From the Desk of Deacon Tom...

"Why can't we all just get along?" Ever hear that phrase? Well, when I hear it, or use it, I think "we could all get along, if everyone would just behave as I expect them to, and do what I expect of them."

One of the most overused adjectives at work that I hear these days is "frustrated". It's become one of those "safe words" in the business world that lets you vent your feelings without risk of repercussion. Some of the jobs I've had in my past taught me well about "wordsmithing". Wordsmithing is using the correct word or phrase in a situation so as not to overly excite others. I've gotten so good at it, our VP sends me most of his emails for wordsmithing before we send them to others.

St Paul is no wordsmither (if that's a word). He speaks his mind in many of his letters and we get a full range of emotions from him – joy, anger and admonishment are the first ones that come to mind for me. We don't always get a taste of these in the readings from St Paul at Mass. They usually speak of some type of harmony or hope, just like this weekend. Almost like it's always kumbaya in his communities. It's far from it. If you've never read one of his letters, just go online to USCCB.org and pick a short one, read the intro for some background and then enjoy the rant he might give a community.

I think sometimes we romanticize the early Christian community. And maybe rightly so, because they attracted people to the community in many cases simply because people witnessed the joy within the community and wanted a piece of that joy. It's one of the things that I think excites me about the RCIA process of people wanting to become Catholic. Even in this day and age, there continue to be people among us who want to share in what we have in our faith. But there are also plenty of disagreements that happen along the way in the early Christian Church, just like today. After all, they need to wrestle with, and figure out, what all of Jesus' words and deeds meant and how they were supposed to live out his command to "teach them to observe all that I have commanded you." (Matthew 28:20)

So even though we might think everything went swimmingly in the early Church, there was plenty of frustration! Today's letter from St Paul is one of those "why can't we all get along" letters. So how are we supposed to do that? Well, it won't be how I opened – by everyone behaving and doing what I expect of them. St Paul says it will be by endurance ("let it go") and encouragement of the Scriptures (faith). If we remember those two instructions, we'll have a lot less frustration in our lives. Since it's Advent, everyone typically is a little nicer to each other during this season. May that behavior endure beyond Advent. And if you find yourself frustrated, look for encouragement in the Scriptures!
