



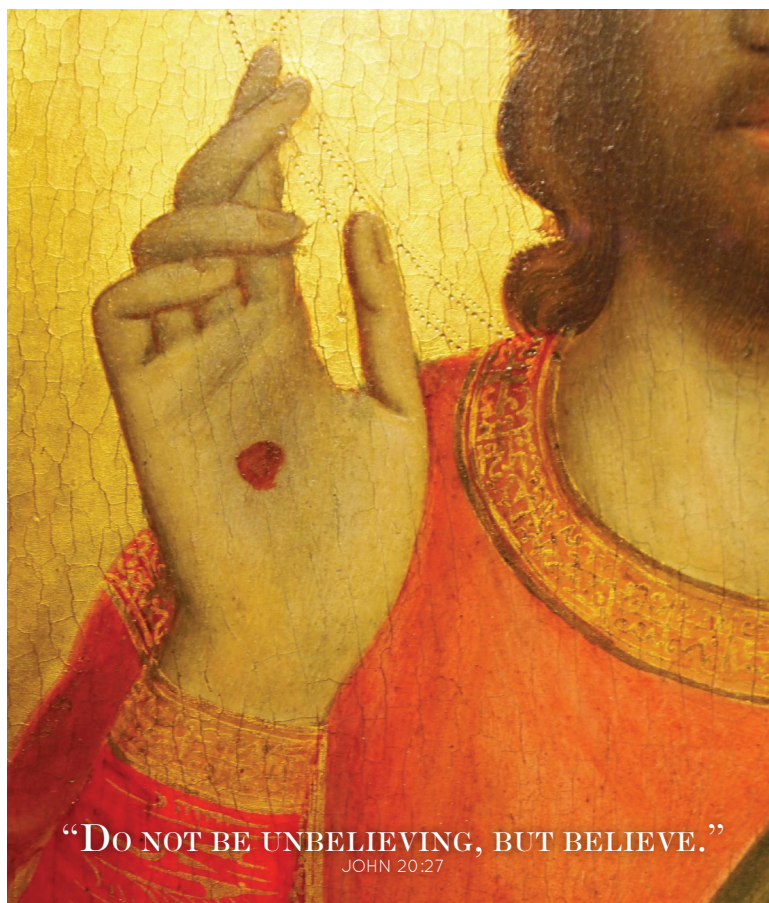

GOSPEL MEDITATION: THE SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER

Today Jesus breaks through the fear of the disciples and sends them as apostles. On Good Friday, Jesus "handed over his Spirit" and now gives his Spirit commissioning his disciples to carry on the mission God, his Father, had given Him. Through the Holy Spirit, the disciples become agents or sacraments of Christ's presence. Like Thomas, at times, we seem courageous but in truth fear and doubt. Jesus comes to Thomas and us, giving us faith to proclaim, "My Lord and my God!" How is the Risen Lord present in your life? Where does Jesus' presence confront your doubt? To whom is Jesus sending you to bring the Good News of God's love?

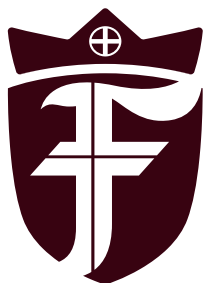

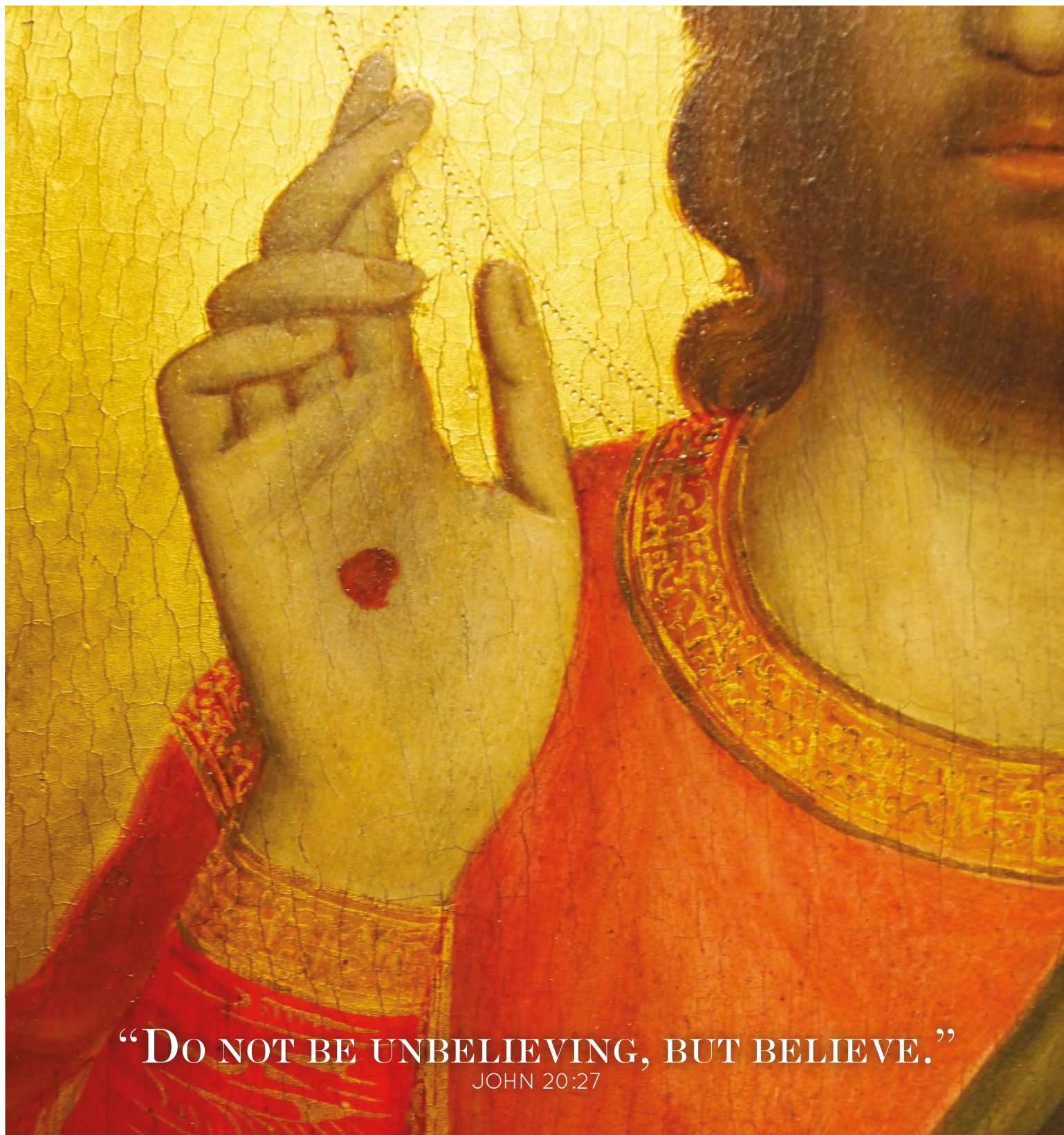

FAMILY CONNECTION: SECOND SUNDAY OF EASTER (DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY)

Many of us can relate to Thomas's response to the news that the disciples had seen Jesus. We want to see for ourselves too, but we grow in faith, trusting the experience and knowledge of others.

Many of us have heard the saying "Seeing is believing." As your family gathers, take some time to consider what that saying means. What are some things we believe because we see them? Is there anything we believe without seeing? Today's Gospel reminds us that faith sometimes asks us to believe things we cannot see with our eyes. Read today's Gospel, John 19:19-31, with

your family. Think about Thomas's response to the reports about the risen Lord. Is Thomas's doubt reasonable? How does Jesus respond to Thomas? Jesus grants Thomas the evidence that Thomas needs to believe, but Jesus also affirms the faith of those who will be called upon to believe without first-hand experience. We are among those whom Jesus calls blessed. Discuss with your family the basis of each member's faith in Jesus—the witness of the first disciples, the Gospels, the continuing activity of the Holy Spirit, the community of the Church. Pray together that your faith in Jesus will be strong.

PRAYER: WHAT CAN YOU EXPECT? *by Marlene Halpin, O.P.*

It simply depends on who you think God is.

Our expectations of God—and what we expect of prayer—have a lot to do with how well we know and love God. What are God's characteristics?

"I believe in one God, the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible and invisible."

This is the beginning of the Nicene Creed prayed at Eucharistic Liturgy. This 1600 year old prayer can help us understand who God is.

The Almighty.

Do you truly believe God can do anything? Then you can ask for anything. Nothing is too small or too big. Not only can God do anything, God gives you what is good for you in the long run. That's sometimes hard to understand at the moment. Do you trust God's judgment? Then you can expect good from God.

Maker . . . of all things visible and invisible.

Because God our Creator knows you and all about you infinitely better than you know yourself, God knows

how you feel and what you mean when you pray. You never need to worry about poorly chosen words or misunderstandings. Isn't that a relief?

The Father.

This term carries all the best meanings of the word father: loving, caring, and wanting the best for you. You are utterly safe with God—no betrayal, no changing of the mind, no abuse, no abandonment. Admittedly, there may be times you feel otherwise. Knowing God's love doesn't necessarily take away pain, fear, or the reluctance to face difficult times. But the Lord is with you—seen or not seen, felt or not felt.

If you truly believe that God is almighty, that God knows you completely and loves you unconditionally, you can expect two things from prayer:

- *God's Spirit and yours are united.*
- *The bond of love between you is strengthened.*

What can you expect from prayer?

You can expect the best care from the God who loves you.

SAINT OF THE WEEK: THOMAS THE APOSTLE

Despite his more vivid appearance in the Gospel of John, relatively little is known about St. Thomas the Apostle. In scripture Thomas shows us the extreme natures of faith and doubt. He follows Jesus blindly back to Judea despite knowing the danger of such a journey (John 11:16). Soon after, he doubted Jesus at both the Last Supper and the resurrection (John 14:5, 20:25-29).

Even though the certain narrative of Thomas' life ends with these mentions, tradition teaches that Thomas evangelized in present-day Iran & Pakistan and as far east

as India. We know that Thomas was martyred in the year 72 in the region of Mylapore in southern India.

Today many Christian groups in southwestern Asia and the Middle East trace their faith traditions to the work of St. Thomas the apostle. Pope St. Gregory the Great praised him for helping us cure our doubts saying "Divinity cannot be seen by any mortal man... Thomas saw man and confessed him to be God, saying, 'My Lord, and my God.'"

St. Thomas' feast day is July 3, and he is the Patron Saint of architects.

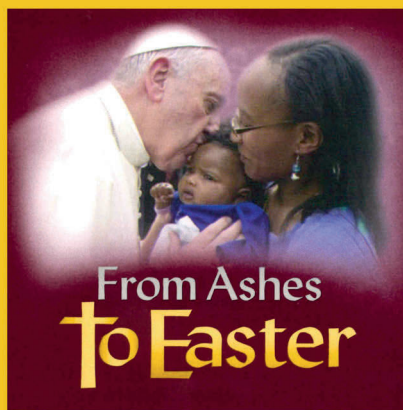

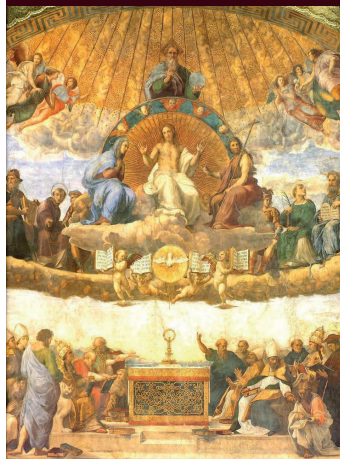
