From Our Parish Evangelist...

Turn to your neighbor and ask, "Tell me something that Jesus said." After a blank expression of being caught off guard, you may hear the response, "Do unto others as you would have them do unto you" (Mt 7:12) or "Judge not, lest you be judged" (Mt 7:1). Maybe "Let he who is without sin cast the first stone" (Jn 8:7), or my favorite "Have you anything here to eat?" (Lk 24:41). Of course, a popular answer may be one that we encounter this weekend in St. John's Gospel, "I am the way and the truth and the life. No one comes to the Father except through me."

Jesus Christ is the Way because through Him humanity has access to the Father. He is the Truth because He is the Incarnate Word come down from Heaven. He is the Life because *only He* has come down from Heaven and *only He* can elevate humanity to share in divine communion. St. Paul wrote: "For there is one God; there is also one mediator between God and humankind, Jesus Christ" (1Tm 2:5). St. Peter proclaimed: "There is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under Heaven given among mortals by which we must be saved" (Acts 4:12)

You may at some point have thought about this and asked yourself, "Well... what about everybody else? Are they just up the creek"? In fact, this may be one of the most common questions I've been asked in my years of teaching the Faith. What about someone who couldn't tell you anything Jesus ever said? What if they never even heard of Jesus? How about other religions, or those with no faith at all?

The answer lies in this same proclamation of our Lord that seems so apparently exclusive. It *is* a fact that no one has access to God except through Christ - but pay close attention to how Jesus identifies Himself: I am the *Truth*. He is the embodiment of *all* that is true and good - He *is* God, after all. So in a certain way, whenever we as human beings come to the realization and understanding of what is true, that truth necessarily participates in the ultimate Truth, which is Jesus Christ, the Eternal Word.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church puts it this way: Man tends by nature toward the truth. He is obliged to honor and bear witness to it: "It is in accordance with their dignity that all men... are both impelled by their nature and bound by a moral obligation to seek the truth, especially religious truth. They are also bound to adhere to the truth once they come to know it and direct their whole lives in accordance with the demands of truth" (CCC 2467).

The Catholic Church recognizes in other religions that search, among shadows and images, for the God who is unknown yet near since he gives life and breath and all things and wants all men to be saved. Thus, the Church considers all goodness and truth found in these religions as "a preparation for the Gospel and given by him who enlightens all men that they may at length have life" (CCC 843).

Those who, through no fault of their own, do not know the Gospel of Christ or his Church, but who nevertheless seek God with a sincere heart, and, moved by grace, try in their actions to do his will as they know it through the dictates of their conscience—those too may achieve eternal salvation (CCC 847).

None of this is to say that all religious beliefs (or lack thereof) are "equal" - otherwise what difference would it make to be Catholic, or even Christian? Rather, we who have heard the Gospel proclaimed and have been graced with the outpouring of the Holy Spirit in the Sacraments have received the *fullness of the means of salvation* (CCC 830). The social duty of Christians is to respect and awaken in each man the love of the true and the good. It requires them to make known the worship of the one true religion which subsists in the Catholic and apostolic Church. (CCC 2105)

St. John begins his Gospel with the declaration that *in Him was life, and the life was the light of all people* (Jn 1:4). The light of the world is Truth. Truth can be known - it is Love, Goodness, Virtue. Wherever in the world mankind finds Truth, we find Christ. As Christians we are privileged with the grace and responsibility of the fullness of the Truth, but it is also our duty to recognize and build upon the glimmers of that Truth wherever we encounter it. After all, *in my Father's house there are many mansions... Where I am going you know the way.*
