takes place in 2020. He will have a celebration on Sunday, June 28th, at the 11"15AM Mass, followed by a reception in the parish hall.



SOCIAL CONCERNS MEETING HIGHLIGHTS

The following are minutes from the SC meeting held on August 17, 2019.

<u>Present:</u>, Rolland Cole, Msgr. Mike Yarbrough, Fr. Daniel Villarreal, Fr. Mike English, Laura Hansbrough, JJ Hansbrough, Debbie Freno, Bob Lorenz, Pam Hughes, John Tracy, Carol Short, Edwin Rocabado, Suzanne Glover, Rita Farmer, <u>Excused:</u> Patrick Fetzer, Kathy Fetzer, Ana Flores, Kay Barrett, <u>Opening Prayer:</u> Led by Bob Lorenz.

- Rita: Here are the results of the 2019 Baby Shower. Guadalupe Home had 9 moms attend. Seton Home had 21 moms attend. Total attendance was 30...Fr. Daniel gave a brief message to our group of moms, guests and Catholic Daughters. He then proceeded to give a blessing to the moms and babies. Fr. Daniel also blessed the rosaries that each mom received. Fr. Mike and Deacon David Seguin were also in attendance for our event. They each visited with the moms and babies during the shower. We had gifts for 44 moms. For those who were not able to attend due to medical problems or other issues, their gifts were sent with the house moms for distribution. All additional clothing items and miscellaneous baby items were divided for the two homes and sent with the house moms for delivery. The directors were given \$1,775 in (\$25 Wal-Mart gift cards). Each of the homes was also given all of the extra food items that were left over from the baby shower. Seton Home and Guadalupe Home directors have been asked to attend the August CDA membership meeting to be presented with a check for the remaining funds that were raised by the parish. Each home will receive half of what is available. Total collected for the event was \$12,998! Thank you HT Parishioners for your generosity!
- <u>Edwin/Suzanne</u>: Recently, following in the footsteps of Bob Lorenz, the clothing and household items donation portion of the St Timothy Ministry was taken over by Edwin Rocabado and Suzanne Glover. We have learned so much from the wonderful and helping people at St Timothy. They have shown us their programs of service and outreach as well as sharing information about the needs of the poor in the parish neighborhood. Following is information about the community served in the surrounding St Timothy Catholic Church.
 - ⇒ Zip Code 78207 (where St Timothy is located) has the <u>fourth LOWEST</u> average annual household income in the city at \$20,117 per year.
 - ⇒ Population in the zip code is approximately **56,000**. The neighborhood consists of modest wood frame homes and is located near the produce terminal area south of downtown San Antonio.
 - ⇒ Zip code 78207 has the highest crime rate in the city.
 - ⇒ Within walking distance of the church are 1000+ low income housing units.
 - ⇒ SAHA (San Antonio Housing Authority) recently announced 325 more units to be built in the immediate area in the next few years.
 - ⇒ Reguests for assistance are increasing.

For several years Holy Trinity has donated used clothing and household items to St Timothy through their St. Vincent de Paul clothes close facility. In a building located on the church grounds, of less than 500 square feet, so much is provided to those in need. Holy Trinity is the largest donor source accounting for about 70% of what is donated. Holy Trinity is vital to the success of the SVDP mission. Recipients "shop" for 2-3 bags worth of clothing. Those in need of food can shop for non-perishables such as cereal, dry beans, rice, spaghetti sauce, "Hamburger Helper"-type products. The Food Bank brings baked goods, bread and vegetables twice a month. Toiletries including tooth brushes, toothpaste, shampoo, bar soap, etc. (all not covered by SNAP) are distributed when available from donations. All recipients must provide identification and such "shopping" events are documented by the SVDP President, Cleo Boyd, (left) in accordance with SVDP policy. St Timothy/SVDVP is also included in Holy Trinity's major donation/drives such as: SCHOOL SUPPLIES — Holy Trinity is the largest non-government donor to the School Supplies Program at St. Timothy which provides backpacks and school supplies to approximately 250 school kids; COATS FOR KIDS — Sponsored by our Knights of Columbus which provided over 400 coats in 2018; THE GIVING TREE — St Timothy is one of several organizations who provide Holy Trinity with names and wish lists of those who need some help with Christmas gifts; ADULT DIAPERS — The cost of Incontinence Briefs is prohibitive (and not covered by SNAP) to those who care for elderly and/or sick family members. A request was made in July in the bulletin for donations of Adult Diapers and the response was enough to handle the need for at least 3 months.

- Pam/John: Our Stephen Ministry at Holy Trinity currently has 19 active ministers who are caring one on one to 21 care receivers. The ministers are available to care for those in our community who have been suffering from a variety of losses including the death of a loved one, marital difficulties, long-term health concerns, and cancer diagnoses for themselves or a loved one, difficulty with children, financial distress / unemployment, and facing end of life issues. They stay with their care receivers for as long as needed, listening, praying and helping them to build up their resilience and trust that God will provide what they need. Once a month we provide continuing education for our Stephen Ministers at our Peer Supervision meeting. In the coming months we will be studying and discussing the set of four Journeying Through Grief booklets from Stephen Ministries. Also, several Stephen Ministers serve in the Nursing Home and Homebound Ministry as well as the Hospital Ministry and we continue our commitment to bring the Eucharist to residents of the Laurels on the first, third and fifth Sundays of the month. In addition, our leaders network with other Stephen Ministry congregations in the San Antonio area, meeting quarterly with the other churches to discuss ways to improve our own church's ministry and to suggest ideas to others that have worked for us. One of the valuable resources that were highlighted during our last meeting is the San Antonio Community Resource Directory at www.sacrd.org. This website allows you to search by zip code for specific resources for a wide variety of needs offered by congregations, nonprofits, government agencies and compassionate groups in and around San Antonio. We wish to thank the parish by supporting Stephen Ministry with your prayers and that you consider reaching out when in need.
- Bob: Our annual collection for Coats for Kids and Adults begins on Saturday, October 5 and runs to October 20, 2019. This three weekend event collects these coats for our sister parish, St. Timothy Catholic Church. St. Timothy's St. Vincent DePaul distributes these coats to children and adults living in the poorest area of San Antonio. Knights will be available to assist our parish members bringing donations or having questions before and after all Masses on October 5 and 6, 12 and 13, and 19 and 20. Checks and cash donations received will be used to buy new jackets and coats for kids. Make checks payable to Knights of Columbus Assembly 3191. A special thanks to our parish members who have donated to this event over the years. You are helping those in need and St. Timothy Catholic Church grows in registered families. Your acts of kindness give these children and families hope for their future and faith.
- Carol: Prayer Shawl Ministry: We continue to meet on the first Tuesday of the month at 2:00. The month of July we have not been meeting because of the July 4th holiday and family vacations. There were 12 shawls gifted in April; there were 19 in May and 8 in June and 8 in July. We are considering offering shawls to children in the hospitals in the Stone Oak area to see if the staff feels it is a need. Small shawls that are turned in and not really large enough for adults have been well received by the pediatric ward at North Central Baptist Hospital. Hal Buntley is currently creating wooden comfort crosses and has gifted the Prayer Shawl Ministry with 40 crossed to give with the prayer shawls, rosaries, and Lady Undoer of Knots booklets...Meals on Wheels: Recently, the Holy Trinity route has increased to 9 clients. Meals are picked up at Abiding Presence Lutheran Church on San Pedro and delivered to the neighborhoods on either side of 281, north of Marshall Road. Substitutes are sometimes needed so please consider making a commitment to be a regular driver or a substitute. Meals on Wheels vehicles were used to deliver fans and air conditioners to the elderly during this summer heat. Alzheimer's or Memory Care at the Havens: Recently Patricia Waisley stepped down from the leadership position and Janelle Poe accepted this role. They continue to support the residence, but recently expanded their support to give a Baby Shower for the activity director. They involved the residence in the unwrapping of the gift to give to the prospective mother. Supporting the activities of the residence and offering the Eucharist to the Catholic residents each Thursday from 9:30 11:30 continues to be their commitment.

- JJ/Laura: CAM- The quarterly CAM Membership Council meeting is on August 19th which we will attend. The annual CAM school backpack drive finished last week. CAM provided backpacks, school supplies, uniforms, underwear, socks and shoes for children in need. Since our Parish has several backpack drives ongoing, we didn't ask for additional contributions to CAM. The annual CAM Gala "Feast to Feed" is October 10th. Thank you Msgr. Mike for purchasing a table for this fundraising event. The table will be filled with Holy Trinity parishioners who volunteer at CAM on a weekly basis or helped with the food drive... CATHOLIC CHARITIES: Weekly announcements continue in the Parish bulletin (when space is available) concerning a variety of volunteer opportunities available with Catholic Charities. There are points of contact at Catholic Charities for any parishioners who are interested in sharing their time and talents. There is a need for Spanish speakers to help with all the refugees.
- Kay: (Due to traffic congestion she missed the meeting but had sent her report ahead of time to Msgr. Mike) This Ministry for Widows continues to thrive. The current group of members is the most active participants to date. Many friendships have developed, especially with the members who have moved to the vicinity from other states. This quarter we have had three women join the Parish just to be able to meet new friends and be able to share in our planned activities. During the month of July, we held a Summer Book Club. The response was very positive. The book featured was Joan Chittister's "Gift of Years" along with her Video series called "The Blessing of Aging". There are plans to add a Book Club as an activity again next summer. This was a good time of year to gain access to a daytime class room for five weekly meetings...There remains one area of concern that prevents continuity of new members. That is the fact that my bulletin announcement disappears for long periods of time. When asked about it, she was told that there is not space for my announcement. It was pointed out that several other ministries take large portions of space every week. What about limiting the size of announcement and share the bulletin space fairly. When the Ministry announcement disappears, so do the inquiries.

Reflection ~ A Relationship

I have a Catholic prayer book that is over one hundred pages long. In this book there is every imaginable prayer. Prayers you would expect, like prayers for healing, but also some you would not, like prayers for safety during bad weather. Catholics never seem to be at a loss for ready-made prayers. It is not uncommon to think that reciting these types of prayers is what praying is all about. Yet, prayer is so much more.

The focus of prayer is to talk to Christ and to allow Him to guide you. Successful prayer is any activity that helps you be more sensitized to what Christ wants you to know, and your open response back to Him letting Him know your deepest needs, fears, and dreams. The result is a relationship with Christ that forms a deep trust. Have you ever reflected on how many times in the Bible we hear of God's listening? In Exodus 2:24 we read how "God heard their groaning and he remembered his covenant with Abraham, with

Isaac and with Jacob." Through his prophet Isaiah God said, "Before they call I will answer; while they are still speaking I will hear." (Isaiah 65:24) And we see too how Jesus called upon His Father, thanking Him, asking Him to heal, to have mercy, to take away this cross, and then placing it all in His Father's hands.

But perhaps, though it may not seem like much, all we are called to do at the moment is to "be quick to listen, slow to speak" (James 1:19a). 

Marriage Enrichment

Compromise or Sacrifice? (by servantspouse.com)

Isn't compromise a good thing in a marriage? From our point of view compromise is only effective some of the time and can be very dangerous.

Compromise requires a negotiation and someone ultimately loses. Either one spouse wins while the other loses or a third solution is selected where neither spouse wins or loses. This approach to solving problems results in a serious problem of keeping score and ignoring the true needs of our spouse.

The solution = Sacrifice!

Sacrifice requires that we model Jesus in the treatment of our spouse; that we focus on how we can serve our spouse instead of "win" an argument or decision. This requires that we die of ourselves and put aside our needs and first fulfill our spouse's needs. This week, make a conscious effort to ask yourself "How can I sacrifice for my spouse today?"

CCC 1615 This unequivocal insistence on the indissolubility of the marriage bond may have left some perplexed and could seem to be a demand impossible to realize. However, Jesus has not placed on spouses a burden impossible to bear, or too heavy - heavier than the Law of Moses. By coming to restore the original order of creation disturbed by sin, he himself gives the strength and grace to live marriage in the new dimension of the Reign of

God. It is by following Christ, renouncing themselves, and taking up their crosses that spouses will be able to "receive" the original meaning of marriage and live it with the help of Christ. This grace of Christian marriage is a fruit of Christ's cross, the source of all Christian life.

Scripture: Mark 8:34 He summoned the crowd with his disciples and said to them, "Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me."
