The Reconciliation Room allows for the celebration of the Sacrament of Penance with two options. You may celebrate the sacrament "behind the screen" or "face to face" with the priest.

Weekly confessions are heard each Saturday at 3:00 PM. Remember, God is always full of mercy and love for each of us.

LECTOR TRAINING – January 26 Sunday of the Word of God

Immediately following 11:30 AM Mass

Pope Francis recently declared that the Third Sunday in Ordinary Time is to be the **Sunday of the Word of God**, a day devoted to the celebration of Sacred Scripture, marked with solemnity, and a



time for members of the faithful to be formed as "genuine proclaimers of the Word."

All current Lectors/Commentators, and all confirmed parishioners who wish to explore becoming a Reader at Mass, are invited to attend a meeting for reflection on the Word of God, for further formation as Liturgical Readers, and to receive a brief training on effective proclamation of Scripture.

Please plan on either attending this Mass or arriving before the end of Mass (no later than 12:20 PM) so that you can be included in the commissioning of lectors which includes a blessing. Immediately following Mass, we will remain in the church for our formation and training workshop.

The training will take approximately one hour. Following the training we will adjourn to the social hall for refreshments and fellowship.

Sunday of the Word of God

Next week, on the Third Sunday of Ordinary Time, we will celebrate the Sunday of the Word of God for the first time. Last year Pope Francis instituted the Sunday of Word of God, "so as to appreciate the inexhaustible riches contained in that constant dialogue between the Lord and his people" (*Misericordi et Misera*, 7). The Scriptures are treasures filled with countless riches! From Genesis to Revelation, God speaks to us in human language. By speaking to us, God reveals his part in this great love story: "God is love, and whoever remains in love remains in God and God in him" (1 John 4:16).

Pope Francis is asking everyone in the Church, every diocese, parish, family, and parishioner, to read and listen to the Word of God anew. In preparation for the celebration of the Sunday of the Word of God, consider your favorite Scripture passage. How has God used it to speak to you, change your heart, lead you, or bring you peace? Ask yourself how can I be open in these coming days to receive the gift of loving the Word of God more? How can I make my own these words from today's psalm, "In the written scroll it is prescribed for me, to do your will, O my God, is my delight, and your law is within my heart" (Psalm 40:8-9)?

Unleashing the Gospel in Your Family

by John Hannigan

Archbishop Vigneron's Pastoral Letter *Unleash the Gospel* is a clarion call to parishes and the Archdiocese of Detroit as a whole to act on our mission to bring all people to Encounter Jesus Christ, Growth in Faith, and Witness as joyful missionary disciples. But by far the most important focus of *Unleash the Gospel* is the family and raising children in the faith. Vigneron begins the section on *Families* quoting Deuteronomy (6:6-7):

These words that I command you this day shall be upon your heart; and you shall teach them diligently to your children.

God's command is not only for parents of younger children. Our responsibility to guide and mentor and be models continues when our children are teenagers, or even adults like mine. The Archbishop recognizes that individual families can be struggling, challenged by divorce, illness, bereavement, infertility, or other special needs. That is why he also calls us to accompany families (Action Step 1.2). The call to raise children in the faith is shared by grandparents and aunts and uncles. It is shared among brothers and sisters and cousins. And all of us at STM, as an extended parish family, are called to accompany families in their faith journeys.

I invite you to read or re-read *Unleash the Gospel* posted on: www.stthomasmoretroy.org/pastoral-letter particularly **Guidepost 7** on *Families* and **Action Step 1.3** on the *Christian Family Identity*.

Families are at the heart of *Unleash the Gospel* because they are the "domestic church," the first place and the first relationships through which life in Christ is experienced and lived. Moving toward an Encounter with Jesus begins in a home where everyone bears witness to God's unconditional love. Christian families live out "discipleship" in Christ "in the rhythms of their day-to-day interaction." We know this is hard! But the first step for a flourishing family life is daily prayer: parents praying for the strength to be faithful mothers or fathers; extended families praying for children; praying together, even with a simple Grace before meals.

The second step is coming together as a family every Sunday for Mass. Making weekend worship together the highest priority is an incalculable source of Grace that enriches all. Partaking together of spiritual nourishment at the Eucharistic banquet sustains families. For more ideas on strengthening families see www.52sundays.com.

Stewardship Thoughts Second Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today, in his First Letter to the Corinthian community, St. Paul stresses the call to holiness through Christ. We must be aware that sanctity — to make holy — is not only for those we recognize as "saints." In his Apostolic Exhortation, Rejoice and Be Glad, Pope Francis notes: We are all called to be holy by living our lives with love and bearing witness in everything we do (paragraph 14). In St. John's Gospel, John the Baptist sees Jesus passing by and proclaims: Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world. Jesus is our perfect model of holiness. Do we, as Christian stewards, try to embrace Christ's example through our call to holiness? Important steps toward sanctity include frequently participating in the Sacrament of Reconciliation, attending weekend Mass to receive Holy Communion, making quiet time for daily prayer and Scripture reading, and generously serving your family, parish, and neighbors in need.
