

Bishop Fabbro's Message for Lent

To the Faithful of the Diocese of London,
Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

During Lent, we hear the Gospel call to conversion – to turn away from sin and to turn back to God with all our hearts. The gift of God's mercy frees us to serve our sisters and brothers in love. Our own brokenness, the tensions between peoples, and the scourge of hostilities and wars throughout the world make us even more aware of our need for conversion. We all must become instruments of justice and peace. "To the extent that this Lent becomes a time of conversion, an anxious humanity will notice a burst of creativity, a flash of new hope" (Pope Francis, Lenten Message 2024).

To help us in our journey back to God, the Church offers the traditional practices of prayer, fasting and

2022 Financial Report

Each year, the Diocese of London publishes the financial results of our Diocese, parishes, and diocesan cemeteries. This year's report provides the results for the year ended December 31, 2022. The figures are taken from two sources: the annual audited financial statements of the Diocese of London, parishes, and diocesan operated cemeteries as well as our internal records. This report does not include the financial results of St. Peter's Seminary.

At the end of 2022, Dave Savel retired after serving the Diocese as the Episcopal Director of Administrative Services for 17 years. Dave provided much wisdom and insight over his years at the Diocesan Centre, and we are grateful to him for his leadership and prudent stewardship.

Parishes

Parish collections and donations increased 7.0% from \$23.93 million in 2021 to \$25.56 million in 2022. The elimination of the Canada Emergency Wage Subsidy (CEWS) in 2022 resulted in an overall reduction of \$2.2 million worth of financial support. In spite of the elimination of CEWS, total parish operating revenues increased 5% from \$31.0 million to \$32.6 million.

Parish ministry, sacramental and operating costs increased by 6% from 2021 to 2022. Parish operating surplus (before capital donations and costs) increased from \$983,000 in 2021 to \$1.08 million in 2022.

Capital donations decreased 1.4%, from \$4.24 million in 2021 to \$4.18 million in 2022. Proceeds from the sale of parish properties were \$907,000 in 2022

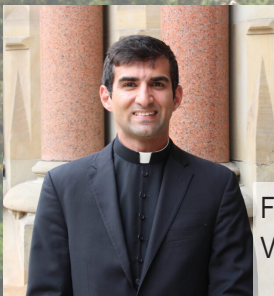

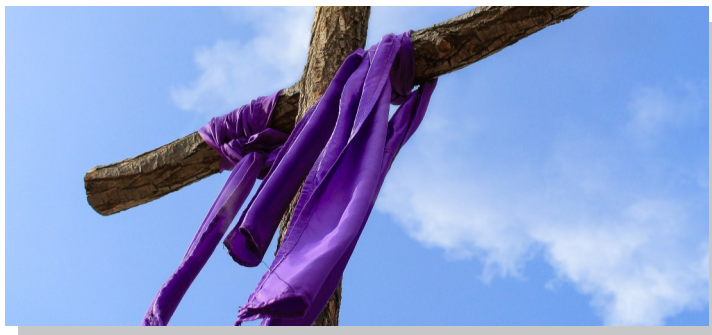
almsgiving. These remedies are meant not only for our own personal healing but to unite and strengthen us with the gifts of the Spirit to build up the Kingdom of God, preparing our hearts to welcome the risen Lord and to welcome one another.

In speaking of injustices in the world, Pope Francis reminds us that "The long journey towards reconciliation and justice, including addressing the structural conditions that abetted such abuse, remains before us, and requires concrete gestures of penitence" (*A Synodal Church in Mission, Synthesis Report*). This year I invite you to join me, individuals, families, and parish communities, to fast, pray and offer alms for peace – peace in our hearts, peace in our homes, peace in our communities and peace in the world. Let us work together to be peacemakers.

I invite you especially to return to the Eucharist and the Sacrament of Reconciliation. At the Eucharist we gather to behold and receive the Body of Christ, the Prince of Peace. In the Sacrament of Reconciliation, we experience the love, mercy, and healing that only God can offer. This year, our **Annual Day of Confession will be held on Wednesday 20 March**. On that day, churches in the diocese will be open and a priest will be available to celebrate the Sacrament of Reconciliation.

May we open our hearts this Lenten season to God's merciful love and become instruments of peace. "Peace is primarily a gift of God, for it is He who left us His peace. 'Yet it is also a responsibility incumbent upon all of us'" (Pope Francis, 8 January 2024).

compared to \$6.1 million in 2021. Parishes increased capital spending 21.7%, from \$3.7 million in 2021 to \$4.5 million in 2022.

On an overall basis (i.e. operating and capital results combined), our parishes had a net surplus of \$1.7 million in 2022 compared to \$7.7 million in 2021. The major factor in the difference was the sale of capital assets in 2021.

Included in parish operating revenues above was \$2.4 million of bequests in 2022 and \$964,000 in 2021. Bequests are money or property left to our parishes in the Last Will and Testament of deceased parishioners or priests.

Of our 117 parishes and communities, 47 incurred an operating deficit in 2021 and 66 in 2022. Operating results include day-to-day receipts (Sunday offertory) and expenditures such as ministry, outreach, salaries, utilities, and repairs and maintenance.

The Parish Deposit and Loan Fund has successfully operated since 1964, and functions essentially like a parish “credit union.” Parishes with excess funds, or those saving for a capital project, deposit monies with the Fund and earn interest. Parishes in need of funding for capital projects can apply to the Parish Building and Loan Commission to borrow. Our Parish Deposit and Loan Fund cash and short-term investments balance was \$22.3 million in 2021 and \$25.8 million in 2022. The increase in cash and short-term investments was due to an increase in parishes investing in the Fund. At the end of 2022, there were 123 parishes, parish cemeteries and diocesan entities with money on deposit, totaling \$31 million. The average deposit balance was \$252,000.

At the end of 2021, there were 13 parishes and diocesan entities in a loan position (i.e., owed money to the Fund), totaling \$6.6 million. The average loan balance was \$507,000.

Investment returns (realized and unrealized capital gains as well as income) were negative in 2022 for our endowment funds. The endowment funds provide income to operate diocesan programs. In 2021, the investment returns were \$3.5 million and in 2022 the investment returns saw a loss of \$2 million. This performance was not unusual in 2022 given the volatility of the market. These investment losses contributed to a Diocesan Centre operating loss of \$632,000 in 2022. These losses were covered with previously accumulated savings.

The Diocesan Centre did not receive any bequests in 2022 or 2021. The pension fund for our priests (St. John Evangelist Pension Fund Society) received bequests of \$4,000 in 2022 and \$34,000 in 2021. Bequests are monies or property left in the Last Will and Testament of deceased parishioners and priests.

We continue to pay the price for crimes related to sexual misconduct. The price can only be partially measured in financial terms; the spiritual cost is far greater. The financial results noted above do not include expenses related to sexual abuse claims and the sale of non-parish assets. We are selling off non-parish assets to pay for the financial cost of misconduct.

We still have a number of outstanding cases. Although we expect insurance to pay a portion of our costs, the financial cost to the Diocese is still high. We are doing our utmost to make fair and reasonable settlements with victims of sexual abuse as quickly as possible. In addition, the Diocese assists victims with counseling.

Diocesan Cemeteries

In addition to our 67 parish cemeteries, there are cemeteries in Windsor-Essex, Sarnia and London managed directly by the Diocese. Diocesan-managed cemeteries revenue increased from \$9.9 million in 2021 to \$10.0 million in 2022. Diocesan-managed cemeteries earned a surplus of \$2.9 million in 2021 and \$2.3 million in 2022.

The cemeteries are governed by the Ontario Funeral, Burial and Cremation Services Act. By law, whenever a pre-planned sale is made, the money must be invested with our trustee until the service or product has been provided. In addition, also by law, when a sale is made, a certain percentage of the money must be invested with our trustee to provide perpetual care and maintenance funding. For example, when a grave is sold, 40% of the money must be invested with the trustee. Interest and dividends can be withdrawn on the invested care and maintenance money but the rest of the money cannot be removed. The amount invested with our trustee for pre-planned sales \$20.8 million in 2021 and \$21.3 million in 2022. The perpetual care and maintenance fund balance was \$56.8 million in 2021 and \$60.5 million in 2022. The perpetual care and maintenance funds provide income to help pay for the operating costs of the cemeteries.

Have you considered pre-planning your cemetery arrangements?

Planning your cemetery arrangements in advance brings peace of mind to you and your family. Please

consider pre-planning directly with one of our diocesan or parish cemeteries. At the same time, we recommend you consider plans for your funeral Mass (i.e., church, readings, and music) and make those plans known to your family.

Please consider the Church when preparing your Last Will and Testament.

As an example, you could leave a portion of your estate to your local parish, Diocese of London, St. John the Evangelist Pension Fund Society (priest pension) or St. Peter's Seminary. A charitable receipt will be issued to your estate, which will reduce your taxes payable. Another way to do this is to designate your parish, etc. as one of the beneficiaries of your RRSP, RPP or RRIF. This can significantly reduce your taxes payable upon death. Our parishes received generous bequests from dearly departed Catholics of \$964,000 in 2021 and \$2.4 million in 2022.

Accountability & Responsibility

Each Family of Parishes is required to have a finance committee to provide counsel to the pastor. Each parish in a family must submit a financial report to the Diocese annually. Families of Parishes are required to present a financial report to their parishioners for each parish at least annually. Every parish, cemetery and diocesan bank account requires two signatures on all bank documents, including cheques.

Our consolidated diocesan and parish financial statements and the financial statements of cemeteries managed by the Diocese are audited annually by KPMG (London and Windsor).

The Diocese has an internal audit program. This program is led by our Audit Committee, and diocesan administration, and is quite comprehensive. The internal audit review takes 2 to 3 days per parish or diocesan entity.

Each parish and the Diocese of London are registered charities and therefore must file a charity return (similar to a tax return) by June 30 each year. Most of the information on the return is made public on the Canada Revenue Agency (CRA) website. If you would like to see more detailed information about

The Diocese has an administrative group reporting to Bishop Fabbro which relies heavily on the discipline and review of our plans and budgets by our Diocese Finance Committee, chaired by Egidio Sovran of Maidstone (Essex County). This objective committee, comprised of people from across the Diocese with significant expertise, forms part of our internal control system to ensure that we make prudent financial decisions. The committee is a third party that is independent of administration and makes recommendations and gives advice when and where it deems necessary.

We also have two subcommittees. The Investment Committee, chaired by Dave Savel of London, oversees the investment of our cemetery trust funds, accumulated surpluses and our Pentecost 2000 endowment funds. The Audit Committee oversees internal audits and meets with our external auditors, KPMG, to plan the annual financial audits and then review the financial statements and auditors report. These committees analyze our practices and policies, assess risks, and provide proactive advice.

Consistent with Goal #6 of our Pastoral Plan, our Diocese follows sound business practices: we prepare an annual budget; actual results are compared to budget monthly; we have an annual external audit; we conduct reviews; we develop policies where needed, ensuring that decisions are made within a policy framework; and we strive to be accountable, prudent, and transparent with the donations that you give us. The Diocese of London secures and protects its data

using multiple methods. Firewalls have been installed at all sites. Terminal services have been deployed at nearly all sites and all application data and files are stored at a secure data centre.

responsible for administering them as endowment funds in accordance with the endowment policies established by the Diocese of London.

The funds have been prudently invested according to investment policies and goals established by our Investment Committee, with the assistance of our investment advisors. In accordance with a policy established by our Finance Committee, 4.25% of the market value of the fund is paid out annually to the Seminary, Cathedral and Diocese programs. The payout policy and percentage was developed to preserve the purchasing power (inflation protection) of the endowment funds and prevent wild swings in the amount paid out. Whether we earn 12% or lose 2%, we still pay out 4.25%. The excess income (above 4.25%) is reinvested in the endowment funds to provide for increasing payout amounts in the years to come to keep pace with inflation.

Our investment returns were 6.4% in 2021 and -4.23% in 2022. Our 2021 five- and ten-year annualized returns were 4.7% and 6.17%, respectively.

At December 31, the Pentecost 2000 balances held in trust by the Diocese were as follows:






Pentecost 2000 Update

Pentecost 2000 was a five-year (1989-94) major fundraising campaign in the Diocese of London to establish endowment funds for St. Peter's Seminary, St. Peter's Cathedral Basilica and ministry programs of the Diocese of London. Parishioners across our Diocese responded very generously: the original endowment balance from the campaign was \$15.3 million.

As promised during the original campaign, the Diocese holds custody of these funds as trustee and is
