From Our Parish Evangelist

"You can choose your friends, but you can't choose your family": A familiar cliché most of us have heard or repeated at some point in our lives, usually when a family member is working on our last nerve. Family is one of the most fascinating dichotomies in the human experience. On the one hand, our families can be the source of the most profound love, compassion, and fulfillment. On the other, our families could bring us the most profound sorrow, betrayal, and disappointment. It's just the nature of being related by such intimate biological and emotional bonds. So with that in mind, this weekend's Gospel is likely to touch each of our minds and hearts in a wide variety of ways: Whoever loves father or mother more than me is not worthy of me, and whoever loves son or daughter more than me is not worthy of me; and whoever does not take up his cross and follow after me is not worthy of me. Whoever finds his life will lose it, and whoever loses his life for my sake will find it.

This passage, and it's parallel teachings in other Gospels, are what I call 'squirmy verses.' When they are proclaimed, one can observe a bit of uneasy squirming in the seats. Luke's version is even more squirm-worthy: Whoever comes to me and does not hate father and mother, wife and children, brothers and sisters, yes, and even life itself, cannot be my disciple (Lk 14:26).

This is bold and demanding language. It seems unnatural. And that's the point. Christian discipleship is bold and demanding - it can only be achieved with supernatural assistance. Jesus is not contradicting the Fourth Commandment of loving one's father and mother. In fact, he isn't asking to us think or do anything different from His own example: *My mother and my brothers are those who hear the word of God and do it* (Lk 8:19). We are commanded to love our families, our friends, neighbors, even our enemies! But those commands are dependent on the foundation: "*Teacher, which commandment in the law is the greatest?*" He said to him, "'You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind.' This is the greatest and first commandment. And a second is like it: 'You shall love your neighbor as yourself.' Jesus continually teaches that we need to have our priorities straight.

The hallmark of true discipleship is loyalty to Christ even before one's own family. Beyond that, we need to love Him more than our very own lives - or we aren't even *worthy* of Him! To take up our cross is to follow Jesus even to His humiliation and death. It can be easy for all of us to find some hyperbole in this - can we really be expected to love an invisible, supernatural God-man from 2000 years ago over our own children? Our spouses? Our parents? Our own well-being?

Yes. That is what He expects. Because He is not our imaginary friend. He is the *Truth*. He is *Goodness*. He is *Life*. If we don't love Truth, Goodness, and Life as first priority, than how can we love anything else? Are we willing to compromise on what is right and wrong with those closest to us? Perhaps sometimes we are. And that is what our Lord means when He says we must love Him more than we love father or mother or son or daughter - because if we turn away from Truth for their sake (because they don't want to hear it) - or if we compromise on what's right and wrong (because we 'don't want the drama') - if we are held back from full reception of the Gospel (because it is rejected by those closest to us) - then Jesus is very clear: we're not worthy.

Let not our hearts be troubled. The Father of Mercies knows well the struggles we may have with our closest relations, and He knows all our own failures and challenges (even better than we know them ourselves!). But He still expects us to be intentional in our boldness for what's right - even when it may cause arguments, rifts, and challenges within our families. If we keep our priorities in order - with the Eternal Truth as the unshakeable foundation of our lives - then Whoever receives you receives me, and whoever receives me receives the one who sent me.
