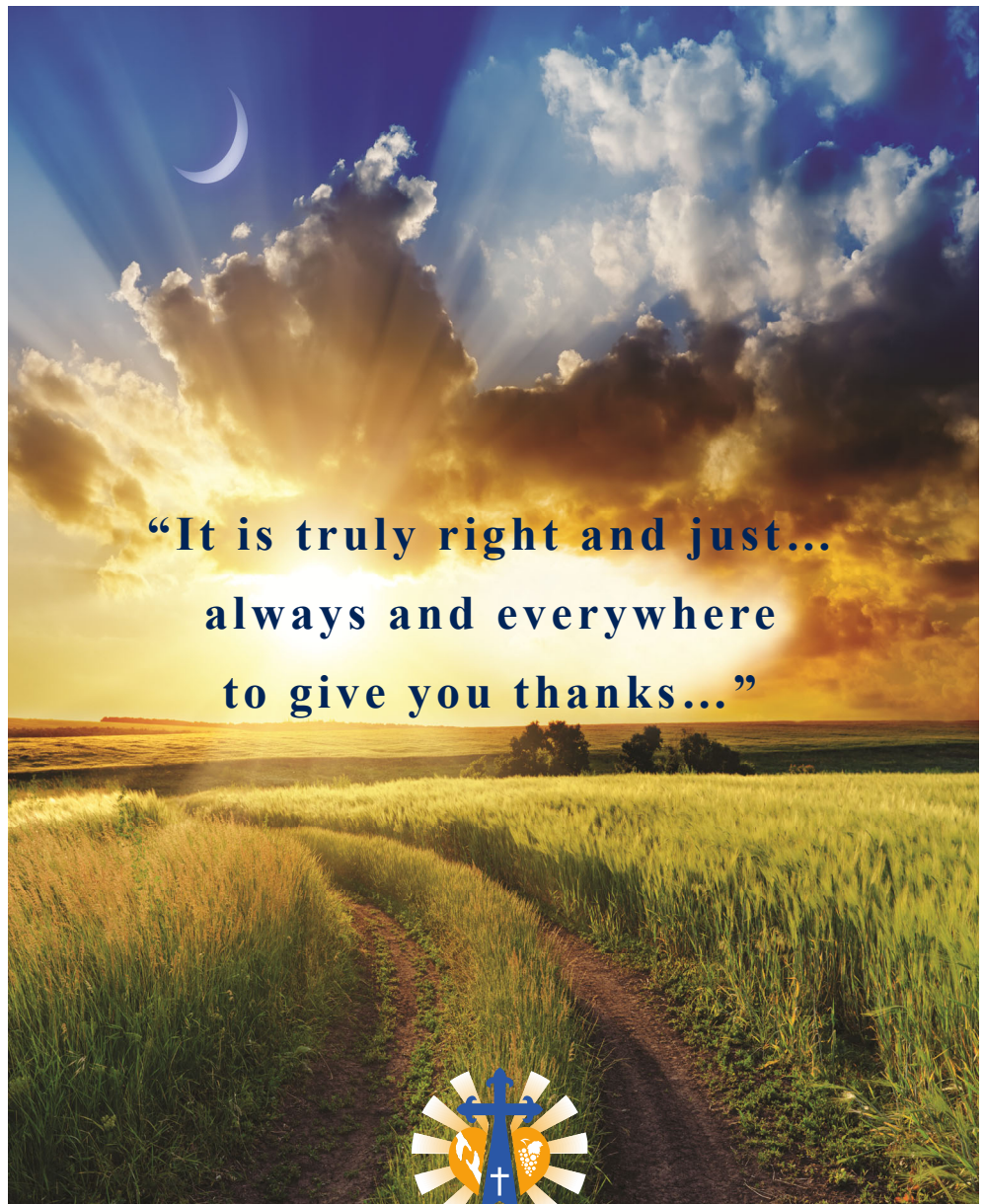

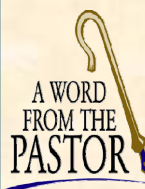

**Notes from Fr. Joe Wormek**

Our parish and school have a long history of faith formation and tradition. We have recently had many discussions about identifying that history in our logo. One of our parishioners and school parent, Helen Seitz, has developed our new logo shown on the front of the bulletin. The school logo is included in the bulletin. Helen has several years of experience in this type of development and we are overjoyed with the results. The inspiration behind her design is best explained in her words:

St. Francis Borgia – like many long-standing Catholic parishes – can be described in similar ways: long Catholic history, rich in tradition, family and community. A look at St. Francis Borgia history provides additional traits that are unique to the founding of St. Francis Borgia in Washington, Missouri:

"...Having heard the favorable description of the Missouri valley, twelve German Catholic families arrived by steamboat at Washington in 1833...in 1866 the current church was erected on a high spot (European style), so that the tower served as a light-house for river traffic and could be seen for a great distance..."

These traits provide the inspiration for this visual identity to represent St. Francis Borgia. The church steeple and cross, symbolic of St. Francis Borgia's faith, is atop a gentle rolling curve, depicting both the 'high spot' where the current church resides, and the river below. In homage to the twelve founding Catholic families, twelve dots flank the year St. Francis Borgia set its root in Washington.

The fonts chosen are meant to speak to both past and present generations. Crisp yet classic typefaces merge traditional and modern styles. The cross within the Borgia "o" is two-fold:

- 1) the symbol of faith is the core of the community and
- 2) instances where the entire graphic can not be utilized, the text-only portion could be, and still carry the symbol of faith.

The graphic was designed to have a cohesive identity for St. Francis Borgia church and school. St. Francis Borgia's community and faith are mutually inclusive. Utilizing the same visual to depict church and school represents how families are supported by connection to their parish and their community.

Please join me in thanking Helen for her outstanding work and generosity in offering her time and talent.

Congratulations

to Bill Gegg on receiving the Cardinal Rigali Service Award for outstanding service. The award recognizes Christian service to others and supports the mission of the church. Archbishop Robert J. Carlson presented the award on October 3, 2017 at a luncheon ceremony.



Bill Gegg was a counselor at St. Francis Borgia Regional High School from 1985 thru 2008. While he was a counselor, he was very involved in the Teens Encounter Christ retreats and planned many retreats. He worked with our local priests and developed the Teen Mass which continues today at the high school on Sunday evenings.

Bill's involvement at the parish level has been extensive. Several years ago, he assisted in creating a prayer day for Lent and Advent. We combine the day with a neighboring parish and both priests participate in the program. He was instrumental in our quarterly parish breakfast, 5th Friday dinners and feast day celebration. Bill coordinated our RCIA program for many years. He has served as a sponsor numerous times and continues to participate with a presentation on the Holy Spirit. He also coordinated the CRHP retreats for the men of our parish for several years. Currently, Bill is the coordinator for the Marriage Encounter ministry at our parish. He also serves as Eucharistic Minister, Adult Server and Lector.



Bill is also very involved in the East Central Area of Missouri Right to Life. He was the president of the organization for many years. He participates in the Coalition of Life programs at Planned Parenthood and promotes various programs in our parish for the unborn. He initiates movie night for our parishioners featuring various ProLife movies.

Bill has achieved the level of Grand Knight in the Knights of Columbus. He currently coordinates the Roses for Life program, Father/Son breakfast, and serves as the local council church representative for memorial services. He also manages the local Roundtable which raises funds and recruits volunteers to assist the elderly or disabled with home repairs or general home maintenance.

Bill has always been very active in his parish. If he feels a calling for a new ministry, he organizes and promotes the ministry. He is currently organizing a new Men's Prayer Ministry. Bill's life has always supported the mission of the Church and he exemplifies consistent outstanding service to others.

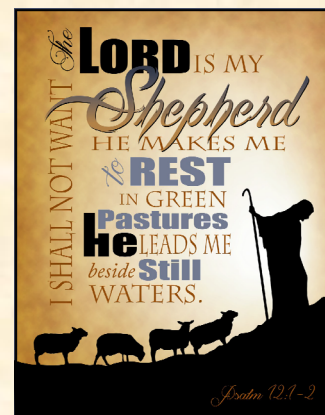

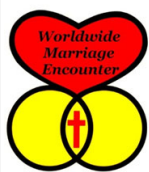

**Book: St. Catherine Labouré and the
Miraculous Medal**

For more than a hundred and fifty years the Miraculous Medal has been known and worn by Catholics throughout the world. It has been used and promoted by great saints and Popes as a most powerful sacramental. Less well known is the story of the French Sister to whom the Blessed Virgin manifested the Medal in 1830.

This Vision book tells the story of Catherine Labouré, a Burgundy farm girl who, after a prophetic dream of St. Vincent de Paul, became a Sister of Charity in Paris and later in Enghien, where she cooked and mended and cared for the inmates of a home for elderly men. To this obscure Sister the Blessed Virgin appeared, made prophecies, and commissioned the making of the Medal which soon came to be known as "miraculous" because of the favors wrought. St. Catherine Labouré lived a life of prayer and service to the poor. She was canonized in 1947.
