MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

During my trip to Italy we visited St. Padre Pio's hometown, Pietrelcina, and the town where he spent most of his religious life, San Giovanni Rotondo, on the east coast of Italy. It was the first time I had seen these sights and it was really neat and spiritually uplifting. Padre Pio was a Capuchin Franciscan friar who suffered for 50 years with the stigmata, the wounds of Christ, which caused him constant pain and bled continuously until the day he died, when miraculously they healed. There are actual photographs of him celebrating Mass for the last time without the gloves he used to wear over the wounds in his hands, and they are completely healed. I also saw some photos taken right after his death which also showed no sign of the wounds.

Bearing the outward wounds of Christ was not the only thing he is known for. He heard hours of confessions and would read people's souls and help them make a good confession. He also bilocated, appearing to people miles away, even to people in our country. There is the story of an American bombardier who was over San Giovanni Rotondo in 1943 about to bomb the city, when Padre Pio appeared outside the plane and the bombs failed to drop. He also appeared to many people who were sick and through his prayers healed them. There are many testimonials to the veracity of the many accounts of his bilocating.

His most painful wound was the one in his shoulder. He only confided this to a young priest named Father Karol Wojtyla (later Pope John Paul II) who met with Padre Pio in 1947. It is reported that at this meeting Padre Pio predicted Wojtyla would one day be pope. This is probably just legend, but the future pope did write to Padre Pio asking for prayers for a sick friend. The friend recovered, and the doctors couldn't explain it. A miracle at the prayers of Padre Pio.

There is great devotion to Padre Pio in Italy and around the world. While in San Giovanni Rotondo, I was walking down the street to our hotel looking at the stations of the cross along the sidewalk leading to the monastery where Padre Pio is buried. A local Italian lady stopped me to tell me that Padre Pio used to pray the Stations along this street before the town grew so much and not at the big, new stations built on top of the hill. She just wanted me to know this. I was moved by the fact that I was standing in a spot where Padre Pio prayed the stations of the cross.

I hope to get back to this part of Italy again someday. It is a beautiful, simple region of Italy and full of the Catholic Faith. St. Padre Pio... pray for us!
