



Commissions' Corner

Miracles in Our Lives There are many miracles in everyone's life which we might consider as large or small. We tend to think more readily of the "large" extraordinary ones like ones from the Bible, within the history of our church and its many canonized Saints, the surviving of deadly diseases or the results of an accident, or escaping some natural disaster. However, these larger miracles are probably the exception rather than the rule in the lives of most people. There are far more objects, events, or feelings in one's life—little miracles—which are part of everyday life which may go unnoticed or we take for granted. But reflecting on them, they are just as miraculous as having one's health restored or overcoming the effects of natural disasters. These more "commonplace" miracles to our minds can be seen in the human condition, in the world, or in the mingling of both. Here are some examples: the creation of new life, a child's smile, our bodies made up of so many parts, yet work as one; our eyes and the other four senses, to experience the world outside ourselves in a rainbow, snow on an evergreen tree, or the curiosity in the eyes of a child, and the love that binds husband and wife or other members of a family as one. Still more miracles abound: the earth rotating, the sun, moon, stars, and planets, the change of seasons, blue skies and white clouds, how birds and animals survive, bees making honey, and rainfall when we need it. We all can think of even more examples. But just as important and miraculous should be the way we treat one another intentionally with love, hope, and charity, or many times in random acts of kindness to others when we expect nothing in return. These "miracles" are part of that inner realm of our soul which by our Christian Faith and practice of it makes both ourselves and others better for it in

We have a busy Baby Closet!!! This past November was our

second busiest month here at the Baby Closet/Food Pantry since becoming St Pio Parish. We took care of 262 people in just one month. Of the 262 people, 47 of those were infants for the Baby Closet. Most of the families who visited the Baby Closet picked up formula for their baby. Here's some information about infant formula. A newborn will drink 12 – 20z bottles per day. One can of Enfamil formula will last about 5 days. Multiply that by six cans needed for one month. For that first year of life the formula will cost an average of \$1,800.00. Most of the families we see only make \$12,000.00 a year. So, you can see why we have such a need for formula here at the Baby Closet. The average cost for a can of Enfamil is \$18.00 - \$48.00 depending on the size of the can. If you find it in your heart that you can help us out, please drop your donation at the Christian Service office. If it were not for your generosity the outreach programs here at St Pio would not be able to survive and assist these struggling young families. God bless you ahead of time and thank you to all those who have given so far.

Music Notes During a Mass in May at Casa

Santa Maria in Rome, Pope Francis talked about the difference between happiness and joy: "To be happy is good, yet joy is something more. It's another thing, something which does not depend on external motivations, or on passing issues: it is more profound. It is a gift. To be 'happy at all moments, at all cost,' can at the end turn into superficiality and shallowness. This leaves us without Christian wisdom, which makes us dumb, naïve, right? All is joy ... no. Joy is something else; it is a gift from the Lord." If joy is a gift from the Lord, then the Lord Himself is our first and greatest gift, and the only one that will never tarnish or break or fade. 
