The Presentation of the Lamb

When a married couple have their first baby, they will take many photos and videos of their child's first steps, first bath, first haircut, first everything! But when their other children are born, those children might be the subjects of far fewer photos and videos! Of course we expect that parents will love all of their children, but there is something very special about a firstborn. And that was not always a good thing for the firstborn. In ancient times, many people had the tradition of sacrificing their best to those that they believed were their "gods": their best crops, their best animals, and even sometimes their firstborn baby!

Of course our religion does not tell parents to sacrifice their children. But there was a time when God asked Abraham to sacrifice his son, Isaac (Genesis 22). When Isaac was probably a teenager, God told Abraham to offer the son he dearly loved, as a sacrifice to God. As much as it pained him, Abraham was willing to sacrifice his son, to give him back to God. But before Abraham could sacrifice his son, an angel stopped him and told him this had only been a test of his faith in God. Then Abraham saw a sheep caught in a bush, and he sacrificed that animal in place of his son. The firstborn son had

been saved and a sheep had been sacrificed in his place.

Centuries later, God sent Moses to bring the descendants of Abraham out of slavery in Egypt. But the Pharaoh would not release them. So, God sent terrible plagues to Egypt, the last of which was that one night, every firstborn son in Egypt would die. God told the Israelites that their firstborn sons would escape death if they sacrificed a LAMB WITHOUT BLEMISH, and they put the blood of that lamb on their doorpost, and they ate the lamb at what was called the Passover meal. That night, all the firstborn sons of the Egyptians died. But in the Israelite houses, which had the blood of the lamb on their doorpost, their firstborn sons escaped death. (Ex 11-12)

When the Israelites left Egypt, God told them that when He would bring them to the promised land of Israel, they and their descendants should **symbolically** offer their firstborn sons to Him. He told the parents to present and dedicate their firstborn son to God, but then they could give a lamb to "**buy back**" their son, to redeem their son. This helped the people to understand that their firstborn son belonged to God, but that son could be saved by the sacrifice of a lamb. (Ex 13)

The Feast of the Presentation (Feb. 2) celebrates the completion of the message God gave through the sheep that was sacrificed in place of Abraham's firstborn son, and the lambs that were sacrificed in place of the firstborn Israelites in Egypt. 2026 years ago, Joseph and Mary went to the Temple to fulfill the law of Moses. They went there to offer Mary's firstborn son, her only son, to God, then to buy Him back, to redeem Him. But they did not bring a lamb to be sacrificed in place of Jesus. No, because Mary's Son was THE LAMB, the lamb of God. Jesus was not a firstborn son who was saved by an animal sacrificed in His place. **Instead, we sinners, who deserve eternal death because of our sins, we were saved by the sacrifice of Jesus, the Lamb of God and the Firstborn son of God - the - Father!**

And this is what we celebrate at every Holy Mass! At Mass the LAMB WITHOUT BLEMISH is offered sacramentally as a sacrifice for our sins and as act of thanksgiving (Eucharist). At Mass, God invites us to join our little sacrifices of love to the perfect sacrifice of Jesus. That is why the priest says before the consecration, "**Pray brothers and sisters, that my sacrifice and yours may be acceptable to God the almighty Father.**" Our little sacrifices, every act of love we do for our family and for others, those are not perfect sacrifices. But by joining our sacrifices to the perfect sacrifice of Jesus in the Holy Mass, our acts of love become acceptable to God, for our good and the good of the entire Church!



La Presentación del Cordero

Cuando un matrimonio tiene a su primer hijo, suelen tomar muchas fotos y videos de sus primeros pasos, su primer baño, su primer corte de cabello, ¡su primer todo! Pero cuando nacen los demás hijos, es posible que sean el tema de muchas menos fotos y videos. Por supuesto, esperamos que los padres amen a todos sus hijos, pero hay algo muy especial en el primogénito. Y esto no siempre fue algo bueno para el primogénito. En la antigüedad, muchas personas tenían la tradición de sacrificar lo mejor a lo que creían que eran sus "dioses": sus mejores cosechas, sus mejores animales y, a veces, ¡incluso a su hijo primogénito!

Por supuesto, nuestra religión no enseña a los padres a sacrificar a sus hijos. Sin embargo, hubo un tiempo en que Dios pidió a Abraham que sacrificara a su hijo Isaac (Génesis 22). Cuando Isaac probablemente era un adolescente, Dios le dijo a Abraham que ofreciera en sacrificio al hijo que tanto amaba. Aunque le causó un gran dolor, Abraham estuvo dispuesto a sacrificar a su hijo para devolverlo a Dios. Pero antes de que Abraham pudiera hacerlo, un ángel lo detuvo y le dijo que aquello solo había sido una prueba de su fe en Dios. Entonces Abraham vio un carnero atrapado en unos matorrales y sacrificó a ese animal en lugar de su hijo. El hijo primogénito fue salvado y un animal fue sacrificado en su lugar.

Siglos más tarde, Dios envió a Moisés para sacar de la esclavitud en Egipto a los descendientes de Abraham. Pero el faraón no quiso dejarlos ir. Entonces Dios envió terribles plagas a Egipto, la última de las cuales fue que, en una sola noche, moriría todo primogénito varón de Egipto. Dios dijo a los israelitas que sus hijos primogénitos se salvarían de la muerte si sacrificaban un **CORDERO SIN MANCHA**, ponían la sangre del cordero en los postes de sus puertas y comían el cordero en lo que se llamó la comida de la Pascua. Aquella noche murieron todos los primogénitos de los egipcios. Pero en las casas de los israelitas, donde había sangre del cordero en los postes de las puertas, sus hijos primogénitos se salvaron de la muerte (Exodo 11-12).

Cuando los israelitas salieron de Egipto, Dios les dijo que, cuando los llevara a la Tierra Prometida de Israel, ellos y sus descendientes debían ofrecer **simbólicamente** a El a sus hijos primogénitos. Dios indicó a los padres que presentaran y dedicaran a su hijo primogénito a El, pero luego podían ofrecer un cordero para **"rescatar"** a su hijo, es decir, para redimirlo. Esto ayudaba al pueblo a comprender que el hijo primogénito pertenecía a Dios, pero que podía ser salvado mediante el sacrificio de un cordero (Exodo 13).

La Fiesta de la Presentación (2 de febrero) celebra el cumplimiento del mensaje que Dios dio a través del carnero sacrificado en lugar del hijo primogénito de Abraham y de los corderos sacrificados en lugar de los primogénitos israelitas en Egipto. Hace 2026 años, José y María fueron al Templo para cumplir la Ley de Moisés. Fueron para ofrecer a Dios al Hijo primogénito de María, su único Hijo, y luego rescatarlo, redimirlo. Pero no llevaron un cordero para ser sacrificado en lugar de Jesús. No, porque el Hijo de María era EL CORDERO, el Cordero de Dios. Jesús no fue un hijo primogénito salvado por el sacrificio de un animal en su lugar. **Al contrario, nosotros, pecadores que merecemos la muerte eterna a causa de nuestros pecados, fuimos salvados por el sacrificio de Jesús, el Cordero de Dios y el Hijo Primogénito de Dios Padre.**

¡Y esto es lo que celebramos en cada Santa Misa! En la Misa, el CORDERO SIN MANCHA es ofrecido sacramentalmente como sacrificio por nuestros pecados y como acto de acción de gracias (Eucaristía). En la Misa, Dios nos invita a unir nuestros pequeños sacrificios de amor al sacrificio perfecto de Jesús. Por eso el sacerdote dice antes de la consagración: **"Orad, hermanos, para que este sacrificio mío y vuestro sea agradable a Dios, Padre todopoderoso."** Nuestros pequeños sacrificios, cada acto de amor que realizamos por nuestra familia y por los demás, no son sacrificios perfectos. Pero al unir nuestros sacrificios al sacrificio perfecto de Jesús en la Santa Misa, nuestros actos de amor se hacen agradables a Dios, para nuestro bien y para el bien de toda la Iglesia.

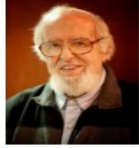

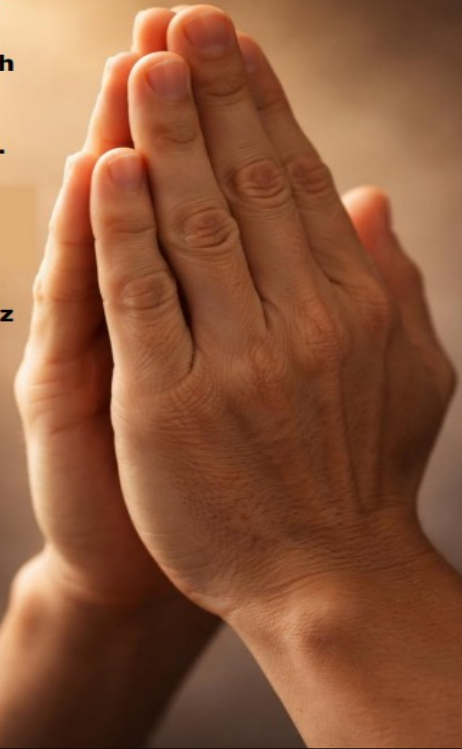
