Seek the Lord at Home

Have you ever wanted to improve your prayer life and that of your family?

Can we really encounter God in our homes?

God wants to meet us where we are, though we often only expect to encounter Him at Sunday Mass or on a retreat. It is easy to overlook the fact that we have daily opportunities to encounter Him in a very real way in the midst of our messiness and humanness at home. There are three ways in particular to seek and find God's presence in our families, and though they are certainly not new, most of us struggle with them: individual prayer, married couples' prayer, and family prayer.

Family Prayer

We've all heard the saying "the family that prays together, stays together." This is generally found to be true, but it can also be much easier said than done. Why is it so difficult?

• Younger kids struggle to keep still and older kids have minds of their own. We end up fighting just to keep them engaged and we very often fail.

• We are all busy! There's homework, sports, band, ballet... you name it. We're rarely all in the same place at the same time and when we are, there are things that need to get done. How can we get better?

• Let go of false notions of perfection. Grace perfects nature, it does not work against it. Little ones are going to bounce around. It's what they're supposed to do! Give them something to do. Let them "lead" whatever part they know best, or ask them what they're thankful for or who they want God to bless, etc. Prayer is paying attention to what God is doing, and you might be surprised at what they see.

Get older kids involved as well. Read a passage from scripture and ask them
what they think and be interested in what they have to say. Don't always try to
solve their problems for them but instead pray out loud for things that you know
they are worried about and stay with them as they work things out.

• Keep family prayer time moving with the life of the Church. Include ritual prayers or songs, but try to gear it towards the appropriate liturgical season. Advent and Lent are great times to get started and are good times to change things up to keep from getting into a rut.

Please take a prayer card in the back of the church with a short family prayer you can do in the car, before leaving the house, before bedtime, etc. to help incorporate prayer in our family life.



As you are already aware, war has broken out in Israel following brutal attacks by Hamas. This is truly a tragedy and one that we, as people of faith, must bring to prayer.





Pet Care Emergency Planning

When an emergency/disaster occurs, confusion and turmoil usually reign supreme. It is difficult at such a time to remember all the important things that need to be done. Making the proper pet care plans can become more difficult if not done in advance.

The following are just a few questions that may need answers:

- Will you evacuate your pet(s) along with your family in the event of an emergency? If so, will the hotel you plan to use in transit allow pets?
- Have you created a list of items such as medications, special food, water, etc. needed to provide proper care for your pet(s) during an evacuation?
- Have you created in advance a kit containing all of the pet necessities on that list?
- Will it be necessary for you to board your pet locally until you return home? With what local pet facility will you board and at what cost?
- Sometimes the questions can be more difficult if not impossible to answer, such
 as how long will the evacuation continue? Making arrangements with the animal
 caretaker even for protracted evacuations may be an important issue to discuss in
 advance. Of course, not all questions can be answered, but by asking the
 questions you can be better prepared to deal with most eventualities you may
 encounter with emergencies.

Do you have a Family Emergency / Disaster Plan?

The family is the domestic church and is integral to the life of the parish. As such, families should prepare themselves for those potential disasters that sometimes affect our homes here in south Louisiana. Hurricanes top the list, it seems, so here are a few preparations a family can take during the season to "Be Prepared."

- Discuss the types of hazards that could affect your family. Know your home's
 vulnerability to storm surge, flooding, and wind.
- Locate a safe room or the safest areas in your home for each hurricane hazard. In certain circumstances the safest areas may not be your home, but within your community
- Determine escape routes from your home and places to meet afterward. These should be measured in tens of miles rather than hundreds of miles.
- Have an out-of-state friend as a family contact so that all of your family members have a single point of contact through which to communicate if you become separated.
- Make a plan now for what to do with your pets if you need to evacuate.
- Post emergency telephone numbers in a handy place and make sure your children know how and when to use them, or to call 911.
- Check your insurance coverage flood damage is not usually covered by homeowners insurance.
- Stock non-perishable emergency supplies and create a "Disaster Supply Kit."
- Use a NOAA weather radio. Remember to replace its batteries every 6 months as you would with your smoke detectors.
- Take First Aid, CPR, and Disaster Preparedness classes.
