



Thanks to all who participated in our most recent parish blood drive. According to the blood drive service, we had 66 registered donors and collected 63 units. We had 47 whole

blood donors and eight double red cell donors (each counts as two). Great success!

Our next Blood Drive will be conducted on Thursday, December 9th, from 1:00—7:00 p.m. in Desmond Hall. The blood supply is critically low—PLEASE HELP.

To remain in compliance with the federal guidelines for social distancing. APPOINTMENTS PREFERRED, DONORS PRESENTING:

- Must wear a mask or face covering
- Will have their temperature taken
- Must be 14 days symptom-free if recovered from COVID-19
- May NOT donate if they have had a positive diagnostic test or experienced symptoms of COVID-19 in the last 14 days
- May NOT donate if they are currently on selfquarantine restrictions

Please be aware that we DO NOT test for COVID-19. You should contact your health care provider if you want to be tested. Please remember to eat, drink, and bring your ID with your name and photo. Donors 76 and over need a doctor's note unless one is already on file. If you have received the COVID vaccine, there is no waiting period before donating, as long as you feel well.
