From Our Parish Evangelist

I see the Rock everywhere. I saw him the other day on the wall at the Under Armour outlet. He was at the liquor store last week selling his tequila. He's in those movies about street racing - and that other one where the board game comes to life, or something. I've seen the Rock most of my adult life. He used to wrestle with other guys on the T.V. back in the nineties. I think I've heard that he is the highest paid actor in Hollywood these days. He's one of the most famous and influential people on Earth. I think his real name is Dwayne. But everyone calls him the Rock.

You know, there's another Rock I see everywhere. A couple of weeks ago I saw him speaking to hundreds of thousands of young people in Lisbon, Portugal. A few months ago he was washing the feet of a dozen prisoners in juvenile detention. A few years back, he visited New York and Washington where he met with President Bush (the second one). I've seen the Rock my whole life. When I was little, he got shot and almost died. When he got out of the hospital, he went straight to the prison where he met his would-be-assassin and forgave him. The Rock has been around since before I was born. Before you were born, too. At the beginning of the 20th century he encouraged active participation of the faithful at Mass and allowed children to receive Holy Communion. Before that he was calling for social justice and human rights in the midst of the Industrial Revolution. A thousand years before that he was forging treaties with barbarians that led to the flourishing of Western Civilization and culture. And even centuries before that, he was leading a small band of fishermen and nobody's through the streets of Jerusalem, preaching a new religion that would forever change the world.

He's one of the most famous and influential people on Earth. Ever. I think his real name is Francis, or Benedict, or John Paul. Or is his name Pius, or Leo, or Gregory? Actually, I'm pretty sure it's Peter...

But Jesus calls him the Rock.
