From Amanda's Desk

I LOVE the readings this week because they both challenge us and give opportunity to talk about what forgiveness truly is. Despite loving the readings, this week they are HARD - talking about forgiveness isn't comfortable, especially when the readings lay it out as bluntly as they do this week.

- "Remember your last days and set enmity aside."
- "Should you not have had pity on your fellow servant, as I had pity on you?"
- "So will my heavenly Father do to you, unless each of you forgives your brother from your heart."

Forgive or be handed over to the torturers... Eek.

While true, forgiveness is required of us as Catholic Christians, our definition of forgiveness is often cross-pollenated with reconciliation and restoration. Don't get me wrong, forgiveness is still REALLY HARD, but becomes more manageable when we can define these three words independently and contextually.

Let's start with what forgiveness DOESN'T mean. Forgiving isn't forgetting. It isn't giving justification or excuses for the one who hurt us. We don't need to resolve to passively turn every cheek as we allow ourselves to reenter emotionally, physically or spiritually compromising situations. God loves us and wants us to love ourselves, live healthy lives and love one another. How then do we approach forgiveness with those who have DEEPLY crossed a line?

The Gospel today deals with debt, and the repayment of debt. The "debt" or "offense" is a HUGE amount that the servant had no way of paying back and the master released him. The releasing of the servant from what was "owed" is the model of forgiveness we are to follow. The master didn't wish ill-will on the servant. He didn't require the servant to pay a "minimum payment" or money or service for the rest of his life. The master released him out of compassion the same way Jesus released us of our sins when he died on the cross. This is forgiveness and what we are called to do, to release one another and not seek repayment, revenge or ill-happenings against our human brothers and sisters.





While being crucified, Jesus prays to God the Father. these amazing PERFECT words of love and compassion. Luke 23:34

Reconciliation = Relationship. Restoration = Return of trust / what was lost when we were wronged. Neither one of these is necessarily required of what we are called to do when we observe our Christian duty of forgiveness. What IS required is that we ACTIVELY release those who have wronged us. Forgiveness isn't a "one and done" event. We will grieve and process situations/wrong-doings in a variety of ways. We need to CONTINUALLY remind ourselves to RELEASE "those who have trespassed against us."

Along with a cartoon, I've included a QR code to a video which does a pretty good job of tackling forgiveness in about 8 minutes. Open your phone's camera, point it at the square picture, click on the link that comes up and give it a listen!



We aren't emotional magicians that can instantly turn back the clock of other people's actions towards us, but we can keep trying to follow today's Gospel and release (without conditions) the one who has taken from us.
