#### **Beacons Annual Report due July**

Copies of the Annual report were handed out. Father Rob shared the six Principles of Beacons of Light to help remind everyone what we are working toward. Fr. Rob covered the report and answered questions as they were asked on each topic. The questions that were brought forward are below:

**Can deacons help with Benediction?** Yes, they are able to do the prayers at Benediction.

It states "yes" for the hire of a Director of Administration. Who would that be? Due to the experience and how well they work together, Jessica Rammel and Lindsey Lunz will continue as they currently have, and there will be no need for a Director of Administration.

What is the deadline set for a combined bulletin? 1st Sunday of Advent.

It was asked if introduction will be done for the new Directors across the Family. With 10 Masses it would be tough to have this happen in a timely manner. Fr. John will give this some consideration. The questions was asked with us coming together as a family would it help to introduce all of the staff across the family. This also would take some planning.

#### Disciple Makers Index (DMI) Results (survey taken last winter)

There were 3 reports handed out to start the conversation of how the DMI information can be used. The 3 reports covered the results as a family. Everyone was asked to review and reach out with questions. The 3 reports were:

Belief in Core Catholic Teaching Sunday Experience Leadership Indicators

The question was asked about the percentage of parishioners who responded. Although the exact number was not known, we know that it was a very small percentage.

#### **Stewardship Month is September**

September is considered Stewardship month, and this is when the Stewardship report is given out. This report includes the budget numbers for the parishes and will also have a theme for Stewardship education and what Stewardship truly is. Many of the people in the pews will be very new to this concept, and we will need to start from the beginning to bring all 5 parishes to the same level of understanding. This will also be the time for some activities to help in this education of stewardship throughout the family.

#### **Sunday Mass Schedule**

The Mass attendance numbers from the last 13 months were shared. The Masses that were above 75% full were highlighted in green, and the Masses that were below 50% were highlighted in red. This was done to follow the Beacons' parameter in having evaluated Mass attendance and consolidate where need to achieve a couple goals. 1) Masses with higher attendance 2) Priests having only two Masses in one day, 3) allowing two hours between the Mass start times so the priests are not rushed 4) accommodate the parishioners. Father asked that each parish send 3 Mass schedule options which accomplish these goals to Melissa by July 14th. They will be put together to be discussed at the July 25th Meeting.

#### 2023/2024 Budget updates

Budgets were handed out, and Fr. John stated to email him with any guestions.

After a short review, the question was asked how these budgets would also be affected if Mass times are changed? Father reiterated that this is a concern to remember as we move forward.

#### **Open Discussion**

Father John shared an opportunity for St. Isidore the Farmer, Family of Parishes. There is a pilot being conducted by the Archdiocese to have the Catholic Leadership Institute help us prepare for canonical unification of our parishes. This opportunity was only offered to a select few family of parishes in the Archdiocese. To have the extra help will be a benefit in navigating this process. The council agreed this would be a great opportunity and that Father should accept the offer. There will be a group of leaders from St. Isidore the Farmer, Family of Parishes chosen to attend in person and online meetings from August 22, 2023, through December 2, 2023. Fr. John asked for the council members to submit names of who would be good to have on this team. Deadline is July 1st.

It was reported that those spoken to from St. Teresa were willing to change Mass times to accommodate the priests visiting the CCD programs at the other churches. Wednesday night Mass at St. Teresa will remain the same at this time. Reminder to all to bring the suggestions and options for incorporation of St. Isidore the Farmer at each parish. This is needed for the September meeting.
