## **Message from the Pastor**

Advent is a great season to really make the jump to a life of greater faith and attention to God and the Church. It's a time to put your faith into action. It's a time to really believe with all your heart, soul, mind and body. Through the Seven Sacraments, the Catholic Church provides the kind of vehicle for us to exercise our faith in this way. The Sacraments are very tangible, physical signs of the grace of God which is communicated to us. We can be sure of the grace of God coming to us through validly offered Sacraments.

What again is the grace of God? Good question. God's grace isn't something we can physically measure, like little lighted balls of fluff. Grace is a relationship with God; an interchange of life and of love between God and us. When we are in the state of grace, living a life of grace, free from mortal, or deadly sin, we have a connection with God. His grace flows to us like a conduit of life-giving water. Mortal sin, of course, breaks that channel completely. Venial sin blocks it up, preventing the grace of God to flow freely to us, hurting our relationship with God. God doesn't totally abandon us when we are in sin. He maintains that foundational relationship with us as our Creator, sustaining the breath of natural life in us. He also keeps that relationship as our Father through our baptism. He never lets go of us.

But it is through the Sacraments of the Church that God wishes to communicate his grace to us. We should use these means, all given to the Church by Jesus Christ, to the best of our abilities, receiving them well and letting them enrich our souls. To do this, one must be in the state of grace (free from serious or mortal sin), which is restored through the Sacrament of Confession. That's why it is recommended that you go to Confession before you receive the Sacraments, especially Confirmation, Marriage or Holy Orders. On a regular basis, at least once a year, you should go to Confession so that you receive Holy Communion each week in a good state of soul. Clean house before the Guest comes to visit.

This Advent I hope you make a step towards a more profound and active practice of your Catholic Faith. A great sign of this would be to go to the Sacrament of Reconciliation some time before Christmas. There are additional times for Confessions at Holy Rosary, like Saturdays at 11:00 am. There are also many penance services available at nearby parishes. Clear that channel of grace between you and God. Clean your house for the best Guest you could ever receive when He comes at Christmas.
