

# JOURNEY THROUGH GRIEF "Blessed are those who mourn for they shall be comforted"

This program is being sponsored by Saint Ambrose and Most Holy

Redeemer Churches. It is designed to help people work through the pain of grief when a loved one dies. The 9 sessions will be facilitated by Mrs. Jo Briant from Saint Ambrose and Deacon Keith Berg from Most Holy Redeemer. Through confidential mutual support and education, we will come to understand the common elements of the grieving process though each person's loss is unique to them. As we travel this journey together, we will learn coping skills and find new strength and hope. Meetings will begin Thursday, April 13th and continue through 9 successive Thursdays until Thursday, June 8<sup>th</sup>. They will be held at Saint Ambrose, in the St. Anthony Room in the Parish Office from 6:30-8:00 p.m. There is no fee, but pre-registration (call the Parish Office at 732-679-5666) is required as there is a maximum of 15 registrants for this program.



#### **LENTEN OBLIGATIONS**

The days of **fast and abstinence are Ash Wednesday and Good Friday**. All other Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence. The

obligation to fast applies only to <u>Catholics between the ages of 18 and 59</u>. The obligation of abstinence applies to all Catholics who have reached the age of 14. Abstinence in the Catholic tradition means to abstain from meat. Fasting in the Catholic tradition means limiting oneself to one full meal and two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal to experience hunger.



#### **CHRISM MASS**



#### Cathedral of St. Francis of Assisi Metuchen, 4:00 p.m.

On Tuesday, April 4, 2023, Bishop James F. Checchio will celebrate the Chrism Mass with the priests of the Diocese. At the Mass, all priests make a Renewal of

Commitment to Priestly Service, recommitting themselves to their Bishop and to their ministry to God and His People; the Bishop and all Priests then ask the people for a pledge of their prayerful support.

The Bishop will also bless and consecrate the Holy Oils, which each parish receives for the rites of anointing. The Oil of Catechumens is used to anoint infants and adults before their Baptism; the Oil of the Sick is used on the forehead and hands of the infirm in the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick; and Sacred Chrism is used to anoint the head of the newly baptized, the foreheads of confirmandi, the hands of a priest at his ordination, the head of a bishop at his ordination, and the altar and walls of new churches.

All are encouraged to join in-person (or watch via livestream), the ancient, grace-filled Chrism Mass at the Cathedral of St. Francis of Assisi in Metuchen at 4:00 p.m. To watch the Chrism Mass livestream, visit <a href="https://diometuchen.org/cathedral-livestream">https://diometuchen.org/cathedral-livestream</a>.



"Jesus said to her, 'Give me a drink'... Jesus answered and said to her, 'If you knew the gift of God and who is saying to you 'Give me a drink', you would have asked him, and he would have given you living
