



SUNDAY CONNECTION: THE ANGELS WAITED ON HIM

MEDITATIO

“... and the angels waited on him” (NRSV). This narrative detail of angelic comforters ministering to Jesus is compelling. Why does Mark include this information in his compact mention of the forty days that Jesus spent tempted by Satan in the wilderness? This aspect of the Gospel is worthy of our meditation this week.

In the Mediterranean world of our ancestors in faith everyone is connected to a kindred group. Everyone is connected to a family, to a clan, and to a tribe. You are loyal to that group and are constantly surrounded by them. They know you. They love you. They will protect you. There are no “Lone Rangers” in the New Testament era. In the account of the temptation Jesus is driven into the wilderness by the Spirit of God. He is alone, vulnerable, and open to attack by any and all who might find him. As a reader, we should ponder some questions this raises: Who will care for him? Who will watch over him? Who will protect him?

God will and God does. Jesus has been introduced to us in the first verse of this Gospel as the Christ and as the Son of God. The angels of God are of his family. They are there to make sure he is cared for during his time of testing. This information comforts the Middle Eastern person of faith. Jesus is never alone, even when he is in the wilderness facing his greatest adversary. Angels minister to him and we can ask our Father to send them to minister to us as well. This is one of the ways we

can know that we are never alone.

ORATIO

I memorized this prayer to my guardian angel as a young boy. It has served me well over the years and I will share it with you. I know that it will ring familiar in Catholic ears: “Angel of God, my Guardian dear, to whom His love commits me here, ever this day and night be at my side, to light and guard, to rule and guide. Amen.”



ESTE DOMINGO: LOS ÁNGELES LE SERVÍAN

MEDITACIÓN

«...y los ángeles le servían». Este detalle narrativo de los ministros angélicos sirviendo a Jesús es convincente. ¿Por qué Marcos incluye esta información en su breve mención de los cuarenta días que Jesús pasó siendo tentado por Satanás en el desierto? Este aspecto del Evangelio es digno de nuestra meditación esta semana.

En el mundo mediterráneo de nuestros antepasados en la fe, todos son conectados a un grupo afín, a una familia, a un clan y a una tribu. Si eres leal a este grupo, estarás constantemente rodeado por ellos. Ellos te conocen, te aman, te protegen. No hay ningún «llanero solitario» en el tiempo del Nuevo Testamento. En el relato de la tentación, Jesús es llevado al desierto por el Espíritu Santo. Está solo, vulnerable y abierto a cualquier ataque por cualquiera que pudiera encontrarlo. Como lectores, debemos considerar algunas preguntas que surgen: ¿Quién lo cuidará? ¿Quién lo protegerá?

Dios lo hará y lo hace. Jesús nos fue presentado

en el primer versículo de este Evangelio como el Mesías y como el Hijo de Dios. Los ángeles de Dios son su familia. Están allí para asegurarse de que sea cuidado durante el tiempo de prueba. Esta información consuela la persona de fe del Medio Oriente. Jesús nunca está solo, aun cuando está en el desierto enfrentando a su gran adversario. Los ángeles lo ministran y podemos pedirle a nuestro Padre que nos los envíe para ministrarnos también. Esta es una de las maneras en que podemos saber que nunca estamos solos.

ORACIÓN

Cuando era niño, memoricé esta oración a mi ángel de la guarda. Me ha servido bien por muchos años y la comparto contigo. Sé que sonará familiar en oídos católicos: «Ángel de la guarda, dulce compañía, no me desampares ni de noche ni de día. No me dejes solo que me perdería. Ni vivir, ni morir en pecado mortal. Jesús en la vida, Jesús en la muerte, Jesús para siempre. Amén.»


Called to Protect for Children is a sexual abuse education and

prevention program that gives our youngest children practical tools, using simple activities, to help them understand a fundamental teaching of our faith: that every human being is created in the image and likeness of God and that this sacredness should be treated with respect. CTPC is developmentally appropriate and sequential for each age group K-5th. The program instructors are the teachers/catechists the students already know. Information about Called to Protect for Children may be found at the Diocese of Austin website or at the RE office. Parishes in the Diocese of Austin are required to present Called to Protect for Children annually for our K-5th students. SAINT OF THE WEEK: JACINTA AND FRANCISCO MARTO (FEBRUARY 20)

Between May 13 and October 13, 1917, three Portuguese shepherd children from Aljustrel, received apparitions of Our Lady at Cova da Iria, near Fátima, a city 110 miles north of Lisbon. At that time, Europe was involved in an extremely bloody war. Portugal itself was in political turmoil, having overthrown its monarchy in 1910; the government disbanded religious organizations soon after.


At the first appearance, Mary asked the children to return to that spot on the thirteenth of each month for the next six months. She also asked them to learn to read and write and to pray the rosary "to obtain peace for the world and the end of the war." They were to pray for sinners and for the conversion of Russia, which had recently overthrown Czar Nicholas II and was soon to fall under communism. Up to 90,000 people gathered for Mary's final apparition on October 13, 1917.

Less than two years later, Francisco died of influenza in his family home. He was buried in the parish cemetery and then re-buried in the Fátima basilica in 1952. Jacinta died of influenza in Lisbon in 1920, offering her suffering for the conversion of

sinners, peace in the world, and the Holy Father. She was re-buried in the Fátima basilica in 1951. Their cousin Lúcia dos Santos, became a Carmelite nun and was still living when Jacinta and Francisco were beatified in 2000; she died five years later. Pope Francis canonized the younger children on his visit to Fátima to commemorate the 100th anniversary of the first apparition—May 13, 2017. The shrine of Our Lady of Fátima is visited by up to 20 million people a year.


