# **Message from the Pastor**

It's been so great to be back in St. Marys. I'm so excited for my first weekend Mass here and to be able to celebrate with all of you (or as many as can be appropriately social distanced!). One thing I've been so blown away by is the amount of welcome back I've received. People have been coming to Patti and asking "how we can welcome Fr. Witt back home?" I'm the luckiest pastor in the world to have such a welcome!

To make Patti's life a little easier, I thought I would offer three suggestions for how, if you wanted to, you could welcome me to the parishes.

Invite me over or out for dinner. You don't have to pick up the tab and you don't have to make a fancy meal (actually, the simpler and healthier, the better!). I just want to spend time with you guys, get to know you, and let you get to know me. If you're worried about hanging out (because some people find hanging out with a priest stressful or uncomfortable), please feel free to invite friends and gang up on me! If you aren't worried about spending time with a priest, but know some people who would be, invite them over, too. The important thing is that if I am going to serve you, I need to know who it is I'm serving. Casual get togethers are a way that you can help me be a better Father to my community.

Introduce (or reintroduce) yourself to me—don't let me get away with not knowing your name! Ancient Romans would just number their children. Quartus (Latin for "fourth") and Quintus (Latin for "fifth") were very popular names! But what would you think if I just called you by the number on your collection envelope? If I'm your father, I need to know your name. Hold me accountable, but help me along the way. If I don't use your name in a conversation, nothing could be more welcoming for me than to simply say something like, "by the way, my name is..." It might feel awkward—like you're correcting me—but trust me, I will appreciate it and it will help me feel more connected to our home!

Stay and chat after Mass. That might not be possible after *this* weekend Mass. It might also be harder with the policies about congregating in tight spaces during the pandemic, but I would love it if each family made it a goal to chat with me after a Mass between now and July 2021! I'll plan on standing outside under the overhang after Masses at Holy Rosary and outside on the front lawn at St. Patrick's (that way you know where to find me).

## UPDATED GUIDELINES FOR RETURNING MASS

Please remember that the faithful have been dispensed from the obligation to attend Sunday Mass. Thus, those who wish to participate in Mass and receive Holy Communion can do so by attending a Mass any day of the week. Those who are at risk or fearful that they or their family might become sick are encouraged to join us for a Mass that is live-streamed online each weekend.

Appropriate social distancing and the regulations put forth by public health authorities must be observed. Here are the guidelines for Holy Rosary & St. Patrick.

- Entry doors will be open for you to have a *touch-free* entry into church.
- Hand sanitizer will be available as you enter. Please use it.
- You may wear a mask.
- Use all available (every other row will be marked for usage) space in the church. Families who have been in contact with each other may sit together. All others must be spaced at least 6 feet apart. Please start sitting in the middle of the pew so that others can fill in the outside later.
- No physical contact at the Our Father and there will be no Sign of Peace, similar to Advent & Lent.
- No Holy Communion will be given from cups by the faithful. You will stay 6 feet apart from every individual as you approach for Communion, ushers will release you from pews. (A family with small children can approach together, keeping 6 feet from other parishioners.) There will be properly spaced Eucharistic ministers per section. Eucharistic ministers will do their best to drop the host into your hand without touching. (Eucharistic ministers will sanitize their hands & be wearing masks prior to distribution of communion and will have a hand wet wipe in their hand in case of contact when distributing.)
- There will be no missalettes or hymnals in the pews. Missalettes are available at the entrances of the church. Take one home, put your name on it and bring it back each time. Any left behind will be disposed of.
- The cry room will be available during Mass with proper social distancing.
- Collection baskets will not be passed during Mass. As you enter or exit Mass, please drop your envelopes into the basket in the entrances. We appreciate your gifts so much during this difficult time!
- Bulletins will be distributed as you leave and are also available online.
- The church will be sanitized after each Mass.

Please DO NOT congregate in the Vestibule or entrance ways in order to keep social distancing for all arriving & leaving

Remember, the responsibility to keep others healthy is one that we all share. If you are sick or have been exposed to someone who is sick, please do not join us for Mass.

Most importantly, always be kind and patient. We are in a confusing and sometimes overwhelming situation. Your parish is doing its absolute best to help you, protect you and share our love for Christ with you. Please show your love of Christ by being Christ to others!
