



Archdiocesan Policy on Mass Intentions

- Multiple Intention Masses Only two Masses per week are celebrated for more than one intention.
 (The multiple intention Masses at St. Peter Parish are Saturday Vigil Mass @4pm and Sunday Mass at 8am)
- All the other Masses are single intention Masses—(Hence the purpose of having the 2024 Mass Book Opening Date. This allows our Parishioners the chance to secure a special single Mass date for their love one.)
- One Mass every Sunday is celebrated for the intention of the parishioners: "St. Peter Parishioners" (9:30am or 11:30) by the Pastor of the Church Fr. Bru. If you request the 9:30am or 11:30am it may have to switch due to our Liturgical Schedule.
- The suggested donation for a Mass is \$5.

Early submissions will not be accepted

Requests for Masses, Sanctuary Lamp, Blessed Mother Lamp, & Adoration Chapel Lamp may by requested at this time.

<u>Please Note:</u> To provide an opportunity to all interested parishioners, Single Intention Masses are <u>limited to 12 requests</u> per household for the 2024 calendar year. After February 5th, 2024 additional single intention Masses may be requested. Multiple intention Masses are not limited.

- All Mass requests must be submitted in writing using our 12 Mass Intention Form for 2024. Please stop by the Rectory Office for the form or download it from our website and donations need to be attached to the request at the time of the request.
- Not to worry if you are not able to be here on Nov 2nd for the opening of the 2024 Calendar you may bring your request form to the Rectory on November 3rd or there after and I will add yours in the order in which it is received.
- If a single intention Mass is requested, please provide an alternate Saturday (Vigial Mass) 4pm or Sunday 8am Mass, in the event the first choice is not available.
- Our 9:30am or 11:30am Intentions are for St. Peter Parishioners & subject to change as needed to the Liturgical Schedule.
- Requests will be handled in order of receipt. A confirmation letter of Masses scheduled will be mailed upon request.

A real presence, a mystery of faith

From Ecclesia de Eucharistia, nos. 15-16, by Pope John Paul II

The sacramental re-presentation of Christ's sacrifice, crowned by the resurrection, in the Mass involves a most special presence which – in the words of Paul VI – "is called 'real' not as a way of excluding all other types of presence as if they were 'not real', but because it is a presence in the fullest sense: a substantial presence whereby Christ, the God-Man, is wholly and entirely present". This

sets forth once more the perennially valid teaching of the Council of Trent: "the consecration of the bread and wine effects the change of the whole substance of the bread into the substance of the body of Christ our Lord, and of the whole substance of the wine into the substance of his blood. And the holy Catholic Church has fittingly and properly called this change transubstantiation". Truly the Eucharist is a mysterium fidei, a mystery which surpasses our understanding and can only be received in faith, as is often brought out in the catechesis of

the Church Fathers regarding this divine sacrament: "Do not see – Saint Cyril of Jerusalem exhorts – in the bread and wine merely natural elements, because the Lord has expressly said that they are his body and his blood: faith assures you of this, though your senses suggest otherwise".

Adoro te devote, latens Deitas, we shall continue to sing with the Angelic Doctor. Before this mystery of love, human reason fully experiences its limitations. One understands how, down the centuries, this truth has stimulated theology to strive to understand it ever more deeply.


These are praiseworthy efforts, which are all the

more helpful and insightful to the extent that they are able to join critical thinking to the "living faith" of the Church, as grasped especially by the Magisterium's "sure charism of truth" and the "intimate sense of spiritual realities" which is attained above all by the saints. There remains the boundary indicated by Paul VI: "Every theological explanation which seeks some understanding of this mystery, in order to be in accord with Catholic faith, must firmly maintain that in objective reality, independently of our mind, the bread

and wine have ceased to exist after the consecration, so that the adorable body and blood of the Lord Jesus from that moment on are really before us under the sacramental species of bread and wine".

The saving efficacy of the sacrifice is fully realized when the Lord's body and blood are received in communion. The Eucharistic Sacrifice is intrinsically directed to the inward union of the faithful with Christ through communion; we receive the very One who offered himself for us, we receive his body which he gave up for us on the Cross and his

blood which he "poured out for many for the forgiveness of sins" (Mt 26:28). We are reminded of his words: "As the living Father sent me, and I live because of the Father, so he who eats me will live because of me" (Jn 6:57). Jesus himself reassures us that this union, which he compares to that of the life of the Trinity, is truly realized. The Eucharist is a true banquet, in which Christ offers himself as our nourishment.
