From the Desk of Deacon Tom...

I really like the Acts of the Apostles readings we get throughout the Easter season. Maybe it's because last week's First Reading was the selection of the first Deacons. We're likely all familiar with Stephen, as he was the first martyr of the Church after the resurrection of Jesus. So the first to sacrifice his or her life for the faith was a Deacon. That's the reason the Deacon is considered the Minister of the Cup at Mass – because a Deacon was the first to shed his blood for the church. If I was smart in my scheduling, I would have chosen last weekend to preach. I've never given the Homily on a weekend with that reading from last week, so I've never considered what I'd say about the first Deacons and my connection to them. I guess there's always next year.

You may not remember the names of the other Deacons though, since it was last week's reading. I couldn't tell you the others either without looking them up. There were seven in total – Stephen, Prochurus, Nicanur, Timon (but not Pumbaa), Parmenas, Nicholas of Antioch and....Philip.

Philip is the subject of our First Reading today. As I've said before, there are always new things to discover in scripture, no matter how many times we've read or heard the story. I never paid close enough attention before this weekend to connect that Philip was a Deacon. And where did he go? Samaria! I think I wrote a few months ago about the Good Samaritan. Samaritans weren't generally considered Good, so that one good one had that adjective tacked on to his lineage to differentiate him from other Samaritans. Recall he's the one that helped the man beaten by robbers after several other folks passed him by.

So who do they send into the land of the non-good people of Samaria? The Deacon! Can you picture the Apostles? "I'm not going there...Thomas why don't you go...I've got a better idea! Let's send one of the Deacons!"

So Philip moseyed on into Samaria and told them all about Jesus. The wording makes it sound like he didn't force anything on them. He simply told them about Jesus and what had happened in Jerusalem. And then he went to work – driving demons out of those possessed and curing the handicapped. Only then, when word got back to the Apostles that it was going pretty well for Philip, Peter and John went down. Because the Deacon could only baptize the Samarians, Peter and John came to confirm them.

Maybe I've romanticized Philip in this story, but I couldn't help notice how this came across when I read it. They were "all of one accord" and the Apostles couldn't be everywhere. The same is true for our Church today. It's not just our Bishops, Priests and Deacons that are responsible for handing on the faith. We all share the responsibility to proclaim the risen Jesus to those we encounter to the best of our ability, whether it's through our words or the way we live our life


New Hampshire Catholic Appeal
