From Our Youth Ministers,

Have you ever been rushing out of the house in the morning, running late, bags in one hand, coffee and lunch boxes in the other. Then, panic.... you realize that you cannot find your keys. You have no idea where they are or where you last put them. You are now searching everywhere, opening drawers, emptying pockets and unzipping pouches frantically looking for your keys.... Only to discover they were in your jacket pocket ... right under your nose the entire time? Yep, this has happened to me more times than I would like to admit. So, I can really relate to the disciples in Luke's Gospel today. Jesus was right under their noses and they had no idea.

The disciples were downcast, and disappointed leaving Jerusalem. Cleopas and his companion had watched Jesus die, and ran to the tomb after hearing from the women that Jesus was alive. Hopeful and full of excitement, they ran only to see an empty tomb. They did not see Jesus. Hopeless and disheartened, they left Jerusalem because what they had hoped for and prayed for did not seem to be true.

Maybe you have felt like the disciples, disappointed or even frustrated because something you have prayed for, something that you have hoped for and desperately wanted or needed did not happen. How often have we walked in the wrong direction, making choices that lead us further away from Jesus?

As they travel together, Jesus teaches the disciples that their temporary suffering, hardships, and earthly trials are not pointless, but rather necessary, transformative steps leading to future, eternal glory. Take notice that Jesus doesn't admonish the disciples for leaving; he meets them where they were, he walks alongside them in the wrong direction. He does the same for us. When we are disappointed, hopeless or hurting, we may be walking further away from where Jesus wants us to be. But, he is always alongside us. Jesus meets us where we are, not just in our certainty but in our doubts and hopelessness.

Cleopas and his friend urge Jesus to stay with them. Jesus reveals himself to them as he broke the bread and said the blessing. Their "eyes were opened and they recognized him." Finally, recognizing that their hearts were burning within them the whole time Jesus had spoken to them." There is such a significance in the disciples inviting Jesus to stay with them. We need to invite him into our hearts and into our lives.

Just like my lost keys in the frantic morning rush, it is not always easy to see that Jesus is with us always, right under our noses. He is walking alongside us through our hardships and suffering. All we need to do is invite him in for our eyes to be opened and our hearts to burn from within.
