#### From Our Pastor...

Brothers and Sisters-

The Gospel today begins by telling us that Jesus addressed this parable to those who were "convinced of their own righteousness" and "despised everyone else".

In life, it can be very easy to develop a very high opinion of oneself. From the time that we were all kids, we all loved having that 'positive reinforcement' for everything that we did. At my childhood home, our fireplace mantle was always packed with sports trophies, medals, and certificates which were constant reminders of how great us kids were. Once we become adults, I think that external 'positive reinforcement' becomes more rare...but it is still easy to become self centered and think that the world revolves around us and only us. Sometimes we become blind to those around us, as we are so absorbed in our own world.

In this parable today, Jesus is illustrating for us how dangerous this 'self-centered' nature can be. Yes, we are all special and created in God's image and likeness...but we are NOT the CREATOR. As God's children we all are striving to be be Saints and striving for 'goodness'; but I hope we can all admit that there are certainly times that we fall short. The reality is, however, is that it is not easy to truly take a critical view of ourselves...we want everyone on the outside to know how perfect and good we are. Day after day we try to convince ourselves that we are not the problem...everyone else is!

When we take a look at scripture, we notice that a constant theme in our faith is 'humility'. Jesus humbled Himself by accepting death on a cross (Philippians 2:8)...and in today's Gospel,

"But the tax collector stood off at a distance and would not even raise his eyes to heaven but beat his breast and prayed, 'O God, be merciful to me a sinner.'"

When we come to terms with our own weakness and humanity, how much easier is it for us to see the other. We realize that we are all part of one family, encouraging one another to become more holy, more caring, and more loving. We are all part of the created human family working together in love and peace to give all glory to God.

#### **Operation Care for Troops - Stockings for Troops Drive**

#### Filled Stockings must be returned to St. Mark's by Monday, November 7



If you wish to help with the Holiday Stockings for the troops, there are several ways:

- 1. Fill one or more stockings (see the directions below)
- 2. Donate items used to fill the stockings and/or requested items below. Do not add any extra requested items to the stockings! OCT wants all stockings to contain listed items only!
- 3. Write cards/letters to the troops. Drawings from younger family members are great too.
- 4. Knit scarves 4" by 36" for the troops. All colors are fine. However, lighter colors are not as easy to keep clean - navy, dark greens, browns, dark blues, etc. Please include instructions for washing! We need about 1200-1500 scarves!
- 5. Donations to help defray shipping costs. Each package costs \$20 to ship! Please use envelope marked 'Donation Stockings for Troops'

## To Fill a Stocking: Place into the stocking in the order below from toe to top:

- Small can of baked beans OR Small flip top canned fruit OR chicken Vienna sausages
- Socks 1 pair white sox a good pair makes a difference
- Gum 1 or 2 packs (placed in snack zip lock or rest of items will have a "gum" taste)
- Individual pack of tissues 1 or 2
- Individual Drink mix 5 minimum; (Energy or hydration, if possible) remove from box & place in snack size zip lock.
- Protein Bars/granola bars 3 (in a sandwich Ziplock (requested are bars with high protein)...2 bars are better than 3 with low protein!
- 2 individual packages hot cocoa/ 2 individual packages oatmeal (all in a sandwich zip lock) OR some other breakfast item (that only takes hot water to complete) in a sandwich ziplock.
- Dental kit toothbrush, travel size paste, floss &/or lip balm without petroleum; all in a Quart-size ziplock.
- Ramen Noodles package cups are too big!!
- Trail Mix, Dried Cranberries or similiar items.....Individual size 1 to 2
- Fun Item beach ball; stress ball, one game or other item such as card game; dice game; small notebook & pen; small ball; nail clippers; nail file.
- Most importantly, write an encouraging card or short letter of cheer to the happy service person who's going to get this stocking. It's especially tough for them to be away from family and friends during the Holiday season. Put this in your stocking with all the goodies!!
- Please put your **filled stocking in** the plastic bag provided. Close plastic bag with string or a twister seal.

Other requested Items: Do Not put these items in stocking

Lotion with Aloe Vera Medicated Body Powder i.e., Gold Bond Foot Powder i.e., Gold Bond, Dr. Scholl's, Odor Eaters) Trail Mix/granola - small packages (no more than 5 to 6oz) Sunflower seeds - small packages
