The Fourth Sunday of Easter

May 8th, 2022

The First Reading is from Acts 13:14, 43-52

Paul & Barnabas preach to the Gentiles.

Psalm 100 "We are his people, the sheep of his flock."

The Second Reading is from Revelation 7:9, 14b-

The lamb of God is our shepherd, who leads us to life-giving water.

Gospel of John 10:27-30

No one can harm one of Jesus' Lambs.

When Paul and Barnabas return to the synagogue, "almost the whole city gathered to hear the word of the Lord." Our turnout today may not rival theirs, but we hear the same comforting message that Jesus came to bring salvation to all. In Revelation, John describes his vision in which the Lamb shepherds people of every background to a place of life and joy. In the Gospel, Jesus tells us that he - the Good Shepherd - gives his flock eternal life.

• How appropriate that we hear this Gospel passage on Mother's Day. Jesus compares himself to a shepherd, guiding and protecting us. He promises the sheep of his flock that he will forever hold them securely in his hand. How fortunate we are who have had mothers who have guided us, protected us, loved us and held us, who have treated us with the tender loving care of the Good Shepherd.

On mother's day we are given the opportunity to remember those we love and those who love us.

O God, thank you for the people who have nurtured me in my life, showed me by example how to live with integrity and who always believed in me. Amen.
