From Our Pastor,

Brothers and Sisters-

"The hour has come for the Son of Man to be glorified.

Amen, amen, I say to you,
unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies,
it remains just a grain of wheat;
but if it dies, it produces much fruit.

Whoever loves his life loses it,
and whoever hates his life in this world
will preserve it for eternal life.
Whoever serves me must follow me,
and where I am, there also will my servant be.
The Father will honor whoever serves me.- John 12: 24-26

Years ago, while I was actively discerning my call to the priesthood, this Gospel passage echoed over and over in my heart. The Gospel of Matthew also has a similar passage, which reads "whoever loses his life for my sake, will find it"...

Often when I get into a conversation with someone about the priesthood, they typically ask me why I would ever even consider the vocation. I feel when it comes to the priesthood, most people are surprised when I say (or any other priest would say) that 'they have been called by God'. Many expect that it was somehow just a logical decision in our lives, and that we have always been on the path towards the priesthood from a very young age. I can personally attest that this is certainly not the case for most of us!! Maybe there is an uncomfortable nature about admitting that the call didn't come from ourselves and our own plan...or even from encouragement of family members; but believing full-heartedly that this was all by God's design and will.

This Gospel passage strikes so true to anyone who truly desires the will of God because he sees beyond our own personal aspirations and sometimes truly out of our comfort zone. Can we allow ourselves to even entertain the fact that God might be 'calling' you to BE more...to GIVE more...to LOVE more.

It is so easy in life to live according to 'MY' own plan, and stay in our routine and 'safe' way of living. Can we stretch our minds and hearts to see His guiding hand in our lives. He never wants us to stay stagnant; but always striving to align our own will with 'His Will'.

May we continue our Lenten journey with this selfless spirit of discernment of how He continues to call us closer to Himself.
