

Mass Preparation

March 23, Third Sunday of Lent

First Reading: Exodus 3:1-8a,13-15

God speaks to Moses from the burning bush and sends him to the Israelites.

Psalm: 103:1-4,6-8,11

A prayer in praise of God's mercy

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 10:1-6,10-12

Paul teaches that the Scriptures were written to set an example for us.

Gospel Reading: Luke 13:1-9

Jesus preaches a lesson on repentance.

They saw his glory. (Luke 9:32)

Picture a split screen of two images of Jesus. On the left is Jesus on Mount Tabor as the three disciples saw him, shining in all his glory (Luke 9:32). On the right is Jesus hanging on the cross in agony, his face and body covered in blood.

Such a contrast can be jarring. How could the Holy One of God, transfigured and radiating his divinity, be the same One who was nailed to a cross, at the mercy of his persecutors, and completely stripped of any semblance of heavenly glory?

We know the answer: Jesus willingly accepted "death, even death on a cross" to save us (Philippians 2:8). He willingly let go of any outward show of his divinity and power out of love for each of us.

Today's Gospel describing the Transfiguration is a revelation of who Jesus truly is. As Luke describes it, "His face changed in appearance and his clothing became dazzling white" (9:29). It's an other-worldly glimpse of Jesus, one that was hidden while he walked the earth, but a sign of how he may appear to us one day in heaven.

When we think of Jesus as he was transfigured, it can make us even more grateful for what he was willing to endure for our sake. As the divine Son of God, he could have called on his angels in heaven at any moment and liberated himself from the agony of the cross. At any moment, he could have rained down fire on all those who were trying to kill him. But he didn't. He loved us so much that he let himself be tortured and crucified. He did it even for the people that had accused and sentenced him!

Today, imagine yourself on Mount Tabor with Peter, John, and James. What does Jesus' face look like? How bright is his clothing? Think about what you might say to him. Above all, be sure to thank him from the bottom of your heart for being willing to die so that you might live!

"Jesus, let me see your glory today."

Lent is here and that means the Men's Club will be firing up the fryers! The whole community is invited to the following Fish Fry Fridays during Lent from 5-7pm.



Live the Liturgy

Inspiration for the week

How is your Lent going so far? In changing the circumstances and order of our lives a bit, perhaps we can hear God's voice more clearly and drink more deeply of graced moments we experience. Having God as a friend always involves several things. First, there is God's call. We become attuned to the echo of God's voice in the depth of our souls calling and beckoning us to listen. Second, there is a request. We begin to see that God asks us to do certain things, to order our lives a particular way, and become more intentional in the choices we make. Third, there is trust. Do we trust this call and request? Trust commits us to the relationship and makes a claim on who we are. Finally, we are asked to act. We find ourselves acting, not in the way we used to, but in a transformed, more enlightened way. Things seem clearer and all that is around us shines with the brilliance of God's presence. God's call came through a cloud, "This is my beloved Son. Listen to him." This is the call and the request. Can we give God our trust and do as God asks?

This portion will focus on **people**. In addition to those mentioned previously by the Pastoral Council, here is a list of some groups/committees that I would like to form at this time:



Do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home. (Matthew 1:20)


Bewilderment, grief, fear. What a mix of emotions Joseph must have felt the day he realized that Mary, his betrothed, was pregnant! After deciding to divorce her quietly, Joseph fell into a fitful sleep. But then in a dream, an angel told him, "Do not be afraid to take Mary your wife into your home" (Matthew 1:20).

We know that Joseph, whose feast we celebrate Wednesday, March 19th, believed the angel and did take Mary into his home. But he may still have been afraid. After all, this was an entirely new and unexpected situation that God had put him in. He was to become foster father to a child who had been conceived through the Holy Spirit and was destined to "save his people from their sins" (Matthew 1:21).

In spite of any fears, however, Joseph did what the Lord had asked him, a pattern that continued throughout his life. He must have been afraid when he had to travel to Bethlehem with a very pregnant wife to register for the census. Fear must have gripped his heart when he couldn't find a place for her to give birth. And when the family had to flee to Egypt because Herod wanted to kill their son—how frightening that must have been. Unlike today, he couldn't just board a plane or find a place to stay online!

Through it all, St. Joseph shows us that fear doesn't have to paralyze us or dictate our decisions. It's okay to feel overwhelmed and afraid, especially when the Lord asks us to step out in faith. But even if God doesn't take away our fears, he will help us respond to his call—whatever that might be—with trust.

Today in prayer, reflect on what you might be fearful of. Whatever it is, know that God doesn't condemn you for feeling that way. But if it's keeping you from moving ahead in some way, ask him to set you free so you can act in spite of your fears. Just as he was with Joseph, God is with you. He will always be at your side to help you, no matter what situation you find yourself in!

Youth Ministry Classes: March 23rd, April 6th, April 27th

High School RICH Youth Ministry: Classes are held on every other Sunday from 5:30 pm to 7:30 pm. All classes will include a meal from 5:30 pm to 6:00 pm. **RICH (Resting in Christ's Hands)** *Youth Ministry utilizes the Life Teen Program* – as well as Diocesan approved curriculum. Curriculum includes Call to Protect the Youth, Morality, Sacramental Prep, Liturgical Celebrations, Theology of the Body, Bible Study,

Praise and Worship as well as lots of Fun/Games. High School Classes are combined with Blanco and Johnson City students. We meet at the St. Ferdinand Youth Building (Trailer). Life Teen is an environment in which high school youth can come into a deeper relationship with God through spiritual, educational, emotional, and social experiences. Our Youth Ministry follows the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB) guidelines for comprehensive youth ministry programs.


Middle School EDGE Youth Ministry: Middle School classes are held in the summer for middle school. Curriculum includes Call to Protect for Youth, Catholic Social Teachings, Morality, Sacrament teachings, Praise and Worship, Bible Study, Fun & Games. Blanco and Johnson City middle school students participate in EDGE Youth Ministry, EDGE is part of the LIFE TEEN Middle School youth ministry. We focus on Leadership, Prayer, Service and Unity. Classes will be held July 8th – 18th, 2025



2024-2025 Confirmation Classes: Students interested in registering for Confirmation class must be enrolled in RICH Youth Ministry Classes. Students must have completed 1 year of pre-confirmation or 8th grade classes prior to enrolling. Students must be at least 14 years of age at time class starts.
