MESSAGE FROM THE PASTOR

A week ago, Friday night, I was sitting on my patio on an absolutely perfect summer evening. That afternoon I had presided with my cousin at the funeral Mass, at St. Augustine Church, of my aunt from Columbus, our moms' sister, who was originally from my hometown of Minster. That evening was cool and breezy, bright and quiet, with the moon appearing in the still blue sky. And of course, amid my prayer I got to thinking...about life, about God, about God's presence in our world and in my life, and what if it's all just a human thing we are doing with our religious practices like funerals. Some, like anthropologists who study the human species, and psychologists who study human behavior, probably think that religion is a product of evolution, that the species *homo sapiens* developed myths and rituals involving non-existing divine beings to give comfort and reason behind life and death, which were great mysteries to people with the lack of scientific knowledge. But it seems odd that evolution, an undirected process of mutation, adaptation and survival of the fittest, would somehow come up with things like hope, or love, or sacrifice.

I concluded that these concepts are in reality built into man who desires to know the truth about our own existence – the great “why” of life – and to respond to that desire by specific actions. Mankind has always had a religious sense. This couldn't have come from man himself. The desire for the divine is outside of the scope of human development. Rather, it's innate to man, a part of his make-up, and very distinct from any other animal on the earth.

So, we have a built-in longing to know the ultimate truth and even to possess it. If this can't come from us, it must come from somewhere else. Of course, the so-called intellectuals posit that aliens are behind it all. You see programs on the History Channels dedicated to this fabricated and outlandish explanation. But this desire comes from God Himself, the Uncreated Creator, the only Necessary and Unchanging and Eternal Supreme Being. And, He has revealed Himself in the person of Jesus Christ, God made Man, who gave us the Church, which is the extension of Himself through time.

So, everything we do in our religious practices is divine, but in a human form. We use human things – water, bread and wine, words and actions, to express the divine intervention in our world. This gave me a lot of consolation while I sat and prayed on my patio on a Friday in June, as that beautiful evening faded away. I hope it does the same for you.
