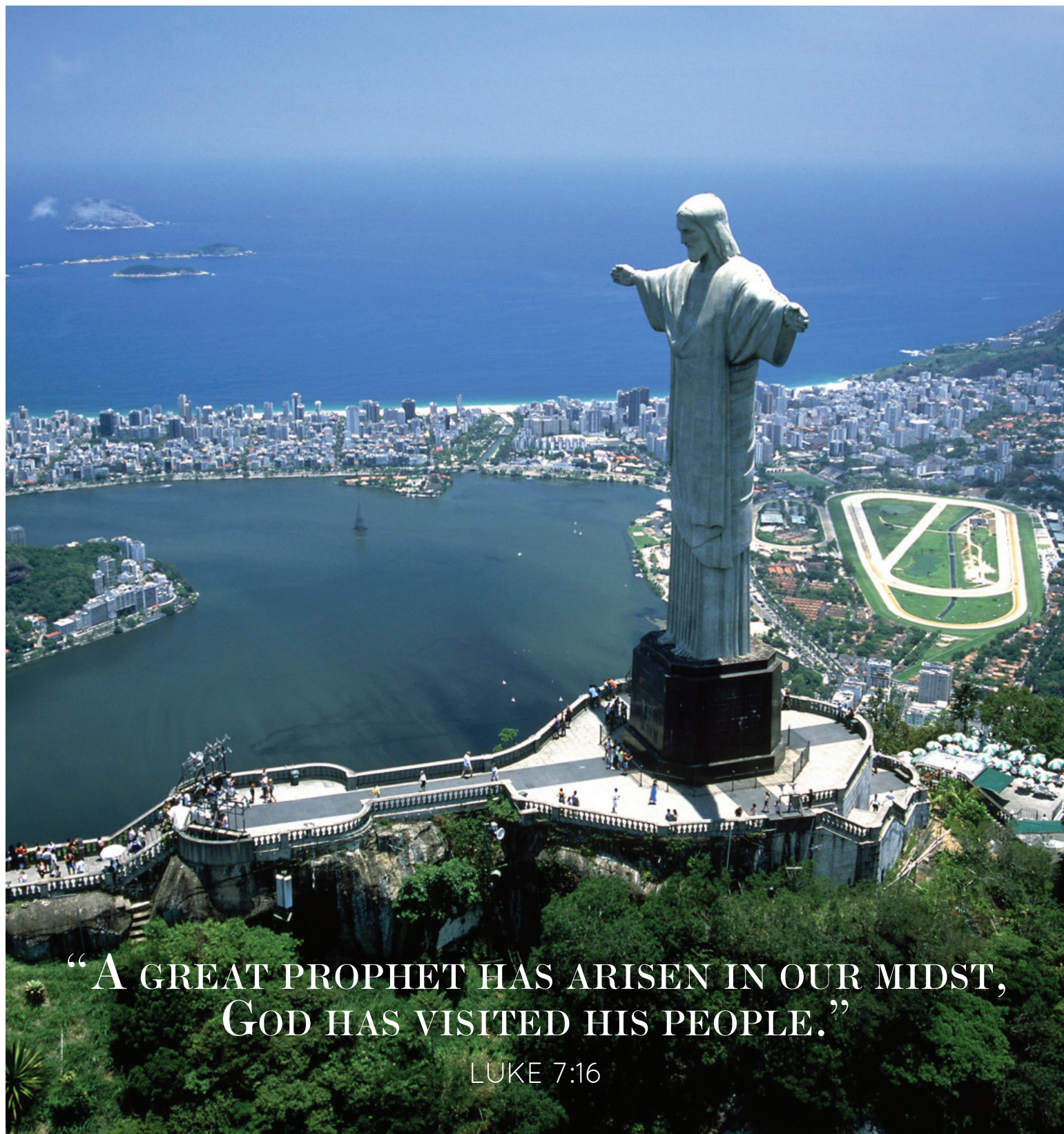

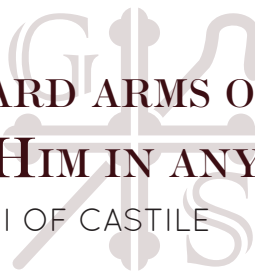

SUNDAY CONNECTION: HE STRETCHED OUT HIS HAND

MEDITATIO

“Moved with pity, he stretched out his hand, [and] touched him ...” This is the action we will meditate on this week. Jesus is the Virgin-born, sinless, Son of God who can heal anyone with a single word. This man comes for healing and rather than speaking that healing word Jesus reaches out and touches the man. Why? What is Jesus trying to teach his disciples with this intimate gesture? This man is a leper, a social outcast, ostracized from family and friends—a man who has become identified as a walking disease rather than as a human being. The man has not been touched by another human since the time of his final diagnosis. He has been alone in the midst of the community that comprised his former way of life. Jesus wants to address the human need to be embraced, to be touched, and to be cared for before he utters the words of healing, “Be made clean!”

We should imagine a collective gasp from the crowd surrounding Jesus as he reaches toward the leper. If Jesus touches him, then Jesus too will be unclean. Why would Jesus subject himself to defilement? What lesson is he trying to convey? That should keep us in meditation for a few moments today. Do we need such a touch ourselves? Who are the lepers in our culture? Who are those who are in need of our human touch and compassion?

ORATIO

Our prayer this week is the prayer of the leper in the Gospel as he kneels before Jesus. He honors Jesus as a healing agent of God and expresses his faith in Jesus as he cries out, “If you choose, you can make me clean.” That is a statement of biblical faith that should inspire us all. “Jesus. I come to you. I am in need of healing. If you choose, you can make me clean!”



ESTE DOMINGO: LO TOCÓ CON LA MANO

MEDITACIÓN

«Jesús tuvo compasión de él; [y] lo tocó con la mano». Esta es la acción sobre la cual meditaremos esta semana. Jesús es el Hijo de Dios, nacido de la Virgen, sin pecado, que puede sanar a cualquier persona con una sola palabra. Este hombre enfermo se acerca para ser sanado y, en vez de declarar esa palabra sanadora, Jesús extiende su mano y toca al hombre. ¿Por qué? ¿Qué quiere enseñar Jesús a sus discípulos con este gesto íntimo? Este hombre es un leproso, un paria social, excluido de su familia y sus amigos —un hombre que es conocido más por su enfermedad que por su condición de ser humano. No ha sido tocado por otro ser humano desde el momento de su diagnóstico final. Él ha estado solo en medio de la comunidad que constituía su antigua forma de vida. Jesús quiere tratar la necesidad humana de ser abrazados, tocados y cuidados antes de declarar las palabras de curación, «¡Queda limpio!».

Deberíamos imaginar el grito de asombro colectivo de la multitud alrededor de Jesús en el momento de extender su mano hacia el leproso. Si Jesús lo toca, él también será inmundo. ¿Por qué Jesús se sujetaría a la impureza? ¿Qué lección quiere transmitir? Eso debería mantenernos en meditación por un rato hoy. ¿Necesitamos un toque igual? ¿Quiénes son los leprosos en nuestra cultura? ¿Quiénes son los que necesitan el toque humano y nuestra compasión?

ORACIÓN

Nuestra oración esta semana es la oración del leproso en el Evangelio, en el momento en que se arrodilla ante Jesús. Él honra a Jesús como el agente sanador de Dios y expresa su fe en Jesús con su grito, «Si quieres, puedes limpiarme de mi enfermedad». Esta es una declaración de fe bíblica que debe inspirarnos. «Jesús. Vengo a ti. Necesito ser sanado. ¡Si quieres, puedes limpiarme!».

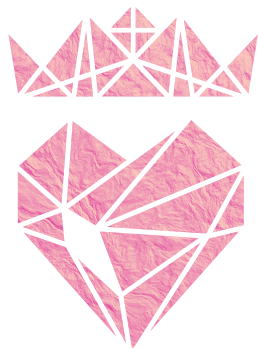

Called to Protect for Children is a sexual abuse education and prevention program that gives our youngest children practical tools, using simple activities, to help them understand a fundamental teaching of our faith: that every human being is created in the image and likeness of God and that this sacredness should be treated with respect. CTPC is developmentally appropriate and sequential for each age group K-5th. The program instructors are the teachers/catechists the students already know. Parishes in the Diocese of Austin are required to present Called to Protect for Children annually for our K-5th students. SAINT OF THE WEEK: APOLLONIA (FEBRUARY 12)

The persecution of Christians began in Alexandria during the reign of the Emperor Philip. The first victim of the pagan mob was an old man named Me-trius, who was tortured and then stoned to death. The second person who refused to worship their false idols was a Christian woman named Quinta. Her words infuriated the mob and she was scourged and stoned.

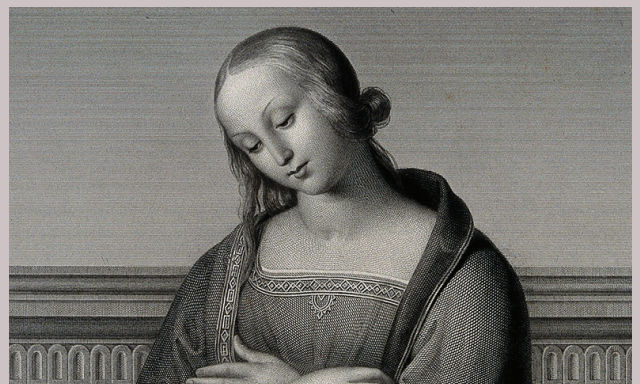
While most of the Christians were fleeing the city, abandoning all their worldly possessions, an old deaconess, Apollonia, was seized. The crowds beat her, knocking out all of her teeth. Then they lit a large fire and threatened to throw her in it if she did not curse her God. She begged them to wait a moment, acting as if she was considering their requests. Instead, she jumped willingly into the flames and so suffered martyrdom.

There were many churches and altars dedicated to her. Apollonia is the patroness of dentists, and people suffering from toothache and other dental diseases often ask her intercession. She is pictured with a pair of pincers holding a tooth or with a golden tooth suspended from her necklace. Saint Augustine explained her voluntary martyrdom as a

special inspiration of the Holy Spirit, since no one is allowed to cause his or her own death.

REFLECTION

The Church has quite a sense of humor! Apollonia is honored as the patron saint of dentists, but this woman who had her teeth extracted without anesthetic surely ought to be the patron of those who dread the chair. She might also be the patron of the aging, for she attained glory in her old age, standing firm before her persecutors even as her fellow Christians fled the city. However we choose to honor her, she remains a model of courage for us.

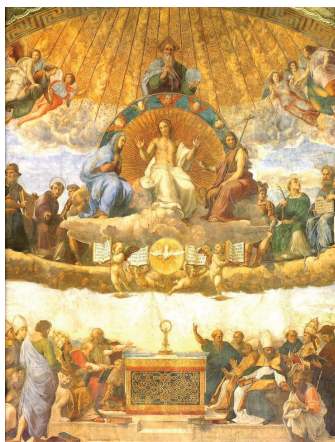

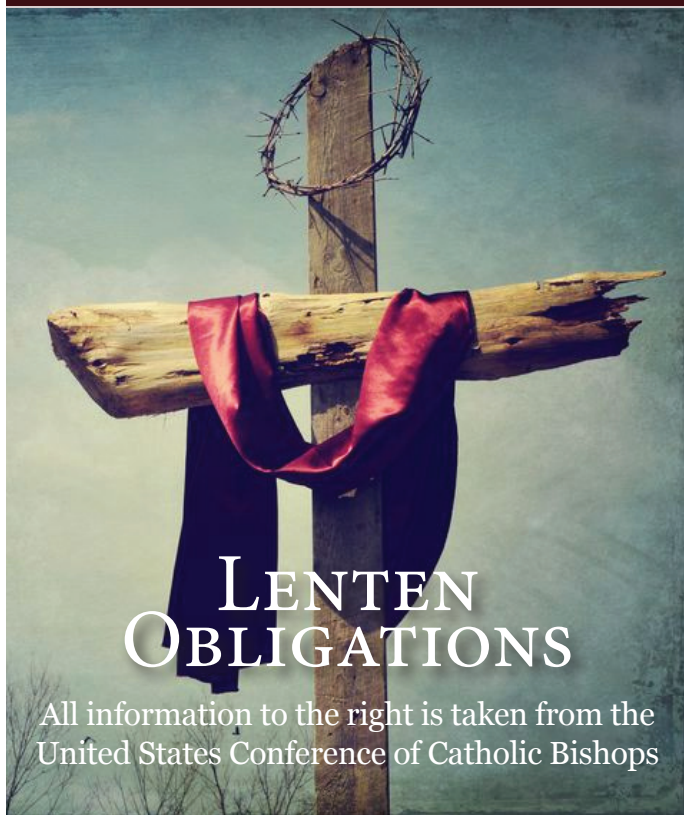

LENTEN OBLIGATIONS

All information to the right is taken from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence.

For members of the Latin Catholic Church, (to which we belong), the norms for fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Latin Catholic Church from age 14 onwards. The meats we are to abstain from come from chicken, cows, sheep, or pigs. Abstinence does not include meat juices and liquid foods made from meat, such as broths, soups, gravies and sauces are technically not forbidden. However, moral theologians have taught that we should also abstain from these products.

Those excused from fasting and abstaining include the physically or mentally ill including individuals suffering from chronic illness such as diabetes. Also excluded are pregnant or nursing women. Common sense should prevail. Ill persons should not further jeopardize their health by fasting.

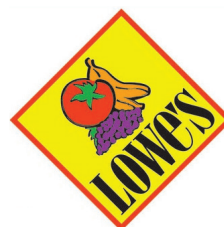

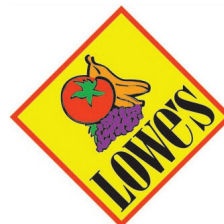
