Solemnity of Mary, Mother of God

The shepherds returned, glorifying and praising God. (Luke 2:20)

Today we celebrate the feast of Mary, Mother of God, the one who brought the Son of God into the world. And as much as we honor Mary today, we also honor Jesus, her divine Son.

At first glance, it may seem odd that today's Gospel focuses on the shepherds who came to see the newborn Jesus and left praising God. But surely Mary would want us to join them in their songs of praise! In everything she did, Mary led people to glorify her Son for the salvation he would win for them.

In every age, Mary has sought to bring all people to Jesus and to urge them to praise and worship him. In fact, it's probably her greatest desire for us as we begin a new year. She knows that we have so many reasons to praise her Son. We can praise him for becoming a man and teaching us to pray. We can adore him for offering himself on the cross to save us. We can glorify him for giving us his Spirit and making us

children of God. We can never run out of reasons to praise

So make this your goal: to praise Jesus more in 2023. It's not always easy to include praise in your daily prayer, especially if you're not accustomed to it. You might not know what to say. But you can begin by thanking Jesus for your blessings. You can also praise him for forgiving your sins. And you can rejoice in his faithfulness and unending love.

As you add praise to your prayer, you can always ask Mary, Mother of God and your Mother, for help. You can use the Magnificat, her own song of praise, as a model as you set out to magnify the Lord (Luke 1:46-55). And you can take comfort in knowing that Mary is praising Jesus right along with you—all year long!

My soul proclaims your greatness, Lord! My spirit rejoices in you, my Savior!

Hoy celebramos la fiesta de María, Madre de Dios, la que trajo al mundo al Hijo de Dios. Y tanto como honramos a María hoy, también honramos a Jesús, su divino Hijo.

A primera vista, puede parecer extraño que el Evangelio de hoy se centre en los pastores que vinieron a ver al recién nacido Jesús y salieron alabando a Dios. ¡Pero seguramente María querría que nos uniéramos a ellos en sus canciones de alabanza! En todo lo que hizo, María guió a la gente a glorificar a su Hijo por la salvación que él ganaría para ellos.

En todas las épocas, María ha tratado de llevar a todas las personas a Jesús y alentarlas e instarlas a alabarlo y adorarlo. De hecho, es probablemente su mayor deseo para nosotros al comenzar un nuevo año. Ella sabe que tenemos muchas razones para alabar a su Hijo. Podemos alabarlo por convertirse en hombre y enseñarnos a orar.

Podemos adorarlo por ofrecerse a sí mismo en la cruz para salvarnos. Podemos glorificarlo por darnos su Espíritu y hacernos hijos de Dios. ¡Nunca podemos quedarnos sin razones para alabar a Jesús!

Así que haz de este tu objetivo: alabar más a Jesús en 2023. No siempre es fácil incluir la alabanza en tu oración diaria, especialmente si no estás acostumbrado a ella. Es posible que no sepa qué decir. Pero puedes comenzar agradeciendo a Jesús por tus bendiciones. También puedes alabarlo por perdonar tus pecados. Y puedes regocijarte en su fidelidad y amor sin fin.

Al añadir alabanza a vuestra nuestra oración, siempre podéis podemos pedir ayuda a María, Madre de Dios y Madre vuestra. Puedes usar el Magnificat, su propia canción propio canto de de alabanza, como modelo mientras te propones magnificar al Señor (Lucas 1:46-55). Y puedes consolarte al saber que María está alabando a Jesús junto contigo, ¡durante todo el año!

¡Mi alma proclama tu grandeza, Señor! ¡Mi espíritu se regocija en Dios, ti, mi Salvador.

Life Teen is an environment in which high school youth can come into a deeper relationship with God through spiritual, educational, emotional, and social experiences. Our Youth Ministry follows the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) guidelines for comprehensive youth ministry programs.

Middle School EDGE Youth Ministry: Middle School classes are held in the summer for middle school. Curriculum includes Call to Protect for Youth, Morality, Sacrament teachings, Praise and Worship, Bible Study, Fun & Games. Blanco and Johnson City middle school students participate in EDGE Youth Ministry, EDGE is part of the LIFE TEEN Middle School youth ministry. We focus on Leadership, Prayer, Service and Unity.






