**Twenty-ninth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

**10/10/21**

Today we hear Jesus ask James and John, "What do you wish me to do for you? Their response betrays their self-centeredness. We ought to remind ourselves that what Jesus has already done for us exceeds all we could possibly ask. Rather than following the example of these two disciples, let us look to the author of Hebrews, who called us to approach Jesus to receive mercy and to find grace. Let us do so as we receive him in the Eucharist.

**Introduction to the Liturgy of the Word**

**Isaiah 53:10-11** *If he gives his life as an offering for sin he shall see his descendants in a long life.*

**Psalm 33** *"Lord, let your mercy be on us, as we place our trust in you."*

**Hebrews 4:14-16** *Let us confidently approach the throne of grace.*

**Mark 10:42-45** *The Son of man came to give his life as ransom for many.*

 Today's readings with their focus on Jesus' ultimate sacrifice, recall the readings of Holy Week. Today's passage from Isaiah is part of the longer passage we hear on Good Friday, describing the suffering servant, whose voluntary suffering atones for the sins of many. Today's Gospel fore shadows Holy Thursday's Gospel, with Jesus telling his disciples that he came to serve, not to be served. As the author of Hebrews says let us look to Jesus for timely help.

 To be a disciple means being a servant of all, serving our neighbor to the extent that we can. This is our mission. We can do this through works of charity both far reaching and close to home. We can do this by continually looking for what we can do for others. Perhaps our common refrain as a disciple should be,

**"What can I do?"**
