*From Our Youth Minister...*

**“...hope does not disappoint...”  
- Romans 5:5**

We have all experienced some level of disappointment the past couple of years. I know for myself, I was working in Massachusetts and I was getting ready to lead a couple of trips that year for my students: a mission trip to Haiti, to Peru, and a pilgrimage to Greece. And right as we were in the process of packing up donations to bring to the poorest of the poor, the pandemic hit and trips were canceled. Many of my students were so sad and so disappointed because they were so excited to go serve. Some of them even started to learn a little bit of Haitian Creole in preparation for the trip. Disappointment is normal.

The experience of disappointment is not abnormal. To be saddened to miss out on what you longed for is not “unChristian”. As Catholics, when we lose someone we can grieve. When we lose opportunities we can grieve. But as Saint Paul says, we don’t grieve like the rest but the depth of our grief, sadness and loss reveals where we have placed our hope. This is what the pandemic revealed about my heart and about my “idols”. My hope was in all the wrong places. These “idols”, although good causes, were competing with my relationship with Jesus.

Our relationship with Jesus is exclusive. He is either the center of our lives or He is not really in our lives. He is either everything in our lives or He is essentially nothing in our lives. He is not one among many. Our relationship with Jesus doesn’t tolerate any rivals. Preparing for these trips, I found myself doing less praying and more logistics. Of course, logistics are important and absolutely necessary but my relationship with Jesus needed to come first. When my expectation of the trip didn’t come true and because it was my main focus, the depth of my disappointment revealed that this trip was an idol in my heart.

Jesus is our hope. He is the one who doesn’t disappoint. Helping the poor, instructing and guiding those entrusted to us, and serving those right in our own community is the command of Jesus...but not outside of relationship with Him. We need to spend time with Him daily. We need to get into the Word of God, the Bible. Reading His word trains our hearts to recognize His voice. Volunteering in our parish will give you vocabulary to express your faith and experience in sharing it. We are looking ahead to a new model of engaging faith formation with Amanda next year. But we can’t do it without committed volunteers. We need help leading our young people into a deeper knowledge and love of Jesus. Our students need our help putting Jesus in the center of their lives. They need to see hope lived out because we can all attest to the fact that there are plenty of disappointments in life.

But the reality is, if we do not pray, we will fail. We all need Jesus. Our hope is in Him and that hope does not disappoint. We serve a God who keeps His promises. Will you join us on this crazy journey? Will you walk with us as we seek to deepen our own relationship with God so that we can lead others closer to Him?
