DECREE

Having received the recommendation of the Episcopal Vicar for Windsor-Essex and those charged with the study of the reorganization of parishes in that region to establish a new parish from the territory of Immaculate Heart Parish in the city of Windsor in the province of Ontario (hereinafter referred to as *Immaculate Heart Parish*) and the members of the personal parish of St. Michael German Parish in the city of Windsor in the province of Ontario (hereinafter referred to as *St. Michael German Parish*), both of which are to canonically be suppressed on February 1, 2026. I, Ronald P. Fabbro, C.S.B., Bishop of London, having consulted the Council of Priests of the Diocese of London on November 4, 2025, in accordance with canon 515, §2, do hereby decree the canonical establishment of St. Michael Parish effective February 1, 2026.

The territorial boundaries of the said St. Michael Parish shall be as follows:



- East: From the intersection of Riverside Drive and Lincoln Street south along the west side of Lincoln Street to the Canadian Pacific Mainline Railway tracks.
- South: West along the Canadian Pacific Railway tracks to the intersection of Highland Avenue.
- West: North along the east side of Highland Avenue to the intersection of Erie Street, then west along the north side of Erie Street to the intersection of Mercer Street, then north along the east side of Mercer Street to the intersection of Cataraqui Street, then east along the north side of Cataraqui Street to the intersection of Glengarry Avenue, then north along the east side of Glengarry Avenue to the intersection of Riverside Drive.
- North: East along Riverside Drive to the intersection of Lincoln Road.

Consequently, all Latin-rite Catholics domiciled within the above-described boundaries, as well as all the present members of St. Michael German Parish will be considered parishioners of the said St. Michael Parish.

I direct that this decree be published in Immaculate Heart Parish, in St. Michael German Catholic Church, in Our Lady of Perpetual Help Church in the city of Windsor in the province of Ontario and by a suitable means throughout the Diocese of London, with the understanding that any who wish to make recourse against it, in accordance with canon 1734, §1-2, must do so in writing within ten (10) canonical days from the time this decree was lawfully notified.
