From Our Pastor

Brothers and Sisters-

You duped me, O LORD, and I let myself be duped; you were too strong for me, and you triumphed.

All the day I am an object of laughter; everyone mocks me.

When someone enters into the seminary to continue to discern God's call to the priesthood, this is usually a DRASTIC change to the 'normal' life they were living beforehand. In my own case, I had to resign from my full-time job (which by the way was a good job)...I had to stop pursuing my Masters Degree (as I was attending Bentley University)...and my Seminary studies uprooted me from the state of New Hampshire and all the friends I had here, and I went to seminary school in Baltimore, where I had never even been before, and knew nobody!

Upon entering Seminary, this first reading from Job comes up pretty quickly in the reading cycle at Mass...and I remember sitting in the Chapel feeling the same way Job did! I had gone through seminary orientation and classes were just beginning...and the glamour of this new life and calling was wearing off a bit...and reality was setting in! Did I really give up everything that I had for THIS? I have to study and write papers...my tiny room had no air conditioning!... I was confined to one building for classes, the cafeteria, the chapel....and to sleep....would I ever see the beauty of nature and enjoy being outside ever again? "You duped me, Lord!"

Yes, these are jitters that we can all experience in our life when the rubber hits the road and we begin following God in some uncomfortable ways. In our Gospel, Jesus gives the consolation that ALL OF US need to hear...

"Whoever wishes to come after me must deny himself, take up his cross, and follow me.

For whoever wishes to save his life will lose it, but whoever loses his life for my sake will find it.

What profit would there be for one to gain the whole world and forfeit his life?

Through all the confusion and struggles of our own crosses, may we truly trust that following HIS will is always worth it...'whoever loses his life for my sake will find it'!
