From Our Pastor,

Brothers and Sisters-

"If you wish, you can make me clean."

Moved with pity, he stretched out his hand, touched him, and said to him,
"I do will it. Be made clean." The leprosy left him immediately, and he was made clean.

The man went away and began to publicize the whole matter.

He spread the report abroad
so that it was impossible for Jesus to enter a town openly.

He remained outside in deserted places,
and people kept coming to him from everywhere."- Mark 1: 40-42, 45

I am sure that each one of us has heard this Gospel story before. In past weeks, we have been hearing about Jesus driving out demons, and now see Jesus healing the sick; even those with the most awful diseases. We can imagine how word of Him must have spread! People came from all over to see this 'wonder worker', this man who has this ability to do miraculous things! These people more than likely wanted to see Him do it again and again and witness it for themselves!! Jesus, however, was not a traveling circus act, where the people could just be amazed at his power: he wanted to take them a bit deeper! Through these signs and wonders, Jesus' longs to show the people the reality of the Kingdom of God!

In light of this Gospel, we can look at the current state of the Church here in America. Are people flocking to Church because of the promise of eternity to come? Are people flocking to Churches because we have the incredible opportunity each and every week to receive Jesus Christ Himself in His very gift of the Eucharist (the most intimate and special gift we could ever receive here on earth)? Are people flocking to Churches to continually hear His word week after week to be nourished and inspired to live in the ways of holiness and of truth?

Unfortunately, we do not see people flocking to Churches... we are more likely to see them flocking to the store to pick up the newest model of phone....or to a music venue to see their favorite artist...or dressing up in their team's jersey to wave their foam finger in the arena as the biggest fan! We see so much excitement around this type of 'entertainment'...but not the only thing in this world that truly is 'everlasting'.

May our enthusiasm and joy for our belief in our Savior and our Church continually increase, and become contagious...showing all the wonders that the Lord is doing for us now, and the promise of eternal life for all who are believers...giving their entire lives for His name and His glory!
