From Amanda's Desk,

It is with profound joy and thanks to Almighty God that our St. Mark's family is blessed to be accompanying two of our friends on their journey to the reception of Sacraments this coming Easter. Witnessing members of our community encounter Christ through His sanctifying grace is an awesome privilege, not to mention one of our primary duties as disciples. As we all share in this experience together this Lenten season, we also hear a specific sequence of readings that correlate to the great mystery of the Sacraments. This weekend, our Elect will celebrate the second of three Scrutinies, and the Scripture passages are powerful depictions of the hidden transformation God accomplishes in the Elect through each Scrutiny.

Our opening reading from the first Book of Samuel is the telling of David's selection and anointing by the prophet, divinely coronating him as the king of Israel. Of the eight sons of Jesse, David is the youngest. The older, presumably more experienced brothers are passed over. God instructs Samuel not to judge from appearance or stature, in the way the people chose their current corrupt king, Saul. Rather, Samuel is instructed to judge as God does, through the merit of David's heart - the hidden core where his thoughts, actions, and intentions originate. David, the youngest brother, is summoned from the flock he is shepherding, and anointed with oil as the new, rightful ruler of the kingdom. ...and from that day on, the spirit of the LORD rushed upon David.

The imagery of David's anointing is a powerful anticipation of the Sacraments of Initiation. The Sacraments are efficacious signs of invisible realities. They are where Heaven and Earth touch. Through the merits of Christ's Paschal Mystery and the power of the Holy Spirit, the Elect are anointed priests, prophets, and kings. Washed free of sin in Baptism, anointed with the Spirit in Confirmation, and united with the Real Presence of Christ in the Eucharist, we are each called to sanctify, to teach, and to govern.

This is the enigmatic reality that our two Elect will receive at the Easter Vigil. Like David, the Lord has not selected them on account of their appearance or prestige. They are conforming their hearts to Christ - they are willing to accept and live the Gospel according to God's will, not to theirs. Like David, they are shepherds of their flock - each of them leading and teaching their young families in the ways of virtue, humility, and faith. Like David, God has elected them not for their many accomplishments and successes, but to elevate them for the accomplishment of His purposes. Like David, their heads will be anointed with oil, and from that day forward, the Spirit of the Lord will rush upon them.

As we continue to pray for our two Elect as they continue to discern the Lord's desire for their lives - let us also reflect on our responsibilities as priests, prophets, and kings in God's Kingdom here on earth. May our privilege to be counted among His elect be evident in our thoughts, words, and deeds. Like David, let us rejoice that the Lord has spoken of us, *There, anoint him, for this is the one!*
