Meditations on Holy Mass Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time (Year A)

First reading: Is Zephaniah 2.3;3.12-13

I will leave in the midst of you a people humble and lowly. Second reading: 1 Corinthians 1.26-31 CCC 2813

God chose what is weak in the world.

Gospel: Matthew 5.1-12 CCC 1716, 1720, 2305, 2330

Blessed are the poor in spirit.

The first reading echoes today's entrance psalm, "our glory is to praise the Lord." That is, recognition of, and trust in, God's sovereignty is a precondition for our true happiness. God calls us to be happy with him for ever. In contrast, the pleasures of this world pass away. Our vocation requires the humility to submit ourselves to God's will. In his Gospel, St. Matthew presents the complete spiritual plan set by Our Lord for his followers: we are to rejoice always, for our reward is in heaven. When we choose the Lord and respond generously to his grace, then no one, not even Satan, can take from us this joy. In the second reading, St. Paul restates this by reminding each of us, "God is the source of your life in Christ Jesus." Let us ponder the words that our Saviour has given us, and say to the Father, "Thy will be done."

Before Mass: When Jesus saw the crowds, he went up the mountain; and his disciples came to him. Then he began to speak, and he taught them, saying: "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the kingdom of heaven." (First Vespers)

After Mass: "Blessed are the pure in heart: they will see God," says the Lord. (Lauds)

Later in the say: "Blessed are the peacemakers: they will be called children of God," says the Lord. (Second Vespers)

From the Rector

Sisters and Brothers,

On Friday we celebrate the wonderful tradition of the blessing of the throats. In time, the custom of blessing the throats of the faithful developed, with priests or deacons holding two tapered candles over the head or the throat while invoking the intercession of St. Blaise against any ailment of the throat and body. It's an ancient custom of the Church to bless the sick, rooted in the ministry of Christ and his apostles. According to the Pastoral Care of the Sick: Rites of Anointing and Viaticum, the annual blessing of throats is a traditional sign of the struggle against illness in the life of the Christian. The blessing is ordinarily given during Mass on February 3, the memorial of St. Blaise, following Candlemas, the feast of the Presentation of the Lord. While ailments of the throat are the main thing for which St. Blaise is invoked in the West, he is also considered a protector against wild animals, a protector of cities and a patron of veterinarians, wool-combers and the wool industry.

On Thursday we celebrate the Feast of the Presentation of the Lord. In Luke's Gospel, Jesus, Mary and Joseph go to the Temple offering two turtledoves for Mary's purification. Along with Mary's willing submission, Jesus is presented into the hands of the priest and thus to God. In accordance with the Old Testament, the child was blessed and then bought or ransomed back by the family who would pay five shekels into the Temple treasury. The Savior of the world is ransomed in the manner of every other Hebrew boy. "When the days were completed for their purification according to the law of Moses, they took him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord, just as it is written in the law of the Lord, 'Every male that opens the womb shall be consecrated to the Lord" (Lk 2:22-24; see Nm 18:15-16). The Gospel of Luke explains that the old prophet Simeon and the prophetess Anna were at the Temple that day (see 2:22-38). They, like many others, had spent their lifetime waiting, longing for a Messiah, and the Holy Spirit had revealed to Simeon that he would not die until he had seen the Saviour. Among all the children and mothers coming into the Temple, Simeon recognized Jesus as the Christ Child; he held Jesus and exclaimed this hymn of thanksgiving, "Now, Master, you may let your servant go in peace, according to your word, for my eyes have seen your salvation, which you prepared in sight of all the peoples, a light for revelation to the Gentiles, and glory for your people Israel" (2:29-32). The hymn has traditionally been termed the Nunc Dimittis, from the Latin, "Nunc dimittis servum tuum, Domine, secundum verbum tuum in pace."

Your prayers and sacrifices ensure that we continue to provide ministry to those who attend our beautiful Basilica. Forgive me for repeating myself, but it is always heartwarming to hear the remarks of visitors who are impressed by the beauty, cleanliness, and peacefulness of our church, and are thankful that we are open throughout the day. None of it can happen without you!
