

The Christian Symbolism of the King Cake

It's Carnival Time!

Carnival Season begins each year on January 6, the Feast of the Epiphany that celebrates the Biblical story of the Three Magi visiting with gifts for the Baby Jesus.

Epiphany, meaning "to show" celebrates the fact that the Magi, who were Gentiles, recognized Jesus, even as an infant, as the savior and so shows that Jesus came to save all mankind, not just the people of Israel.



Carnival, or Mardi Gras season, is synonymous with King Cake Season. The King Cake tradition is thought to have been brought to New Orleans from France in 1870.

A King Cake is an oval-shaped cake to mimic the crown of a king as well as the unity of people of all faiths. It is decorated in royal colors of PURPLE which signifies "Justice," GREEN for "Faith," and GOLD for "Power."

In the past such things as coins, beans, pecans, or peas were also hidden in each King Cake. Today, a tiny plastic, or in some cases porcelain, baby is the common prize. Each person partaking of the cake looks to see if their piece contains the "baby." If so, then that person is named "King" for a day and bound by custom to host the next party and provide the King Cake.



On Thursday, Feb. 2, the feast of the Presentation of the Lord will be celebrated, with the customary blessing of candles preceding Mass, at 8:30am. The faithful are welcomed to bring their own candles for use at home to be blessed - please keep them with you in your pews. This great feast day marks forty days after the Nativity and definitively ends the Christmas and Epiphany festivities. This ancient feast has been celebrated since at least c.386, probably origi-

nating in Jerusalem. It has always been associated with the meeting between Simeon and the infant Christ, and the procession of candles highlights the journey made by the Holy Family to the temple for the purification rites required of mothers after childbirth. The blessing of the candles (added to the feast in the tenth century) and accompanying procession (during which the great Nunc Dimittis canticle is sung, proclaiming Christ as the "Light to enlighten the Gentiles") gave the name "Candlemas" to this day, which has been known by various names throughout the years: *Hypapantē* (Meeting), the Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary, and (since the eighteenth century) the Presentation of the Lord.



Friday Feb. 3rd is the celebration of the feast of St. Blaise, who was bishop of Sebaste in Armenia in the 4th century. Before being martyred, he is said to have healed a boy who was choking. Since the 8th century, St. Blaise has been venerated as the patron of those who suffer from diseases of the throat. We will pray in a special way at this Mass for protection from afflictions of the throat and from other illnesses. The blessing of St. Blaise is a sign of our faith in God's protection and love for us and for the sick. After the 6:30am Mass on Friday Feb. 3rd there will be a special Blessing of Throats for all who would like to receive it (not after the 8:30am due to a funeral). The Blessing of Throats will also be offered after all the Sunday masses the weekend of Feb. 4 and 5th.






