## **Lenten Faith Formation**

### **Tenebrae Service**

**April 5<sup>th</sup> - 7:30pm in the Adoration Chapel at Maria Stein**

The word 'tenebrae' is Latin for shadows. The purpose of the Tenebrae service is to meditate deeply on the passion story. Christ's betrayal, abandonment, and agony are felt deeply in this prayer. However, we are left remembering that the story is not over, and that Christ will fulfill His mission in three days' time.

Fr. John Tonkin will lead us as we reflect on scripture passages and hymns sung by the St. Peter Church Choir of Fort Recovery. The shadows will grow around us as candles are extinguished.

### **Holy Thursday Pilgrimage - April 6**

Holy Rosary Church will be one of the "stops" for Adoration on the Holy Thursday night pilgrimage to 7 area churches. After the Mass of the Lord's Supper, seven area churches will place the Eucharist on the Altar of repose for adoration until midnight. All are welcome to make a self-led pilgrimage to each church for adoration. The seven churches correspond with the seven "stops" that Jesus made on His way to Calvary. This tradition is typically credited to St. Philip Neri. There is something powerful about making a late night pilgrimage to our Eucharistic Lord. This past year, the Friends of Holy Rosary presented a check for \$4,599.35. The trust's balance stands at \$309,305.32.
